**Subject:** Setting of Proposed FY 2023-24 Unincorporated Municipal Service Area (UMSA)

Operating Millage Rate

## **Executive Summary**

This item recommends an Unincorporated Municipal Service Area (UMSA) operating millage rate for the Board's approval. As the Proposed Budget was developed this year, we prioritized the need to sustain critical public safety services for our growing community provided by the UMSA budget, which goes largely to support law enforcement and public safety. The proposed millage will ensure we can continue investing in public safety and safer neighborhoods across Miami-Dade while we prepare for the impending transition to constitutional officers.

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board approve the UMSA operating millage rate of 1.9090 mills, as proposed in the FY 2023-24 Proposed Budget, for use in preparing the "Notice of Proposed Property Taxes" to be mailed to all property owners in August.

## Scope

State law requires that all property owners be advised of proposed property taxes along with notification of public budget hearings. The Property Appraiser will mail required notices to all property owners in August using proposed tax rates adopted by all taxing authorities in Miami-Dade County.

#### **Delegated Authority**

This item contains no delegations of authority to the County Mayor or Mayor's designee.

# **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The millage rate recommended will generate \$204.355 million in ad valorem revenue for the Unincorporated Municipal Service Area.

### **Track Record/Monitor**

Not applicable.

#### **Background**

The recommended UMSA operating millage rate of 1.9090 mills provides revenue to support UMSA operations as provided for in the FY 2023-24 Proposed Budget.

RESOLUTION SETTING THE PROPOSED FISCAL YEAR 2023-24 UNINCORPORATED MUNICIPAL SERVICE AREA OPERATING MILLAGE RATE

WHEREAS, section 200.065, Florida Statutes, establishes and describes the requirement that the governing body of each taxing authority hold public hearings on the tentative budget and proposed millage rates, and requires that, within 35 days of certification of value by the Property Appraiser, each taxing authority advise the Property Appraiser of its proposed millage rate and rolled-back rate and of the date, time and place at which a public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rates and tentative budget so that the information can be included in the notice of proposed property taxes mailed to property owners in August; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum from the County Mayor, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the proposed Fiscal Year 2023-24 Unincorporated Municipal Service Area operating millage rate equal to 1.9090 is approved for transmittal to the Property Appraiser.
