RESOLUTION APPROVING THE STATE ROAD
CODESIGNATION OF S.R. A1A/COLLINS AVENUE
BETWEEN 87TH TERRACE AND 88TH STREET AS “98
POINTS OF LIGHT WAY”

WHEREAS, during the 2022 regular session, the Florida Legislature passed House Bill 1469, which codesignated that portion of S.R. A1A/Collins Avenue between 87th Terrace and 88th Street as “98 Points of Light Way”; and

WHEREAS, section 334.071, Florida Statutes, provides that once a state road codesignation has been made by the Florida Legislature, the installation of state road designation signs shall be contingent on the applicable county or city commission passing a resolution in support of the particular honorary road designation; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida Department of Transportation has requested this Board, pursuant to the attached letter, adopt a resolution approving the designation of this section of the state highway system; and

WHEREAS, the codesignation here honors the 98 victims whose lives were lost when Champlain Towers South collapsed on June 24, 2021; and

WHEREAS, signage indicating the new codesignation was unveiled at a Surfside Remembrance Event held earlier this summer on June 24, 2022; and

WHEREAS, this Board believes it is important to honor and remember the families and victims of the Champlain Towers South collapse in Surfside, and recognize their many contributions to our community; and

WHEREAS, that portion of S.R. A1A/Collins Avenue between 87th Terrace and 88th Street is a state road located within the Town of Surfside; and

WHEREAS, this codesignation is located in County Commission District 4,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

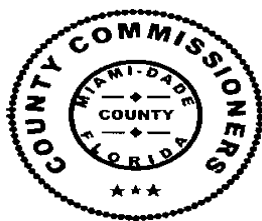
Section 1. Approves the state road codesignation of S.R. A1A/Collins Avenue between 87th Terrace and 88th Street as “98 Points of Light Way”.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to send certified copies of this resolution to the Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation, the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Town of Surfside Police Department, the Miami-Dade County Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Sally A. Heyman. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Oliver G. Gilbert, III** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

Subject: 2022 Roadway Designations

Dear Mr. Cleckley:

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is requesting the Miami-Dade County Commission adopt resolutions to designate/rename sections of the state highway system. The Florida State Legislature recently passed Senate Bill 160 and House Bill 1469 which included roadway designations within your jurisdiction. Attached are copies of Senate Bill (SB) 160 and House Bill (HB) 1469 that include the roadways, limits and new roadway names, as shown below.
