Subject: Award Recommendation to RF Environmental for Hialeah Filter Backwash Elevated Tank, Contract No. W-16046 for the Hialeah Water Treatment Plant

Executive Summary

This item seeks approval from the Board of County Commissioners (the Board) to award Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Contract No. W-16046, Hialeah Filter Backwash Elevated Tank (the Contract), to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, RF Environmental Services, Inc. (RF Environmental), for a total amount of \$6,160,980.00 and a Contract period of 561 days.

As part of this project, a new 80-foot elevated water tank will be installed at the Hialeah Water Treatment Plant (Hialeah WTP) to support filter backwash operations (the Project). The tank will be able to store water used to clean the plant's filter and will connect to the existing 24-inch backwash pipe. The Project will also include the installation of two new flow modulating valves and a magnetic flow meter to help manage and measure flow.

Backwashing is an integral part of the water treatment operation that helps remove dirt, chemicals and other particles from the filters and stops any buildup of unwanted materials. Since demolition of the elevated tank at the Hialeah WTP in 2005, the filters are being backwashed using a single speed Byron Jackson vertical turbine pump and a manually operated open/close valve. The current backwash protocol does not include varying backwash rates or standardized duration. By adding a new elevated water tank, the Hialeah WTP will have a stronger and faster water flow, which will provide higher filter backwash water flow rates to improve quality and time efficiency in the filter backwash process. This Contract will directly improve the performance of the Hialeah WTP by upgrading outdated infrastructure, increasing operational efficiency, and reducing the risk of service disruptions.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve a competitive award of Contract W-16046 to RF Environmental in the amount of \$6,160,980.00 and a total Contract period of 561 days.

Scope

The Contract will be performed at the Hialeah WTP, located at 700 W 2nd Ave., Hialeah, Florida 33010, in District 6, which is represented by Commissioner Natalie Milian Orbis.

Delegated Authority

Upon Board approval, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee may exercise all provisions, including the termination provisions, within the Contract. In addition, if approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will manage this Contract pursuant to section 2-8.2.12 of Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, (the WASD Acceleration Ordinance), which delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to, among other things, negotiate and settle claims and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount, subject to ratification by the Board.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact to the County is \$6,160,980.00, inclusive of the Inspector General (IG) Fee, which WASD has determined to be fair and reasonable. The Project is in WASD's FY 2024-2025 Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan. Funding will be provided from Capital Program # 9650041 Water Reset Program – Water Treatment Plant – Hialeah/Preston Improvements, Volume 3, Page 111.

The funding sources are: Future WASD Revenue Bonds, WASD Revenue Bonds Sold, and Water Connection Charges. None of the funding sources include General Obligation Bond (GOB) or Art in Public Places funding. The General Fund will not be impacted.

- The life expectancy of the Project is seventy (70) years.
- Operations Cost Impact / Funding: \$25,000.00. The funding source for the operating impact is WASD Operating Revenues.
- Maintenance Cost Impact / Funding: \$120,000.00. The funding source for the maintenance impact is WASD Operating Revenues.

Vendor Selection & Track Record

On March 5, 2025, WASD received and opened two (2) bids in response to the January 16, 2025, advertisement for an open competitive solicitation for the Contract.

The following due diligence was performed, and RF Environmental was determined to be the lowest bidder:

