RESOLUTION NO. R-1223-25

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO PREPARE A PLAN DETAILING POSSIBLE FUNDING MECHANISMS FOR THE STRATEGIC MIAMI AREA RAPID TRANSIT ("SMART") PLAN RAPID TRANSIT CORRIDORS; AND TO PROVIDE A REPORT

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County has consistently ranked amongst the United States cities with the worst traffic congestion; and

WHEREAS, traffic congestion is generally especially heavy during peak rush hour periods, and can be worsened due to traffic accidents, roadwork, and network gridlock; and

WHEREAS, traffic congestion has a negative impact on the quality of life for Miami-Dade County residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2016, the Governing Board of the Miami-Dade Metropolitan Planning Organization, now known as the Transportation Planning Organization ("TPO"), adopted Resolution #06-16 establishing a policy to set as highest priority for the community the advancement of rapid transit corridors and transit supportive projects in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2016, the TPO unanimously adopted Resolution #26-16, which approved the Strategic Miami Area Rapid Transit ("SMART") Plan, an initiative to advance six Rapid Transit Corridors along with a network system of Bus Express Rapid Transit service to implement mass transit projects in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the six SMART Plan Rapid Transit Corridors are the: Beach Corridor, East-West Corridor, Kendall Corridor, North Corridor, Northeast Corridor, and South Dade Transitway (hereinafter the "South Corridor"); and

WHEREAS, on June 7, 2016, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-523-16 endorsing the SMART Plan; and

WHEREAS, Metro Express—Miami-Dade County’s first-all-electric Bus Rapid Transit (“BRT”) service, launched on October 27, 2025, as part of the South Corridor; and

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need to construct the remaining SMART Plan corridors and enhance the mobility of Miami-Dade County residents; and

WHEREAS, enhanced mobility through the construction of the remaining SMART Plan Rapid Transit Corridors will not only improve access to jobs and education, but will also catalyze economic growth, attract new businesses, increase property values, and strengthen Miami-Dade County’s competitiveness as a regional hub for commerce and innovation; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to responsibly advance the SMART Plan corridors as quickly as possible,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to prepare a plan detailing possible funding mechanisms for the SMART Plan Rapid Transit Corridors and to provide this Board with an update on the status of the implementation of the Advanced Traffic Management System as it relates to the synchronization of the traffic signals throughout the County, including the current status of the synchronization with respect to the SMART Plan Rapid Transit Corridors.

Section 2. Further directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to prepare a report regarding the directives in section 1 above within 90 days of the effective date of this resolution and to place the completed report on an agenda of this Board without committee review pursuant to rule 5.06(j) of the Board's Rules of Procedure.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Oliver G. Gilbert, III, and the Co-Sponsors are Commissioner Marleine Bastien, Senator René García and Commissioner Roberto J. Gonzalez. It was offered by Commissioner **Oliver G. Gilbert, III** , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Roberto J. Gonzalez** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
