Subject: Amendment to Implementing Order No. 4-42: Fee Schedule for Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, Environmental Resource Management Services adding fees for the review of plans, and issuance of permits for an onsite sewage treatment and disposal system (OSTDS)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution amending Implementing Order No. 4-42, Fee Schedule for the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, Environmental Resource Management Services, to add fees for the review of plans, and issuance of permits for an onsite sewage treatment and disposal system (OSTDS).

Scope

The fee schedule is countywide.

Delegation of Authority

There is no delegation of authority associated with this item.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source


This resolution accompanies the proposed ordinance amending sections 24-5, 24-15, 24-28, 24-43.1, 2-114.1, and 8CC-10, and creating Section 24-42.7 of the Code of Miami-Dade County relating to OSTDSs, which requires the use of performance-based OSTDSs. That ordinance requires RER-DERM staff to review engineering plans and issue corresponding permits for the newly required performance-based systems. Expenditures for these services are estimated at \$300,000.00 annually. Revenues generated from the proposed fees will fund two engineering staff positions, with the objective of undertaking the technical review required by the proposed ordinance. The OSTDS review fees being proposed are \$150.00 and \$300.00 for, respectively, single-family/duplex residential uses and all other uses, including multi-family residential uses, excluding permit reworks, and are anticipated to generate approximately \$300,000.00 in annual revenue, thus offsetting the anticipated expenses associated with the requisite staffing. Therefore, this item will not create a fiscal impact to Miami-Dade County.

Track Record/Monitor

The Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, Division of Environmental Resource Management, Water and Wastewater Division Chief, Carlos L. Hernandez, P.E, will be responsible for administering the review for the OSTDS.

Background

The proposed ordinance that this resolution accompanies will institute more rigorous standards for onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems. The regulatory enhancements are anticipated to have a positive environmental impact by reducing pollutants discharged by properties not served by sanitary sewer infrastructure and to thereby improve ground and surface water quality throughout Miami-Dade County. The ordinance will require property owners who are replacing conventional OSTDSs to install performance-based systems. It also requires installation of performance-based systems by developers of new homes and other buildings that do not yet have access to sanitary sewer infrastructure and that otherwise meet existing code provisions for use of onsite systems. Staff necessary to conduct the newly required technical review shall be funded by the fees proposed to be added to Implementing Order 4-42.

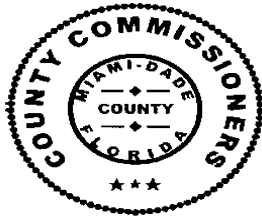
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

AUTHORITY:

The Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter including among others Sections 1.01 and 2.02A, Chapter 24 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Chapter 403 of the Florida Statutes, and Chapter 62 of the Florida Administrative Code.

SUPERSEDES:

This Implementing Order (IO) supersedes IO 4-42, ordered ~~September 19, 2019~~ September 28, 2021 and effective ~~October 1, 2019~~ October 1, 2021.

POLICY:

This IO establishes a schedule of fees to cover the cost of processing permits, reviewing plans, and establishes procedures for providing other services.

PROCEDURE:

The Director of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources shall be responsible for the collection of fees, accounting of revenue and delivery of services delineated in this IO.
