Subject: Professional Services Agreement with Consulting Firm for Countywide Infrastructure Investment Program (CIIP) for the Rehabilitation and Renovation Services of ISD Managed Stephen P. Clark Government Center (SPCC) Building; Contract No. A20-ISD-03A

Executive Summary

The purpose of this item is to gain approval from the Board of County Commissioners (Board) to execute a contract award for a Professional Services Agreement (PSA) for professional architectural and engineering services for the Stephen P. Clark Government Center (SPCC) building between Bermello, Ajamil & Partners, Inc. (Bermello) and Miami-Dade County for a total contract amount not to exceed \$5,500,000. The PSA is funded from countywide Infrastructure Investment Program (CIIP) Program Revenues, including various capital projects included in the FY 2022-23 Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan, or other client department funding should it become available.

Bermello services consist of architectural, engineering and construction administration services providing studies, programming, design criteria, designs, permit applications, cost estimates, construction documents, inspections and construction management. The PSA award allows the consultant to move more efficiently through the various SPCC assignments. Historically, a disproportionate amount of time is spent on initiating a project with design consultants. Approval of this multi-project PSA would significantly reduce the time required to begin addressing critical needs, including the design of unforeseen emergency repairs. Furthermore, the Internal Services Department (ISD) expects to gain material efficiencies when using this consultant for similar or repetitive projects such as individual floor remodels.

Recommendation

This contract award recommendation for Professional Services Agreement Contract No. A20-ISD-03A between Bermello, Ajamil & Partners, Inc. and Miami-Dade County for various architectural and engineering (A&E) projects has been prepared by ISD and is recommended for approval for a total contract amount not to exceed \$5,500,000, inclusive of a contingency allowance amount of \$500,000.

Exhibit 1 to this memorandum provides a more detailed project description and technical certification requirements. No minimum amount of work or compensation will be guaranteed to the consultant. Service Orders will not be issued under the PSA unless the specific user identifies appropriate budgeted funds.

Delegated Authority

The authority of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute and implement the agreement is consistent with those authorities granted under the Code. Additional delegation of authorities requested for this item are as follows:

- Authority to execute PSA;
- Authority to exercise contingency allowance account option limited to 10 percent of the base contract amount;
- Authority to exercise the cancellation provisions in the PSA;
- Authority for the ISD Director to decide any and all disputes;
- Authority to issue service orders; and
- Authority to exercise all other provisions and County rights contained in the PSA.

Scope

The Project consists of non-exclusive, comprehensive professional architectural and engineering and construction administration services for planning, design and post-design services, renovations, modifications, restorations, improvements, construction administration, LEED design, detailed cost estimates, structural threshold inspections, building recommissioning and building evaluations for the ISD managed SPCC under the CIIP as needed. These professional services are required to support and optimize building operations, including but not limited to, the following components: horizontal and vertical circulation systems, telecommunications, parking facilities, restrooms, canopies, mechanical systems, electrical systems, plumbing systems, fire suppression systems, life safety systems (fire pump, fire sprinklers, related equipment), replacement of domestic water risers, improvement or replacement of sanitary and roof drain risers, HVAC systems improvements (coils, pumps, heat exchanger, variable frequency drives, replacement of chillers, cooling towers, related equipment), A/C mechanical rooms, replacement of roof and waterproof exterior envelope, accessibility (ADA), landscaping, building perimeter hardening, operational and security enhancements, access control, video management and access control system improvements, furniture, fixtures, equipment, and all related infrastructure, building and structure as set forth in the service orders.

The Consultant will provide all of the necessary and required services for completion of each project assigned and as specified in each service order, which may include but not be limited to, existing facilities analysis, investigations and surveys, sea level rise considerations, programming, analysis of sustainable systems, LEED certification, fire protection, interior design, audio visual and telecommunications design, permitting, bidding assistance, site visits and inspections, project management, commissioning, and detailed construction cost estimating.

Project Location

The SPCC building is located in Commission District 5 which is represented by Commissioner Eileen Higgins; however, the impact of this item is countywide in nature as the building houses a variety of services for the entire county.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact will not exceed \$5,500,000 for the PSA, which includes a contingency allowance amount of \$500,000 for unforeseen work. There are no operation and maintenance costs as this PSA is for professional services and is funded from CIIP Program Revenues, including various capital projects incorporated in the FY 2022-23 Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan, or other client department funding should it become available. ISD will identify the funding source, additional project cost and accounting information at the time of issuing a service order.