- Because contract measures were assigned, the two (2) lowest bids were forwarded to the Office of Small Business Development (SBD) for a Compliance Review. RF Environmental, a non-certified Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Goods and Services (G&S) firm, submitted the required Utilization Plan (UP) committing to utilize Drone Sky Visuals LLC, a certified SBE-G&S firm, to provide aerial photography and videography services; Hadonne Corp. to provide mapping, geographical information system (GIS) services, and miscellaneous services; and Thunder Demolition, Inc. to provide hauling services in order to satisfy the 1.00% SBE-G&S subcontractor goal. The subcontractors confirmed their participation via the Business Management Workforce System (BMWS) in agreement with the measure. RF Environmental has, therefore, satisfied the Contract's 1.00% SBE-G&S subcontractor goal and is in compliance with the overall Small Business measure established for this Contract. The Project Worksheet and the SBD Compliance Review letter are attached to this memo as Exhibit A and Exhibit B, respectively.
- The Engineer of Record Black & Veatch (EOR) reviewed the bid submission and on April 7, 2025, determined that the lowest bid was acceptable as submitted and that RF Environmental satisfied the requirements of the solicitation. The EOR's letter is attached hereto as Exhibit C.
- Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, on April 28, 2025, WASD performed a review of the vendor information in BMWS and discovered no adverse information.
- According to the contract history downloaded from BMWS on April 28, 2025, RF Environmental has been awarded one (1) contract in the amount of \$4,362,930.00 from the County in the last five (5) years.

- RF Environmental has one (1) evaluation in the ISD Capital Improvement Information System (CIIS), with a rating of 3.7 out of a possible 4.0 maximum.

Although the EOR estimate is \$4,625,000.00, approximately 33% below the total bid amount of \$6,160,980.00 submitted by RF Environmental, the EOR confirmed that the bid submitted by RF Environmental is reasonable and recommended that WASD proceed with the Contract award. See Exhibit C. The EOR explained that the amount of risk the Project entails is higher than anticipated due to the Project location, nature of work, and current market conditions affecting materials and equipment. Therefore, WASD recommends that Contract W-16046 be awarded to RF Environmental for a total compensation amount of \$6,160,980.00, with a total Contract period of 561 days, which includes 450 days to Substantial Completion, 510 days to Final Completion, and a 51 day time allowance.

The proposed Contract, signed by RF Environmental, is attached hereto as Exhibit D. There are no protests to this award.

WASD Contract Monitor

WASD's Deputy Director of Planning, Regulatory Compliance and Capital Infrastructure, Marisela Aranguiz-Cueto, P.E., will oversee the implementation of the Contract.

Background

Backwashing is an integral part of the operation and routine maintenance of granular media filters in drinking water treatment facilities. Filter Backwashing removes most of the retained particulate material from the filter bed, prevent development of undesirable chemical or biological deposits on the filter media, and prepare the filter media for the next filter run. Since demolition of previous elevated tank in 2005, the filters have been backwashed using a single speed Byron Jackson vertical turbine pump and a manually operated open/close valve. The current backwash protocol does not include varying backwash rates or standardized duration. Additionally, the current Byron Jackson vertical turbine pump does not provide the flowrates required to achieve full bed expansion of the filters during backwash. The new elevated backwash storage tank will provide higher filter backwash water flow rates to improve quality and time efficiency in the filter backwash process.

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into on the ____ day of _____, 2025, by and between Miami-Dade County, Florida, acting by and through the Office of the Mayor, party of the first part (hereinafter sometimes called the "County"), and RF Environmental Service, Inc., party of the second part (hereinafter sometimes called "Contractor");

WITNESSETH

That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, mutually agree as follows, to wit:

1. That the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment and perform all work in the manner and form provided by the Contract Documents covering the Project of the County known and identified as

Hialeah Filter Backwash Elevated Tank Contract No. W-16046

for the aggregate amount reflected by the Proposal, said aggregate amount being **Six Million One Hundred Sixty Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty Dollars and 00 Cents (U.S. Dollars) \$6,160,980.00.**

2. That the Contractor shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract on a day to be specified in a written order issued by the Engineer and shall fully complete all work hereunder within the time or times stated in the Proposal.

3. That the County shall pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this Contract, in lawful money of the United States, and subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the total amount of the Proposal as set forth above at the times and in a manner stated in the General Contract Conditions of the Contract Documents.

