Subject: Award Recommendation for a Construction Contract for WASD Pavement Restoration with Countywide Option to Renew for an Additional Year Project A (2023-2025), W-953

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This memorandum seeks approval from the Board of County Commissioners (Board) to award construction Contract No. W-953 (the Contract), a two-year Countywide Contract for WASD Pavement Restoration, with a one year countywide Option to Renew, to The Stout Group, LLC (Stout Group), with total compensation amount not exceed \$7,385,635.00 to perform pavement restorations at various locations in the county following water and sewer infrastructure improvements performed by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) internal forces. The work under the Contract encompasses a wide range of tasks essential to pavement restoration, including asphaltic patching repairs, asphaltic concrete repairs, restoration of permanent thermoplastic pavement striping, restoration of reflective pavement markers, obtaining necessary permits such as MOT (Maintenance of Traffic), maintenance of traffic, traffic control among other responsibilities. Some work orders may entail working with separate crews and nightwork when required.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board award the Contract to Stout Group. The total compensation amount under the Contract is not-to-exceed \$7,385,635.00 (total contract period is 1,095 days) over a 3-year project period. The Contract is structured with a two-year initial term with a total compensation amount under that initial term as a not-to-exceed of \$5,000,000.00 and a one-year option to renew with a compensation amount under that renewal term as a not-to-exceed of \$2,385,635.00. Unless the option to renew is exercised the Contract will conclude upon the expiration of the two-year term or depletion of the \$5,000,000.00, whichever occurs first.

Because this is a work order driven contract, the Contract does not guarantee that the full amount of the Contract will be issued to the Contractor. Continuation of the Contract beyond the initial period is at the County's option, and not a right of Stout Group. This prerogative will be exercised only when such continuation is clearly in the best interest of the County. The actual amount of work orders assigned is also a prerogative of the County in its sole discretion and dependent only upon its needs.

SCOPE

The project consists of performing pavement restoration following repairs or improvements made by or on behalf of WASD by removing and replacing asphalt pavement at various locations countywide and will have a countywide impact.

DELEGATED AUTHORITY

Upon Board approval of the Contract, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee may exercise all provisions, including the termination provisions, within the Contract. In addition, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will manage this Contract pursuant to § 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County's Code of Ordinances, the WASD Acceleration Ordinance, which delegates authority to the County Mayor

or County Mayor's designee to, among other things, negotiate and settle claims and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount, subject to ratification by the Board.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

The fiscal impact to the County shall not exceed \$7,385,635.00, which WASD has determined is a fair and reasonable amount for the project's defined scope of work.

The project is in the Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan.

- Funding will be provided from
 - Project #9653261 – Wastewater Treatment Plants – Replacement and Renovation, Book Volume 3, Page 91, Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan for FY 2022-23.
 - Project #9650161 – Water Treatment Plant – Replacement and Renovation, Book Volume 3, Page: 99, Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan for FY 2022-23.
- The funding sources are Wastewater Renewal Fund, Wastewater Special Construction Fund, Water Renewal and Replacement Fund and Fire Hydrant Fund.
- The life expectancy of the restoration is 25 years; there are no associated maintenance or operations costs once the restoration is completed.
- The project does not include GOB funding or Art in Public Places.
- The IG Fee is included.

VENDOR SELECTION & TRACK RECORD

On March 16, 2023, WASD received and opened one (1) response to a February 9, 2023, advertisement for an open competitive solicitation for the Contract. The following was the bid received by the County:

The following due diligence was performed to confirm Stout Group as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder:

- Because there were no contract measures assigned, there was no Compliance Review by Internal Services Department's (ISD) Division of Small Business Development (SBD). The Project Worksheet is attached to this memo as Exhibit A.
- Because the Stout Group bid is 27.25% above the engineer of record's estimate, WASD conducted a responsibility review to explore the pricing differential. After examining the bid submission and discussing it with Stout Group, WASD determined that the bid represented current market conditions and the pricing was acceptable.
- The Engineer of Record, an in-house WASD employee, (EOR) reviewed the bid submission and, on April 4, 2023, the EOR determined that the low bid was acceptable as submitted and that Stout Group satisfied the requirements of the solicitation. The EOR letter is attached as Exhibit B.

- Pursuant to Resolution R-187-12, WASD performed a review of the vendor information in the Business Management Workforce System. WASD discovered no adverse information. Considering the input of ISD and the EOR, WASD concluded that Stout Group is responsible.
- Stout Group has six (6) evaluations in the ISD Capital Improvement Information System (CIIS), with a rating of 3.6 out of a possible four (4) points.
- According to CIIS downloaded on April 5, 2023, Stout Group has been awarded two (2) construction contracts in the past three (3) years by the County, with a total value of \$2,583,780.00.

