RESOLUTION APPROVING, ADOPTING, AND
CONFIRMING A REVISED ASSESSMENT ROLL
PROVIDING FOR ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS AGAINST REAL
PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE AMENDED
BOUNDARIES OF THE BHM EAST CAMPUS EXPANSION
STREET LIGHTING SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT IN MIAMI-
DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, TO BE GENERALLY BOUNDED
ON THE NORTH BY SW 88 STREET/N. KENDALL DR., ON
THE EAST BY SW 87 AVENUE AND SW 87 COURT, ON THE
SOUTH BY SW 94 STREET, AND ON THE WEST BY SW 92
AVENUE; PROVIDING THAT ASSESSMENTS MADE SHALL
CONSTITUTE A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT LIEN ON REAL
PROPERTY; AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF
SUCH ASSESSMENTS

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 18 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida (“Code”), this Board on September 12, 2006, adopted Ordinance No. 06-117, creating the special taxing district in Miami-Dade County, Florida, known and designated as the BHM East Campus Expansion Special Taxing District (“Special Taxing District”); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 18 of the Code, on September 12, 2006, a preliminary assessment roll was caused to be prepared and filed with the Clerk of the Board (“Clerk”) per Resolution No. R-923-06; and

WHEREAS, this Board adopted Ordinance No. 24-83, amending Ordinance No. 06-117 to add certain contiguous properties to the Special Taxing District; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 18 of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee caused a revised assessment roll to be prepared and filed with the Clerk; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 18 of the Code, notice of the public hearing on the revised assessment roll was provided; and

WHEREAS, this Board held a public hearing on this date upon the revised assessment roll submitted by the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, and all interested persons were afforded the opportunity to present their objections, if any, with respect to such assessment roll; and

WHEREAS, each property owner within the amended Special Taxing District was notified that the special assessments may be placed on their real property tax bills, and that, if these special assessments are not paid when due, the properties on which the special assessments are levied will be subject to the same collection procedures as for ad valorem taxes, including possible loss of title,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The revised assessment roll for the amended BHM East Campus Expansion Street Lighting Special Taxing District (a copy of which is made a part hereof by reference) is approved, adopted, and confirmed pursuant to section 18-14(6) of the Code.

Section 2. Within 30 days from the effective date of this resolution, the Clerk is directed to deliver to the Finance Director a copy of the revised assessment roll, and to cause a duly certified copy of this resolution, together with the revised assessment roll, to be filed and recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Section 3. All assessments made upon said revised assessment roll shall constitute a special assessment lien upon the real property so assessed from the date of the confirmation of such assessments, in accordance with the provisions of section 18-14(8) of the Code.

Section 4. All assessments shall be payable in accordance with section 18-14(7) of the Code. As authorized by section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, all special assessments levied and imposed under the provisions of the Ordinance amending the Special Taxing District, and

this resolution, shall be collected, subject to the provisions of chapter 197, Florida Statutes, in the same manner and at the same time as ad valorem taxes. Unless paid when due, such assessments shall be deemed delinquent and payment thereof may be enforced by means of the procedures provided by the provisions of chapter 197, Florida Statutes, and section 18-14 of the Code.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner, **Kevin Marino Cabrera** who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner, **Juan Carlos Bermudez** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
