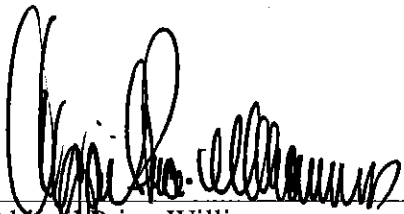

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING THAT PORTION OF NW
1ST AVENUE FROM NW 128TH STREET TO NW 135TH
STREET AS "OFFICER CARLO NARCISSE WAY"

WHEREAS, Louis M.C. (Carlo) Narcisse was born in Saint-Marc, Haiti on November 20, 1949; and

WHEREAS, after attending the College Notre Dame de Lourdes in Port-de-Paix and the College George Marc in Port-Au-Prince, Narcisse migrated to New York in 1970 and joined the U.S. Army at the age of 21; and

WHEREAS, after serving in the Vietnam War, in 1978 Narcisse and his newlywed wife, Nicole, moved to Miami, Florida; and

WHEREAS, in 1980, Narcisse completed his police academy training and became the first Haitian-American officer in the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD), where he then went on to serve with distinction, honor, passion, and courage for 25 years until his retirement in 2005; and

WHEREAS, during his long and illustrious career, Officer Narcisse also dedicated his time and talents to community work and assisting in various disaster relief efforts; and

WHEREAS, Officer Narcisse passed away on April 23, 2018; and

WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife Nicole; his two sons Carl and Daniel, both of whom are also MDPD officers; his daughter Diana; his daughters-in-law Judana and Lily; and his grandchildren Jewel, Cayden, and Carter; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of Officer Narcisse and his distinguished service to his community and his country by codesignating that portion of NW 1st Avenue from NW 128th Street to NW 135th Street as "Officer Carlo Narcisse Way"; and

WHEREAS, NW 1st Avenue from NW 128th Street to NW 135th Street is a County-maintained road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 2,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates that portion of NW 1st Avenue from NW 128th Street to NW 135th Street as "Officer Carlo Narcisse Way".

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Jean Monestime. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