Track Record/Monitor

Marc Lafrance, MSCM, PMP, LEED AP BD+C, ENV SP, CGC, PMO Chief, is responsible for the administration of this PSA for ISD/FIMD.

Explanation

A Notice to Professional Consultants (NTPC) was advertised on September 18, 2020. Prior to the submission deadline, the solicitation was downloaded 39 times, 252 firms viewed the NTPC, and eighteen proposals were received by the submittal deadline of October 23, 2020. On February 22, 2021, at a First-Tier Meeting, the Competitive Selection Committee (CSC) evaluated and ranked proposals, decided to forego Second-Tier proceedings and recommended the top two ranked firms for negotiation. All firms were

evaluated in accordance with Section 2-10.4 of the Miami-Dade County Code, Implementing Order No. [I.O. 3-34](#) and Administrative Order No. [A.O. 3-39](#). Exhibit 2 Negotiation Authorization details the procurement.

The negotiation meetings were held between December 8, 2021 and November 2, 2022. At the conclusion of negotiations, the Negotiation Committee arrived at a schedule of rates for Bermello that were considered fair and reasonable to provide the services. Based on the above, it is recommended that this PSA be awarded to Bermello. It is anticipated that the Notice to Proceed for the PSA will be issued within 30 days of Board approval.

Background

ISD operates over 60 buildings and has up to \$135,178,000 of capital improvement funding to expend over the next five (5) years on new improvements and infrastructure renovations. There are other potential sources of funding that ISD may receive to increase the capital budget. ISD desires designs for their building and infrastructure that are functional, aesthetically pleasing and innovative, while remaining responsive to the unique urgency for delivery and required improvement and that will stand the test of time. The CIIP addresses the County's infrastructure needs by identifying and prioritizing required improvements in affected facilities with the attempt to fashion similarly scoped services and construction in order to procure and contract said services in an expedient and efficient manner.

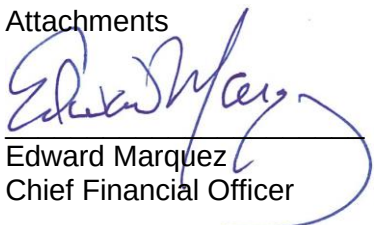
The Facilities and Infrastructure Management Division (FIMD) manages ISD capital renovation projects. The division currently uses the Equitable Distribution Program (EDP) to obtain professional services. ISD has a need to establish two non-exclusive PSAs to provide professional services for multiple rehabilitation and renovation projects at the SPCC Building that exceed the EDP cap of \$400,000 (design) and \$500,000 (studies).

The work assignment distribution will be based on workload, capabilities of the team, location of the project, schedule, familiarity with the location and infrastructure, and, organizational conflict of interest mitigation. Service orders will not be issued under the PSA unless the specific user identifies the appropriate Capital Project and budget funds for the cost of services to be charged to the project or activity requiring these services. The Small Business Enterprise-Architecture & Engineering (SBE-A&E) measure is 18 percent. During the contract term, the consultants are required to report its SBE-A&E performance to Small Business Development (SBD), a Division of ISD.

Due Diligence

Due diligence was performed by ISD and the Strategic Procurement Department in accordance with Resolution No. R-187-12, Resolution No. R-1181-18, and Procurement Guidelines, to determine consultant's responsibility, including verifying corporate status, performance, and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: Sun Biz, convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, federal excluded parties, SBD Violations report. Information was compiled regarding consultant's prior experience with the County. There are 21 evaluations for Bermello listed in the CIIS with an average score of 3.7 out of a possible 4.0 points. There were no adverse findings relating to Bermello's responsibility. SBD Violations, CIIS Evaluations, BTS Non-Performance History, and SBD Firm History reports are attached as Exhibit 3.

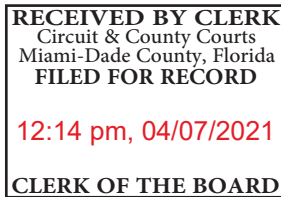

Term and Estimated Cost of Contract: The County intends to retain two (2) qualified consultant(s)/team of firms under separate Non-Exclusive Professional Services Agreements (PSA) each with an effective term of five (5) years. Each PSA has a total maximum contract amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00), exclusive of allowances and fees.

Small Business Enterprise Goal: On July 27, 2020, the Internal Services Department's Small Business Development Division established an 18% Small Business Enterprise – Architectural and Engineering Goal.

