**Subject:** Resolution Ratifying the Award of Construction Contract S-20059R for South District Wastewater Treatment Plant FA Well Monitoring Phase 2 related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance

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**Executive Summary**

This item seeks ratification of Contract No. S-20059R (the Contract) for the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant FA Well Monitoring Phase 2 (the Project) with All Webbs Enterprises, Inc. (All Webbs) in an amount not to exceed \$2,992,400.00 and with a total Contract period of 803 calendar days which includes a Contingency Allowance of 73 days. The Project is needed to meet the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Underground Injection Control (UIC) permit condition to replace FA-1 and FA-3 with new Floridan Aquifer monitoring wells.

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (the Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's (WASD's) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD's Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A.

**Capital Improvement Project**

Item 1 – Recommendation awarding Contract No. S-20059R, South District Wastewater Treatment Plant FA Well Monitoring Phase 2. The award was filed on November 22, 2024, and the Contract was fully executed and attested by the Clerk's Office on February 14, 2025.

**Delegation of Authority**

The Contract was awarded pursuant to WASD's Acceleration Ordinance, which delegates authority to the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to award certain projects, and among other things, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount, subject to ratification by the Board.

**Scope**

The Contract will be performed at South District Wastewater Treatment Plant (the SDWWTP) located at 8950 SW 232 Street, Miami, Florida 33032 in District 8, which is represented by Commissioner Danielle Cohen Higgins.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The funding sources for the Project are: Future WASD Revenue Bonds, WASD Revenue Bonds Sold and Wastewater Renewal Fund. The fiscal impact to the County will be \$2,992,400.00.

**Track Record/Monitoring**

WASD Deputy Director, Planning Regulatory Compliance and Capital Infrastructure, Marisela Aranguiz-Cueto, P.E., will oversee the implementation of the Project.

**Due Diligence/Safety Information**

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the People and Internal Operations Department (PIOD) in accordance with PIOD's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status; performance; safety record, including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) records; and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to All Webbs's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12.

**Background**

The Project is required to comply with the FDEP UIC permit to operate 17 domestic injection wells at the SDWWTP. Without the operating permit to inject domestic wastewater, the SDWWTP is not able to operate the injection wells that are currently permitted under the UIC program and are the only method for wastewater disposal at the plant. The Project is also needed to ensure that there is no upper fluid migration of the high-level disinfected effluent to the Upper Floridan Aquifer, which is the overlying underground source of drinking water.

The Contract requires All Webbs to furnish all materials, labor, and equipment necessary to construct two (2) new single zone monitoring wells to an approximate casing depth of 980 feet below land surface for FA-1R associated with IW-8 and FA-3R associated with IW-12. The Contractor will also have to suppress the artesian flow for the existing injection wells at the SDWWTP to allow for WASD Operations crew to work on the above ground piping of the wells.

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD's (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan's Capital Improvement Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

**Executive Summary**

This memorandum seeks approval to award Contract No. S-20059R, South District Wastewater Treatment Plant FA Well Monitoring Phase 2 (the "Contract"), to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, All Webbs Enterprises, Inc. ("All Webbs"). The work is needed to meet the Florida Department of Environmental Protection ("FDEP") Underground Injection Control ("UIC") permit condition to replace FA-1 and FA-3 with new Floridan Aquifer monitoring wells (the "Project") and is in the Proposed Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan.

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that Contract No. S-20059R be awarded to All Webbs for a total compensation amount of \$2,992,400.00, with a total Contract period of 700 calendar days to Substantial Completion, 730 calendar days to Final Completion, and a time contingency allowance of 73 calendar days, for a total Contract period of 803 days.

**Scope**

This Contract will be performed at the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant ("SDWWTP") located at 8950 SW 232 Street, Miami, Florida 33032 in District 8, which is represented by Commissioner Danielle Cohen Higgins.

**Delegated Authority**

The Project is a Capital Improvement Contract being processed under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, the WASD Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Program Acceleration Ordinance ("WASD Acceleration Ordinance"). Pursuant to Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee has the authority to, among other things, amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base Contract amount, subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board").

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The fiscal impact to the County is \$2,992,400.00, which the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department ("WASD") has determined is a fair and reasonable amount for the Project's defined scope of work.

The Project is in the Proposed Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan.

- Funding will be provided from Program OMB Project # 9655481 South District Wastewater Treatment Plant Projects in the FY 2024-25 Proposed Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan, Budget Book 3 Page 100.

- The funding sources are Future WASD Revenue Bonds, WASD Revenue Bonds Sold and Wastewater Renewal Fund.
- The life expectancy of the work is 50 years.
- Operations Cost Impact / Funding: \$30,000.00. The funding source for the operating impact is WASD Operating Revenues.
- Maintenance Cost Impact / Funding: \$10,000.00. The funding source for the maintenance impact is WASD Operating Revenues.
- The Project does not include GOB funding or Art in Public Places.
- The IG Fee is included.

**Vendor Selection & Track Record**

On October 29, 2024, WASD received and opened two (2) bids in response to the September 26, 2024, advertisement for an open competitive solicitation.

The following due diligence was performed to determine whether All Webbs was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder:

- Because no Contract measures were assigned, a Compliance Review was not required by the Internal Services Department's ("ISD") Division of Small Business Development ("SBD"). The Project Worksheet is attached to this memo as Exhibit A.
- Maria Macfarlane, the Engineer of Record ("EOR"), reviewed the bid submission and, on November 6, 2024, determined that the low bid was acceptable as submitted and that All Webbs satisfied the requirements of the solicitation. The EOR letter is attached as Exhibit B.
- Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, WASD performed a review of the vendor information in the Business Management Workforce System ("BMWS"). WASD discovered no adverse information.
- According to the contract history downloaded from the BMWS on November 8, 2024, over the past three years, All Webbs has been awarded one contract for \$19,000.00 as a subcontractor on a County project.
- All Webbs has 4 evaluations in the ISD Capital Improvement Information System ("CIIS"), with a rating of 3.9 out of a possible 4.0 maximum.

