Subject: Resolution Ratifying the Award of Construction Contract No. S-20331, Emergency Project for Operational and Resiliency Improvements to the Calcium Carbonate Lagoon and Softeners at Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant

Executive Summary

This item seeks ratification by the Board of County Commissioners (the Board) of Construction Contract No. S-20331 (the Contract) for the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Emergency Project for Operational and Resiliency Improvements to the Calcium Carbonate Lagoon and Softeners at Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant (Alex Orr WTP), which was awarded, after an accelerated competitive solicitation process, to Lanzo Construction Co., Florida (the Contractor) for a total amount of \$23,742,340.00 and with a total Contract period of 540 calendar days.

On November 12, 2024, WASD declared an emergency and went out for competitive solicitation among an emergency pool of pre-approved contractors for large diameter pipe work, to address the lack of capacity to dispose of sludge and backwash water at the Alex Orr WTP due to the breach of a sludge lagoon berm. The Contractor will dredge the southern lagoon, create new berms within the existing lagoons, and install new drives for the seven (7) softening units to improve the resilience of the treatment process (the Project). Additionally, the Contractor will repair or replace an existing sludge line to facilitate the disposal of lime residuals in the southern lagoon and will remove solids that have accumulated in the chlorine contact basin.

These efforts will provide the redundancy and flexibility needed to address concerns related to the lagoons, softening process, and backwash water disposal, which is critical to the continued supply of safe and reliable drinking water to the Community.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board: (1) find that the Project constitutes an emergency repair and replacement of a public structure that is necessary to resolve an immediate danger to public health or safety pursuant to Section 255.20(1)(c)(1), of the Florida Statutes; and (2) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to WASD's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD's Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A.

Delegation of Authority

This Contract was awarded pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to WASD's Acceleration Ordinance, which delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award certain projects, and among other things, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount, subject to ratification by the Board.

Scope

The Contract will be performed at the Alex Orr WTP located at 6800 SW 87 Avenue, Miami, Florida 33173 in Commission District 6, which is represented by Commissioner Natalie Milian Orbis.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact to the County is \$23,742,340.00 and will be funded out of WASD Future Revenue Bonds. There is no impact to the General Fund. Due to the emergency nature of the Project, the Project will be funded from a current project in the WASD Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan. Funding will be provided from Program 9650031 Water Reset Program – Water Treatment Plant – Alexander Orr, Jr Expansion, 24-25 Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan, Volume 3, page 108.

Track Record/Monitoring

WASD's Deputy Director of Planning, Regulatory Compliance and Capital Infrastructure, Marisela Aranguiz-Cueto, P.E., will oversee the implementation of this Project.

Due Diligence/Safety Information

Due diligence was conducted by WASD to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status; performance; safety record, including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) records; and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to the Contractor's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12.

Background

On the evening of October 23, 2024, a berm at the northern sludge lagoon at the Alex Orr WTP failed. The lagoon is one of two on-site lagoons used for the disposal of lime residuals. The southern lagoon is currently at capacity and cannot accept any additional lime residuals. As a result, the breach of the berm at the northern lagoon created a situation where both sludge and backwash water could no longer be disposed of within the Alex Orr WTP.

Despite the breach, the plant continued to operate, and backwash water was redirected to the influent of the treatment process on or around October 25, 2024. However, the introduction of water with a high solids concentration into the treatment process had a measurable impact on the turbidity of the filtered water. To ensure continued effective treatment, operational redundancy and flexibility will be required.

Given the critical nature of the infrastructure and the need for redundancy to maintain the reliable supply of safe drinking water, WASD declared an emergency and issued an accelerated competitive solicitation among its emergency pool of contractors pre-qualified to perform work on large diameter pipelines. WASD accepted formal sealed bids from members of the pool and awarded the contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder from the pool. The Contractor will dredge the southern lagoon, create new berms within the existing lagoons to ensure redundancy, and install new drives for the seven (7) softening units to improve the resilience of the treatment process. Additionally, the Contractor will repair or replace an existing sludge line to facilitate the disposal of lime residuals in the southern lagoon and will remove solids that have accumulated in the chlorine contact basin. All ancillary work required for a complete and functional installation will also be included. These efforts will provide the redundancy and flexibility needed to address concerns related to the lagoons, softening process, and backwash water disposal.

Subject: Award Recommendation for Contract S-20331, Emergency Project for Operational and Resiliency Improvements to the Calcium Carbonate Lagoon and Softeners at Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant

Executive Summary

This memorandum seeks approval to award Contract S-20331, Emergency Project for Operational and Resiliency Improvements to the Calcium Carbonate Lagoon and Softeners at the Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant (Alex Orr WTP) (the Contract), to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Lanzo Construction Co. Florida (Lanzo) in the amount of \$23,742,340.00, with a total Contract period of 540 calendar days.