4. It is further mutually agreed that if at any time after the execution of this Contract, Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the County shall deem the surety upon such bonds to be unsatisfactory, or if for any reason such bond shall become inadequate to cover the performance of the work, the Contractor shall at its own expense, within five (5) days after the receipt of notice from the County to do so, furnish an additional bond or bonds in such form and amount and with such surety or sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the Contractor shall be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional security shall have been furnished in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.

5. The "Contract Documents" are hereby defined as the Advertisement for Bids, Questionnaire, Instruction to Bidders, Proposal, Certified Resolution for Proposal and Bid Form, Bid Bond, all forms submitted pre and post award, including, without limitation, Miami-Dade County Vendor Affidavits Form, Sworn Statement – Public Entity Crimes, Clearinghouse Affidavit, Job Order Request form, and the Small Business Enterprise Programs Participation Provisions and Forms (if applicable), this Contract, Certified Resolution for Contract and Performance and Payment Bond, Performance and Payment Bond, Standard Construction General Contract Conditions, revised August 1, 2023, the Technical Specifications, Plans and Drawings designated in the specifications, all Technical Appendices, all Addenda, Water & Sewer Department Special Provisions, Change Orders to the Contract, Notice to Proceed, Referenced Codes and Standards, Warranties and Guarantees, all related correspondence, field notes, logs, and other documents.

CONTRACT

The Standard Construction General Contract Conditions of said Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein. The Contract Documents are complementary, so that a recital in one is tantamount to a recital in all, and the Contractor specifically acknowledges that it has read and understands all of said Contract Documents.

6. The various indemnities of the Contractor contained in the Contract Documents indemnifying the County from liability for damages to persons or property caused by acts, omissions, or defaults in the performance of the Contract Documents shall have a monetary limitation of the larger of the following: \$1,000,000.00, or the entire amount of the Contract.

7. The County retains the right to audit any and all information regarding this Contract as described in the Standard Construction General Contract Conditions, Article 12 G (Miscellaneous Provisions – Audit Rights)

8. Notwithstanding and prevailing over any other provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, the County Mayor or his designee, may exercise the provisions of Section 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed 10 percent of the base contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to emergency actions impacting remediation, public safety, health requirements or recovery from natural disaster and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this Contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (5), the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's award and execution of this Contract is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners. If the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's action is not ratified, and such legislative action becomes final, this Contract shall be deemed terminated without further notice. In such event, the Contractor shall not be entitled to recovery of any lost profits or other consequential or indirect damages. However, the Contractor is eligible for payment for any work done prior to failure of the ratification, in accordance with General Contract Conditions Article on Termination for Convenience.

9. "Contract Execution Date" means the date of the last signature on this contract.

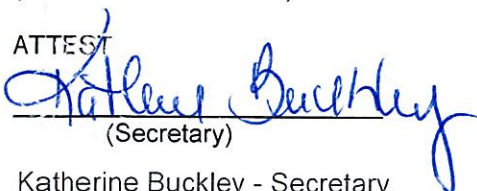

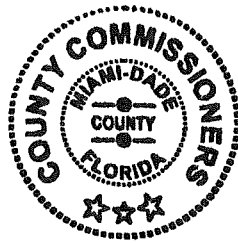
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purpose outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby awards Contract No. W-16046, Hialeah Filter Backwash Elevated Tank, in substantially the form attached to the accompanying memorandum as Exhibit D, to RF Environmental Services, Inc. for a total contract amount of \$6,160,980.00 and a total contract period of 561 calendar days. The Board also authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee: (1) to use the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to manage the Contract; (2) to execute the Contract for and on behalf of the County; and (3) to exercise the termination and other provisions contained within the Contract.

The Chairperson thereupon declared this resolution duly passed and adopted this 16th day of July, 2025. This resolution shall become effective upon the earlier of (1) 10 days after the date of its adoption unless vetoed by the County Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board, or (2) approval by the County Mayor of this resolution and the filing of this approval with the Clerk of the Board.
