Subject: Recommendation for Approval to Establish a Prequalification Pool for Perishable Products

Summary

This item is for the purchase of various perishable products for multiple County departments. The pool is used primarily by the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department (MDCR) for the preparation of inmate meals. However, other County departments rely on this pool to provide perishable products for vulnerable populations living in Violence Prevention and Intervention residential facilities; to fulfill inventory requirements for County golf courses, cafes, concessions, and programs at community parks; and to meet the requirements under the Agency for Health Care Administration for County assisted living facilities. Vendors providing products for this pool are encouraged to source eco-friendly products from local manufacturers. Detailed requirements will be included in the spot market quotations. A Request for Proposals was advertised to outsource the inmate meal operations for MDCR, and proposals were received in February 2023.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the establishment of a prequalification pool, *EVN0000180, Perishable Products*, for multiple County departments with an allocation of \$17,235,000 for a five-year term. Small Business Enterprise (SBE) measures and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition. Two local firms, of which one is a certified SBE, are being recommended for inclusion in the pool. The pool will remain open to allow additional vendors that meet the prequalification criteria to be added throughout the pool's duration. To track pool expenditures by vendor, bidding under this and other prequalification pools will gradually be conducted and monitored in a single platform, INFORMS, which will allow staff to provide data reports to the Board, as requested.

This pool will replace the current pool, *RTQ-00116, Meat, Poultry, Dairy and Frozen Foods*, which was established by the Board on May 5, 2015, through Resolution No. R-390-15 for an eight-year term. The pool was subsequently modified under delegated authority. At time of pool establishment, there were five vendors included in the pool, and one had a local address. The current pool has 13 vendors, of which five are local, including three certified SBE firms. Prequalification pools expire at the end of the term unless extended by the Board prior to the expiration.

Background

On December 15, 2022, a solicitation was issued under full and open competition. The closing date was January 9, 2023, and two submittals were received. Upon advertisement of the solicitation, a total of 86 vendors were notified and invited in INFORMS, of which six accepted the invitation. Additional outreach efforts included contacting vendors identified through market research as well as notifying incumbent vendors.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$17,235,000. The current pool, *RTQ-00116*, is valued at \$20,936,000 for an eight-year term and expires on July 31, 2023. The annualized allocation under the

replacement pool is higher than the current pool due department's increase in expenditures as evidenced through historical usage in the current pool.

Track Record/Monitor

Shari Francis of the Strategic Procurement Department is the Procurement Contracting Manager.

Delegated Authority

Upon approval of this item, a pool of prequalified vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to (a) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38 and (b) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.

Vendors Prequalified for Pool

A Request to Qualify was issued under full and open competition. Two vendors, both local, responded to the solicitation, of which one is a certified SBE, and are being recommended for inclusion in the pool as set forth in the table below. Staff is working with two additional vendors (Sheyene Technology, Inc. and Straight from the Farm) to get them added to the pool. Additionally, staff will continue vendor outreach efforts to allow additional vendors that meet the prequalification criteria to be added to the pool. The pool will remain open and advertised on the County's website to encourage additional participation.

Due Diligence

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with SPD's Procurement Guidelines to determine vendor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance and compliance issues through various vendor responsibility lists and a keyword internet search. The lists that were referenced included convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to vendor responsibility.

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-140-15, prior to re-procurement, a full review of the scope of services was conducted to ensure the replacement pool reflects the County's current needs. The review included conducting market research, posting a draft solicitation for industry comment, and holding meetings and drafting sessions with the user department.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two percent User Access Program provision applies where permitted by the funding source.
- Small Business Enterprise measures and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source. Each spot market competition must be submitted to the Small Business Development Division for review.
- The Living Wage Ordinance does not apply as this is for the purchase of products.
- The Responsible Wages and Benefits Ordinance does not apply as this is for the purchase of products.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ESTABLISHMENT OF PREQUALIFICATION POOL EVN0000180 FOR MULTIPLE COUNTY DEPARTMENTS FOR A FIVE-YEAR TERM IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$17,235,000.00 FOR THE PURCHASE OF PERISHABLE PRODUCTS; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO SOLICIT PRICING, AWARD CONTRACTS, EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE SOLICITATION DOCUMENTS AND ANY RESULTING CONTRACTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38, AND ADD VENDORS TO THE POOL AT ANY TIME, SUBJECT TO RATIFICATION BY THE BOARD ON A BI-ANNUAL BASIS

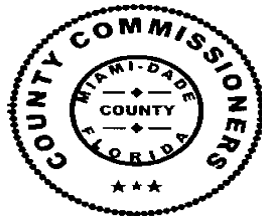
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes the establishment of Prequalification Pool EVN0000180 for multiple County departments for a five-year term in a total amount up to \$17,235,000.00 for the purchase of perishable products; and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to (a) solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board, (b) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38, and (c) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.
