RESOLUTION NO. R-553-24

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY'S INTERNATIONAL TRADE CONSORTIUM TO NEGOTIATE AND, TO THE EXTENT FEASIBLE, PREPARE A SISTER CITIES AGREEMENT WITH SEVILLE, SPAIN, AND TRANSMIT SUCH AGREEMENT TO THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE FOR EXECUTION; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE SUCH AGREEMENT UPON RECEIPT FROM THE INTERNATIONAL TRADE CONSORTIUM; AND DIRECTING THE INTERNATIONAL TRADE CONSORTIUM TO MONITOR PERFORMANCE OF SUCH AGREEMENT AND PROVIDE A REPORT TO THIS BOARD

WHEREAS, it is economically and culturally beneficial to establish affiliations between Miami-Dade County, Florida (the "County") and other cities throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, a sister cities relationship is a long-term cooperative relationship between two cities in different countries through which cultural, art, educational, business, and technical exchanges are fostered; and

WHEREAS, Sister Cities International is an international nonprofit organization created at President Dwight D. Eisenhower's 1956 White House summit on citizen diplomacy, where he envisioned a network that would be a champion for prosperity and peace by fostering bonds between people from different communities around the world; and

WHEREAS, since its inception, Sister Cities International has worked to create global relationships based on cultural, educational, information and trade exchanges, which has resulted in participants developing lifelong friendships that enable communities to better tackle the world's most pressing issues at the local level, through person-to-person "citizen diplomacy"; and

WHEREAS, business and trade exchanges are a fundamental component of Sister Cities programs, and they help create connections between international municipal officials, institutions, and businesses that build trust, access, and expertise and help local businesses find new opportunities and resources, including access to new markets, assistance navigating import and export regulations, and introductions to new business partners; and

WHEREAS, the County has established Sister Cities relationships with numerous cities in South America, Central America, the Caribbean, Europe, Africa, and Asia; and

WHEREAS, the Sister Cities Program has developed innovative projects, furthered international cooperation and understanding between the County and its respective sister cities, and helped to promote the County's position as the Gateway to the Americas; and

WHEREAS, the County has extensive trade ties with Spain, with total trade between the County and Spain having totaled approximately \$1,400,000,000.00 in 2023; and

WHEREAS, there are currently approximately 350 Spanish companies operating in the County; and

WHEREAS, Seville, the fourth largest city in Spain, is a city of great cultural importance and the largest historic center of Europe; and

WHEREAS, Seville is the capital city of Andalusia, the most populous of Spain's 17 political subdivisions known as autonomous communities; and

WHEREAS, Seville is home to the only inland maritime port in Spain, a strategic location for the European Union, with sea, rail and road connections; and

WHEREAS, the County is already party to a sister seaport agreement with the Port of Seville; and

WHEREAS, the County is the Gateway to the Americas; and

WHEREAS, under section 2-1501 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (the “Code”), the Jay Malina International Trade Consortium of Miami-Dade County (the “ITC”), an advisory board of this Board, is charged with, among other things, cultivating relations with the County’s Sister Cities and administering the Sister Cities Program; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the great benefits in trade, tourism, cooperation, and understanding brought by Sister Cities Agreements, this Board would like to direct the ITC to negotiate and, to the extent feasible, prepare a Sister Cities Agreement with Seville, Spain, for execution by the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the ITC to negotiate and, to the extent feasible, prepare a Sister Cities Agreement with Seville, Spain, in substantially the form of the agreement attached hereto, and transmit such agreement (the “Agreement”) to the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee for execution.

Section 2. Authorizes and directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to execute such Agreement upon receipt from the ITC.

Section 3. Directs the ITC to monitor the performance of such executed Agreement in connection with its powers and duties under sections 2-1501 through 2-1503 of the Code.

Section 4. Directs the ITC to prepare a report to this Board within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution regarding the status of the negotiation and execution of the Agreement and place such report on an agenda of the full Board without committee review pursuant to Rule 5.06(j) of the Board’s Rules of Procedure.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Juan Carlos Bermudez. It was offered by Commissioner **Anthony Rodriguez**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Eileen Higgins** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

**SISTER CITIES AGREEMENT BETWEEN
MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND SEVILLE, SPAIN**

The parties hereto, Miami-Dade County, Florida and Seville, Spain (collectively, the “Parties”), desire to enter into a Sister Cities Agreement as more specifically described below:

WHEREAS, it is economically and culturally beneficial for cities throughout the world to establish affiliations with each other; and

WHEREAS, Sister Cities International is an international nonprofit organization created at President Dwight D. Eisenhower’s 1956 White House summit on citizen diplomacy, where he envisioned a network that would be a champion for prosperity and peace by fostering bonds between people from different communities around the world; and

WHEREAS, business and trade exchanges are a fundamental component of Sister Cities programs, and they help create connections between international municipal officials, institutions, and businesses that build trust, access, and expertise and help local businesses find new opportunities and resources, including access to new markets, assistance navigating import and export regulations, and introductions to new business partners; and

WHEREAS, the Parties seek to strengthen their cultural and trade relationships with one another; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND SEVILLE, SPAIN, THAT THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE TO:

1. Establish a Sister Cities Agreement with each other.
2. Explore programs, arrangements, activities, transactions, agreements and other ways to enhance trade and business opportunities for the citizens of both Parties, mutually benefit economic development and growth and tourism for both Parties, and enhance prosperity for the citizens of both Parties.
3. Engage in an exchange program of best practices for enhancing the economic and social well-being of the citizens of each Party.
4. Undertake business development, trade, arts, and cultural missions to each community.
5. Make periodic reports and recommendations to their respective governing bodies regarding the foregoing objectives.
