ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY ELDER AFFAIRS ADVISORY BOARD; CREATING SECTION 2-2384.1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA; ESTABLISHING THE ELDER AFFAIRS ADVISORY BOARD TRUST FUND; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**WHEREAS**, on May 1, 2018, this Board adopted Ordinance No. 18-49, which established the Miami-Dade County Elder Affairs Advisory Board ("Elder Affairs Advisory Board") and created article CLX of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida ("Code"); and

WHEREAS, among other things, the Elder Affairs Advisory Board is charged with: (1) advising this Board and the Mayor on policy matters and issues related to the County's programming, public services, and facilities for elderly persons; (2) serving as a liaison with the elderly community; and (3) recommending activities or programming that promote a healthy lifestyle and enhance the quality of life for elderly persons; and

**WHEREAS**, to that end, the Elder Affairs Advisory Board holds monthly meetings, connects elderly constituents to needed services, publishes a quarterly newsletter, and has hosted an elder resource fair; and

**WHEREAS**, establishing a trust fund will enable Elder Affairs Advisory Board members to further the work of the board as well as expand its footprint; and

WHEREAS, among other things, board members will be able to attend and host conferences and events for seniors using trust fund monies; and

WHEREAS, said conferences and events can help board members: (1) expand their networks and the profile of the board; (2) deepen their understanding of issues facing seniors in Miami-Dade County; and (3) identify best practices to implement their charge under article CLX of the Code; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to amend the Elder Affairs Advisory Board to create the Miami-Dade County Elder Affairs Advisory Board Trust Fund,

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

**Section 1.** Section 2-2384.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby created to read as follows:

## Sec. 2-2384.1. Financial support for the board.

There is hereby created the Miami-Dade County Elder Affairs Advisory Board Trust Fund for the public purposes provided for in this article. The Finance Director is hereby authorized and directed to establish the Miami-Dade County Elder Affairs Advisory Board Trust Fund and disburse monies in accordance with the provisions of this article. Funds deposited into the Trust Fund may be used to support conferences, projects, activities, and special events which further the purposes of the board.

**Section 2.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 3. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.
