Subject: Request for Additional Expenditure to Contract for EZ-IO Intraosseous Infusion
Systems and Related Items

Resolution No. R-966-25

Summary

This item is for additional expenditure authority for the purchase of EZ-IO intraosseous infusion systems and related parts for the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department (MDFR). The contract provides for the purchase of intraosseous infusion systems and related parts, accessories, disposables, and ongoing training. These devices are used by MDFR's first responders to achieve fast, reliable vascular access in emergency situations and have been integrated into the department's medical protocols. The additional expenditure authority will allow MDFR to continue uninterrupted access to these life-saving devices and associated supplies.

The equipment is now being used as the first-line intervention in cardiac arrest protocols, hence additional expenditure authority is being requested due to higher usage. Additionally, there has been an increase in training related to the use of these devices which is further expected to drive usage upward. The increased demand for these products was not foreseen during the original funding assessment for this contract.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve additional expenditure authority in the amount of \$300,000 for *Contract SS-10241, EZ-IO Intraosseous Infusion Systems and Related Items*, for MDFR.

Background

This sole source contract was established on May 2, 2023, by the Board via Resolution No. R-423-23 in the amount of \$1,670,000 to Teleflex LLC for an initial term of three years with two, one-year options to renew. The contract is currently in the initial term. The contract includes the supply of intraosseous infusion systems and related medical items used in field emergency care by MDFR personnel. These battery-operated devices provide emergency responders with direct access to the bone marrow for injecting life-saving medication, which is often faster and more reliable than traditional intravenous access during critical events.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Delegated Authority

The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation, renewals, or extensions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The contract expires on June 30, 2028, and has a current allocation of \$1,000,000. The remaining options to renew were approved by the Board for \$670,000 under Resolution R-423-23; therefore, the

existing cumulative allocation is \$1,670,000. If this request is approved, the contract will have a modified cumulative allocation of \$1,970,000.