WASD has concluded that the apparent lowest bidder, Stout Group, is both responsive and responsible. Stout Group's total bid of \$7,385,635 is 27.25% above the EOR's estimate of \$5,804,110.00, the bidder has a 3.6 rating in CIIS, and there are no protests. Therefore, it is recommended that Contract W-953 be awarded to The Stout Group for a total compensation amount not to exceed \$7,385,635.00 (total contract period is 1,095 days) over a 3-year project period. This Contract is structured as a two-year initial term in the amount of \$5,000,000.00 and a one-year County option to renew in the amount of \$2,385,635.00. Unless the option to renew is exercised the Contract will conclude upon the expiration of the two-year term or depletion of the \$5,000,000.00, whichever occurs first. The Contract, signed by Stout Group is attached to this memo as Exhibit C.

WASD CONTRACT MONITOR

WASD Deputy Director of Operations, Billie Jo McCarley, P.E., will oversee the implementation of Contract W-953.

BACKGROUND

While performing work on the Miami-Dade water and sewer infrastructure, WASD frequently must dig in roadways, requiring pavement restoration when the work is complete. WASD system maintenance annually generates about 2,000 paving restoration jobs; in 2021, nearly 1 million square feet of pavement was restored.

The work of this project includes, but is not limited to, performing asphaltic patching repairs; performing asphaltic concrete repairs including milling and resurfacing; saw cutting; removal of existing asphalt; disposal of debris; reworking base; compaction; leveling to match existing pavement; applying prime and tack coats; application of all friction course types; marking restoration; restoration of permanent thermoplastic pavement striping; restoration of reflective pavement markers; maintenance of traffic; traffic control; adjusting manhole and valve boxes; obtaining all final permits to include MOT, lane closure and special events permits from the governing agencies; performing repairs at multiple locations with separate crews; nightwork as required; obtaining and closing permits; and all other appurtenant and miscellaneous items and work for a complete, fully functional and satisfactory project located in Miami-Dade County, Florida.

These pavement restoration jobs can range from small (averaging about 220 sq. ft.) to large projects covering several blocks. Using multiple contracts, WASD distributes the pavement restoration work among the contracting community to provide timely and cost-effective repairs while providing maximum opportunity to small businesses. All pavement restoration contracts are work order driven, with work orders grouped geographically and by the type that is appropriate to the contractor. For example, all FDOT and main street restorations must be performed at night and about 90% require striping to close out the permit for the restoration. Night work and striping requirements are problematic for small businesses. This Contract addresses the larger and more complex pavement restorations not suitable for a small business.

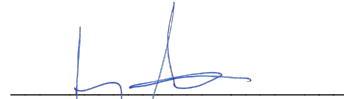

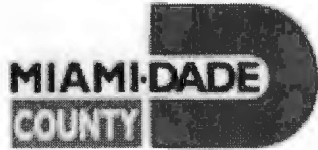

Low Bid Amount: \$6,277,850
WASD Estimate: \$4,840,100
Percent Difference: 29%
Low Bidder: The Stout Group LLC
Number of Bidders: 1

Justification

The Department requested a bid price reduction as part of a responsibility review but the low bidder indicated that he could not reduced his price for the following reasons:

- The Contract requires the price to be fixed for a 2 years period and possibly a 3rd year if the option to renew is exercised.
- Trucking costs and labor have increased significantly over the past year.
- Inflation costs for the 3-year period are difficult to predict.
- The Contractor indicated that his company will self-perform the work and does not want to be arguing with he Department over minor costs. He prefers to have a comfortable profit margin and not have to go after change orders to make the project worthwhile.
- The Department may not award this project for 6 to 9 months while it awaits further approval. In that time costs may continue to increase.

The reasons provided by the low bidder have merit. The Department needs a Contractor that can perform paving work over the 2-to-3-year period to work on the current pavement backlog. When the possible future issues are considered the additional cost can be considered reasonable. The price provided by the low bidder is acceptable and the project should be awarded to the low bidder The Stout Group for the amount establish by the Department.

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into on the ____ day of _____, 2023, by and between Miami-Dade County, Florida, acting by and through the Office of the Mayor, party of the first part (hereinafter sometimes called the "County"), and The Stout Group, LLC, party of the second part (hereinafter sometimes called "Contractor");

W I T N E S S E T H

That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, mutually agree as follows, to wit:

1. That the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment and perform all work in the manner and form provided by the Contract Documents covering the Project of the County known and identified as

Two-Year Countywide Contract for WASD Pavement Restoration, with County Option to Renew for an Additional One Year Project A (2023-2025), Contract No. W-953

at the unit prices reflected in the Proposal, for the aggregate amount of up to **Five Million and No Cents (U.S. Dollars) \$5,000,000.00.** The Contract will be awarded for an aggregate amount of up to \$5,000,000.00 for a two (2)-year period. Unless the Contract is renewed, it will terminate upon the depletion of the awarded amount or the expiration of the two-year period, whichever occurs first. The two-year term of the Contract will commence with the issuance of the Notice to Proceed. The Mayor or his designee has the option to renew the Contract for up to an additional one (1) year, provided that the Contractor maintains prices, etc. used in the original contract with an additional amount up to \$ 2,385,635.00. The County does not guarantee that the full amount of the Contract will be issued to the Contractor. Continuation of the Contract beyond the initial period is a County prerogative not a right of the bidder. This prerogative will be exercised only when such continuation is clearly in the best interest of the County. The actual amount of work orders assigned is also a prerogative of the County in its sole discretion and dependent only upon its needs.

