RESOLUTION NO. R-203-25

RESOLUTION URGING THE CITY OF MIAMI (THE “CITY”) (1) TO INITIATE THE ROAD CLOSING PROCESS FOR CITY OWNED AND MAINTAINED ROADS LOCATED BETWEEN NW 46TH STREET AND NW 50TH STREET AND BETWEEN NW 7TH AVENUE AND NW 12TH AVENUE AND TO TAKE ALL LEGALLY REQUIRED MEASURES TO EFFECTUATE SAID POTENTIAL ROAD CLOSINGS; AND (2) THAT SUCH CLOSURES PRIORITIZE TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES, INCREASE TREE CANOPY, IMPROVE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY, INTENSIFY THE QUAINTESS OF THE SUBJECT AREA WHERE THE CENTERPIECE OF THE STUDY AREA SHALL BE THE TWO MUNICIPAL PARKS—ONE EAST OF 10TH AVENUE AND THE OTHER WEST OF 10TH AVENUE— AND THAT THE AVENUES OF NW 10TH, 12TH, AND 7TH SHALL NOT BE OBSTRUCTED, NW 46TH STREET AND NW 50TH STREET SHALL NOT BE OBSTRUCTED, AND THAT TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES SHALL ESTABLISH TWO DISTINCT NEIGHBORHOODS SEPARATED BY NW 10TH AVENUE

WHEREAS, at the February 19, 2025 Board of County Commissioners meeting, a motion was made urging the City of Miami (the “City”) to initiate the road closing process for City owned and maintained roads located between NW 46th Street and NW 50th Street and between NW 7th Avenue and NW 12th Avenue and to take all legally required measures to effectuate said potential road closings; and

WHEREAS, the motion further urged the City that such closures prioritize traffic calming measures, increase tree canopy, improve pedestrian safety, intensify the quaintness of the subject area where the centerpiece of the study area shall be the two municipal parks—one east of 10th avenue and the other west of 10th avenue—and that the avenues of NW 10th, 12th, and 7th shall not be obstructed, NW 46th street and NW 50th street shall not be obstructed, and that traffic calming measures shall establish two distinct neighborhoods separated by NW 10th Avenue,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board urges the City of Miami (the “City”) to initiate the road closing process for City owned and maintained roads located between NW 46th Street and NW 50th Street and between NW 7th Avenue and NW 12th Avenue and to take all legally required measures to effectuate said potential road closings. Further, this Board urges that such closures prioritize traffic calming measures, increase tree canopy, improve pedestrian safety, intensify the quaintness of the subject area where the centerpiece of the study area shall be the two municipal parks—one east of 10th avenue and the other west of 10th avenue—and that the avenues of NW 10th, 12th, and 7th shall not be obstructed, NW 46th street and NW 50th street shall not be obstructed, and that traffic calming measures shall establish two distinct neighborhoods separated by NW 10th Avenue.