On November 12, 2024, the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) declared an emergency to address the lack of capacity to dispose of sludge and backwash water at the Alex Orr WTP due to the breach of a sludge lagoon berm. The disposal of sludge and backwash water is critical to the continued supply of safe and reliable drinking water to the community. The Declaration of Emergency was made to initiate a construction contract as soon as possible to begin work in dredging the lagoon, repairing the berms, and taking other actions to repair the damage and increase the resiliency of the water treatment process (the Project). See the Declaration of Emergency dated November 12, 2024, attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Contract be awarded to Lanzo for a total compensation amount of \$23,742,340.00, with a total Contract period of 540 calendar days.

Scope

The Contract will be performed at the Alex Orr WTP located at 6800 SW 87 Avenue, Miami, Florida 33173 in Commission District 6, which is represented by Commissioner Kevin Marino Cabrera.

Delegated Authority

The Project is being processed under a Declaration of Emergency. It will be submitted to the Board of County Commissioners (the Board) for ratification. At that time, WASD intends to request that the Board authorize WASD to utilize section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, the WASD Acceleration Ordinance, in order to manage the Contract. If the Board approves utilization of the WASD Acceleration Ordinance, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will be authorized to amend and execute the Contract, subject to ratification by the Board. Pursuant to sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to, among other things, amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work; waive liquidated damages; negotiate and settle claims; and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact to the County is \$23,742,340.00, which WASD has determined is a fair and reasonable amount for the Project's defined scope of work. The project is an emergency that will be funded from a project that is in the Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan.

- Funding will be provided from Program 9650031 Water Reset Program – Water Treatment Plant – Alexander Orr, Jr Expansion, 24-25 Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan, Volume 3, page 108.
- The funding sources is Future WASD Revenue Bonds.
- The life expectancy of the work is 40 years.
- Operations Cost Impact / Funding: None. These repairs are an integral part of a larger system and have no separate operating costs.
- Maintenance Cost Impact / Funding: None. These repairs are an integral part of a larger system and have no separate maintenance costs.
- The Project does not include GOB funding or Art in Public Places.
- The IG Fee is included.

Vendor Selection & Track Record

On January 21, 2025, WASD received and opened the following three (3) bids in response to the Declaration of Emergency and activation of the WASD MCC 7360 ER Sub-Pool 1 Large Transmission Mains Emergency Pool (the Emergency Pool) for an open competitive solicitation among the Emergency Pool members.

The following due diligence was performed to determine that Lanzo was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder:

- WASD reviewed the bid submission and determined that Lanzo satisfied the requirements of the solicitation and determined that Lanzo was responsive.
- Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, WASD performed a review of the vendor information in the Business Management Workforce System (BMWS). WASD discovered no adverse information. WASD determined that Lanzo was responsible.
- According to the contract history downloaded from the BMWS on February 3, 2025, Lanzo has been awarded nine (9) contracts from the County with a total value of \$75,722,816 since August 2020.
- Lanzo has 42 evaluations in the ISD Capital Improvement Information System (CIIS) with a rating of 3.5 out of a possible 4.0 maximum.

WASD has concluded that the apparent lowest bidder, Lanzo, is both responsive and responsible. The total bid of \$23,742,340.00 is found to be appropriate for the scope of work. Therefore, it is recommended that Contract S-20331 be awarded to Lanzo for a total compensation amount of \$23,742,340.00, with a total Contract period of 540 days.

Good Afternoon,

The Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department is declaring an emergency, wherein swift action is necessary, to prevent detrimental impacts to the health and safety of the public.

On the evening of Wednesday 10/23/24, a berm for the northern sludge lagoon at the Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant failed. This lagoon is one of two lagoons available for the disposal of lime residuals onsite - the southern lagoon is currently at capacity and is unable to accept lime residuals. Thus, the breach of the berm for the northern lagoon created a condition whereby sludge and backwash water could not be disposed of within the Alex Orr Water Treatment Plant.

The plant continued to operate and backwash water was routed to the influent of the treatment process on or around Friday 10/25/24. However, as a direct consequence of high solids concentration water being introduced into the treatment process, a measurable effect on the turbidity of filtered water was exhibited. In order to continue effective treatment operations, operational redundancy and flexibility will be required.

Given the criticality of the infrastructure and the need for redundancy to ensure the continued supply of safe and reliable drinking water, an emergency contract is needed. The contractor will dredge the southern lagoon, establish new berms within the existing lagoons to ensure adequate redundancy, and install new drives for the seven (7) softening units that will increase the resilience of the treatment process. The contract will also repair or replace an existing sludge line to dispose of lime residuals within the southern lagoon and remove solids accumulated in the chlorine contact basin. All ancillary work for a complete and functional installation will be included. This will provide the redundancy and flexibility required to mitigate concerns related to the lagoons, softening process, and backwash water.

Although this contract is being done as an emergency, we will coordinate ahead of time with all agencies that have jurisdiction over the project, including the Department of Health. By declaring this emergency, the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department can continue to provide safe and reliable drinking water while protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the community.