2. That the Contractor shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract on a day to be specified in a written order issued by the Engineer, and shall fully complete all work hereunder within the time or times stated in the Proposal.

3. That the County shall pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this Contract, in lawful money of the United States, and subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the total amount of the Proposal as set forth above at the times and in a manner stated in the General Terms and Conditions of the Contract Documents.

4. It is further mutually agreed that if at any time after the execution of this Contract, Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the County shall deem the surety upon such bonds to be unsatisfactory, or if for any reason such bond shall become inadequate to cover the performance of the work, the Contractor shall at its own expense, within five (5) days after the receipt of notice from the County to do so, furnish an additional bond or bonds in such form and amount and with such surety or sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the Contractor shall be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional security shall have been furnished in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.

5. The "Contract Documents" are hereby defined as the Questionnaire, the Notice to Quote, the Instruction to Bidders, the Proposal, the Certified Resolution (Proposal/Prescribed Bid Bond), the Prescribed Bid Bond, the Contract, the Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the Certified Resolution (Contract/ Surety Performance and Payment Bond), the General Terms and Conditions, the Supplemental General Terms and Conditions, Special Provisions, the Supplemental General Conditions (if Ordinance 90-143 is applicable) including Wage and Benefit Schedules, the Specifications, the Plans, any Addenda which may be issued, the Subcontractor /Supplier Listing Form (Ordinance 97-104 as amended by Ordinance 00-30), the Reporting Subcontracting Policies and Procedures (Ordinance 98 -15 9), the Small Business Enterprise Programs Participation Provisions and Forms (if applicable), and the provisions for the following: Vendors Affidavit (Uniform County Affidavits); ; Criminal Record (Felony) (as amended by Ordinance 00-30 ;;Community Workforce Program County Code Section 2-1701, Office of Miami-Dade County Inspector General (IG) (if Ordinance 97-215 as amended by Ordinance 99-15 is applicable); Sworn Statement - Public Entity Crimes [Florida Statute Sect. 287.133 (3) (a)]; Change Orders; Notice to Proceed, Referenced Codes and Standards, Warranties and Guarantees, all related correspondence, field notes, logs, and other documents

The General Terms and Conditions of said Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein. The Contract Documents are complementary, so that a recital in one is tantamount to a recital in all, and the Contractor specifically acknowledges that it has read and understands all of said Contract Documents.

6. The various indemnities of the Contractor contained in the Contract Documents indemnifying the County from liability for damages to persons or property caused by acts, omissions, or defaults in the performance of the Contract Documents shall have a monetary limitation of the larger of the following: \$1,000,000.00, or the entire amount of the Contract.

7. The County retains the right to audit any and all information regarding this Contract as described in the General Covenants and Conditions, Section 41 "Audit Rights and Review of Records".

8. Notwithstanding and prevailing over any other provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, the County Mayor or his designee, may exercise the provisions of Section 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed 10 percent of the base contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to emergency actions impacting remediation, public safety, health requirements or recovery from natural disaster and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this Contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (5), the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's award and execution of this Contract is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners. If the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's action is not ratified, and such legislative action becomes final, this Contract shall be deemed terminated without further notice. In such event, the Contractor shall not be entitled to recovery of any lost profits or other consequential or indirect damages. However, the Contractor is eligible for payment for any work done prior to failure of the ratification, in accordance with General Terms and Conditions Article 11.D(1) Termination for Convenience.

9. "Contract Execution Date" means the date of the last signature on this contract.

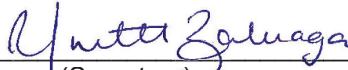

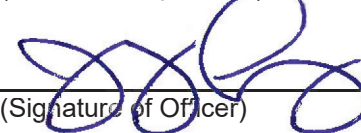

Section 1. Approves the foregoing recital and incorporates it into this resolution.

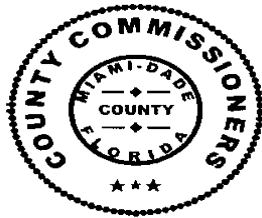
Section 2. Awards Contract (Contract W-953) to The Stout Group, LLC with a total contract amount not to exceed \$7,385,635.00 and a total contract term of 1,095 calendar days for Countywide Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Pavement Restoration Projects in substantially the form attached as Exhibit C to the accompanying memorandum.

Section 3. Authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to use WASD’s Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, to manage the Contract; and to execute the same and to exercise the termination and other provisions contained therein.

The Chairperson thereupon declared this resolution duly passed and adopted this 6th day of September, 2023. This resolution shall become effective upon the earlier of (1) 10 days after the date of its adoption unless vetoed by the County Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board, or (2) approval by the County Mayor of this resolution and the filing of this approval with the Clerk of the Board.