Internal Services Department Compliance Review: The proposals submitted by ME Engineering Consultants, Inc. and BEA Architects, Inc. did not meet prequalification/technical certification requirements pursuant to the NTPC and were found non-compliant. Consequently, the proposals from ME Engineering Consultants, Inc. and BEA Architects, Inc. were not evaluated by the Competitive Selection Committee.

Small Business Enterprise Compliance Review: Please refer to the attached Compliance Review Memorandum dated December 14, 2020.

Selection Process: The Architectural and Engineering professional services solicitation process is a two-tiered selection process; First Tier is the Evaluation of Experience and Qualifications, and Second Tier is the Oral Presentations. The First Tier is the evaluation of the firms' current statements of experience, qualifications and performance data. The Second Tier is the evaluation of the shortlisted firms' knowledge of project scope, qualifications of team members assigned to the project, and ability to provide the required services within schedule and budget, as demonstrated through an oral presentation from firms deemed responsive and responsible at the First Tier.

Note: The Competitive Selection Committee may waive the Second Tier selection process by a majority vote and base their selection on the results of the First Tier ranking only.

First Tier Results: The First Tier meeting was held on February 22, 2021. The Competitive Selection Committee was tasked with evaluating the experience and qualifications of the Proposers, and scoring and ranking the proposals in accordance with the evaluation criteria outlined in the solicitation. The Competitive Selection Committee scored all responsive and responsible proposals. During the evaluation process, all ties were broken using the standard tie-breaking procedure, as described in Section 3.3, Proposal Evaluation, of the Notice to Professional Consultants. If negotiations are proceeding within a reasonable timeframe, then negotiations will continue and the report will be submitted upon completion. 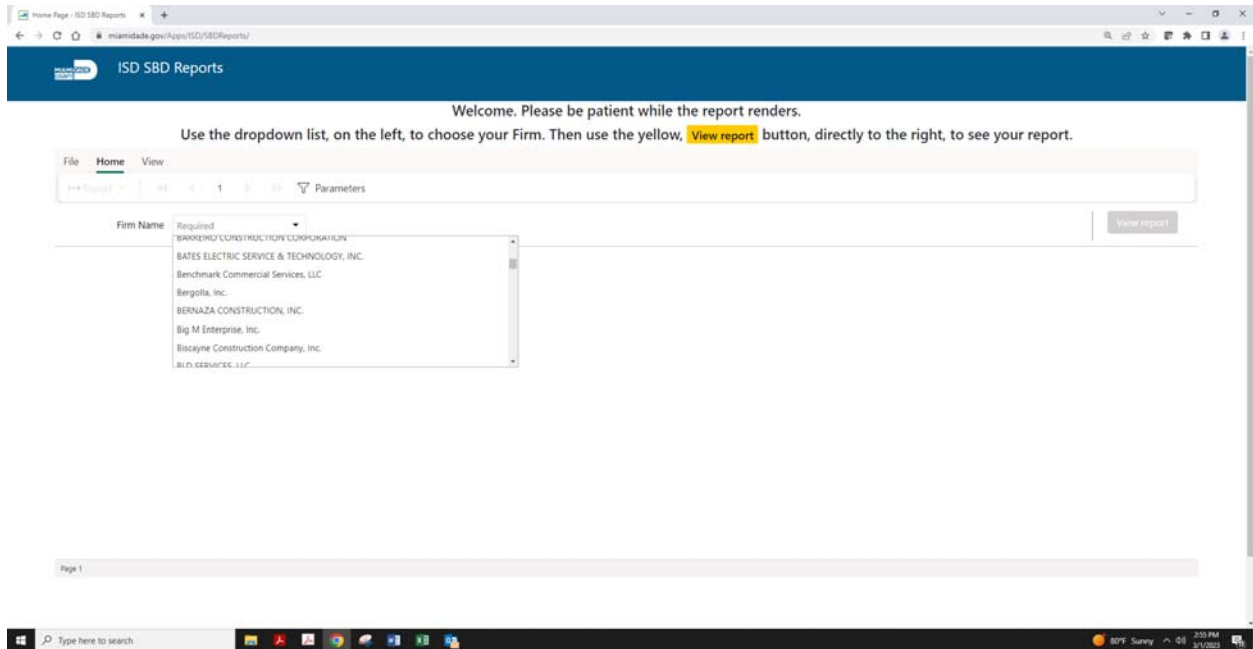

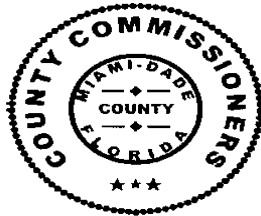