Considering the input of the EOR and the information gathered during its due diligence, WASD has concluded that the apparent lowest bidder, All Webbs is both responsive and responsible. The total bid of \$2,992,400.00 is 20.27% below the EOR's estimate of \$3,753,050.00, the bidder has a 3.9 rating in CIIS, and there are no protests. Therefore, it is recommended that Contract No. S-20059R be awarded to All Webbs for a total compensation amount of \$2,992,400.00, with a total Contract period of 803 days. The proposed Contract, signed by All Webbs Enterprises, Inc., is attached to this memo as Exhibit C.

**WASD Contract Monitor**

WASD Deputy Director, Planning Regulatory Compliance and Capital Infrastructure, Marisela Aranguiz-Cueto, P.E., will oversee the implementation of the Contract.

**Background**

The Contract is for furnishing all materials, labor, and equipment necessary to construct two (2) new single zone monitoring wells to an approximate casing depth of 980 feet below land surface, FA-1R associated with IW-8 and FA-3R associated with IW-12. The Contractor will also have to suppress the artesian flow for the existing injection wells at the SDWWTP to allow for WASD Operations crew to work on the above ground piping of the wells.

This Project is required to comply with the FDEP UIC permit to operate 17 domestic injection wells at the SDWWTP. Without the operating permit to inject domestic wastewater, the plant is not able to operate these injection wells that are currently permitted under the UIC program. Therefore, the plant would not be able to dispose of up to 317 million gallons of wastewater per day because, at the SDWWTP, underground injection is the only way to dispose of wastewater. The Project is also needed to properly monitor that there is no upper fluid migration of the high-level disinfected effluent to the Upper Floridan Aquifer, the overlying Underground Source of Drinking Water ("USDW")..

### WITNESSETH

That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, mutually agree as follows, to wit:

1. That the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment and perform all work in the manner and form provided by the Contract Documents covering the Project of the County known and identified as

#### **SOUTH DISTRICT WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT FA WELL MONITORING PHASE 2, CONTRACT NO. S-20059R**

for the aggregate amount reflected by the Proposal, said aggregate amount being of **Two Million Nine Hundred Ninety-Two Thousand Four Hundred Dollars and No Cents (U.S. Dollars) \$2,992,400.00.**

2. That the Contractor shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract on a day to be specified in a written order issued by the Engineer and shall fully complete all work hereunder within the time or times stated in the Proposal.

3. That the County shall pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this Contract, in lawful money of the United States, and subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the total amount of the Proposal as set forth above at the times and in a manner stated in the General Contract Conditions of the Contract Documents.

4. It is further mutually agreed that if at any time after the execution of this Contract, Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the County shall deem the surety upon such bonds to be unsatisfactory, or if for any reason such bond shall become inadequate to cover the performance of the work, the Contractor shall at its own expense, within five (5) days after the receipt of notice from the County to do so, furnish an additional bond or bonds in such form and amount and with such surety or sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the Contractor shall be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional security shall have been furnished in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.

5. The "Contract Documents" are hereby defined as the Advertisement for Bids, Questionnaire, Instruction to Bidders, Proposal, Certified Resolution for Proposal and Bid Form, Bid Bond, all forms submitted pre and post award, including, without limitation, Miami-Dade County Vendor Affidavits Form, Sworn Statement – Public Entity Crimes, Clearinghouse Affidavit, Job Order Request form, and the Small Business Enterprise Programs Participation Provisions and Forms (if applicable), this Contract, Certified Resolution for Contract and Performance and Payment Bond, Performance and Payment Bond, Standard Construction General Contract Conditions, revised August 1, 2023, the Technical Specifications, Plans and Drawings designated in the specifications, all Technical Appendices, all Addenda, Water & Sewer Department Special Provisions, Change Orders to the Contract, Notice to Proceed, Referenced Codes and Standards,

## CONTRACT

Warranties and Guarantees, all related correspondence, field notes, logs, and other documents.

The Standard Construction General Contract Conditions of said Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein. The Contract Documents are complementary, so that a recital in one is tantamount to a recital in all, and the Contractor specifically acknowledges that it has read and understands all of said Contract Documents.

6. The various indemnities of the Contractor contained in the Contract Documents indemnifying the County from liability for damages to persons or property caused by acts, omissions, or defaults in the performance of the Contract Documents shall have a monetary limitation of the larger of the following: \$1,000,000.00, or the entire amount of the Contract.

7. The County retains the right to audit any and all information regarding this Contract as described in the Standard Construction General Contract Conditions, Article 12 G (Miscellaneous Provisions – Audit Rights)

8. Notwithstanding and prevailing over any other provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, the County Mayor or his designee, may exercise the provisions of Section 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed 10 percent of the base contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to emergency actions impacting remediation, public safety, health requirements or recovery from natural disaster and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this Contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (5), the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's award and execution of this Contract is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners. If the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's action is not ratified, and such legislative action becomes final, this Contract shall be deemed terminated without further notice. In such event, the Contractor shall not be entitled to recovery of any lost profits or other consequential or indirect damages. However, the Contractor is eligible for payment for any work done prior to failure of the ratification, in accordance with General Contract Conditions Article on Termination for Convenience.

9. "Contract Execution Date" means the date of the last signature on this contract.
