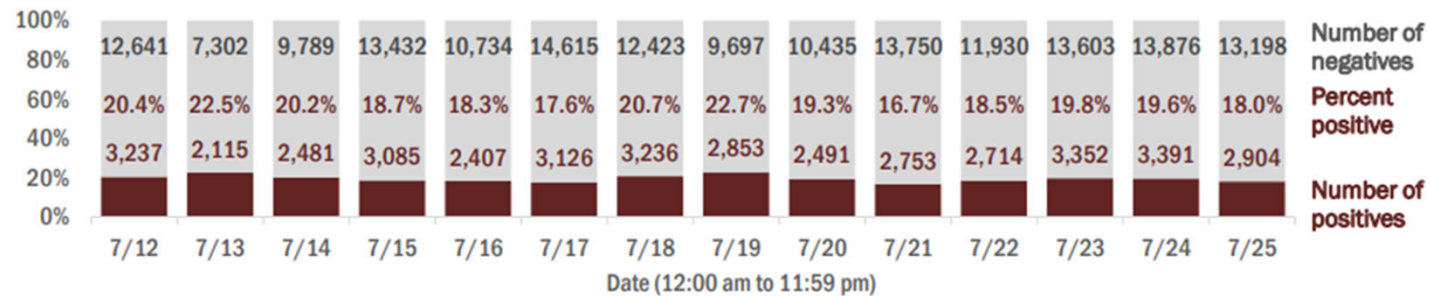

Percent positivity for new cases

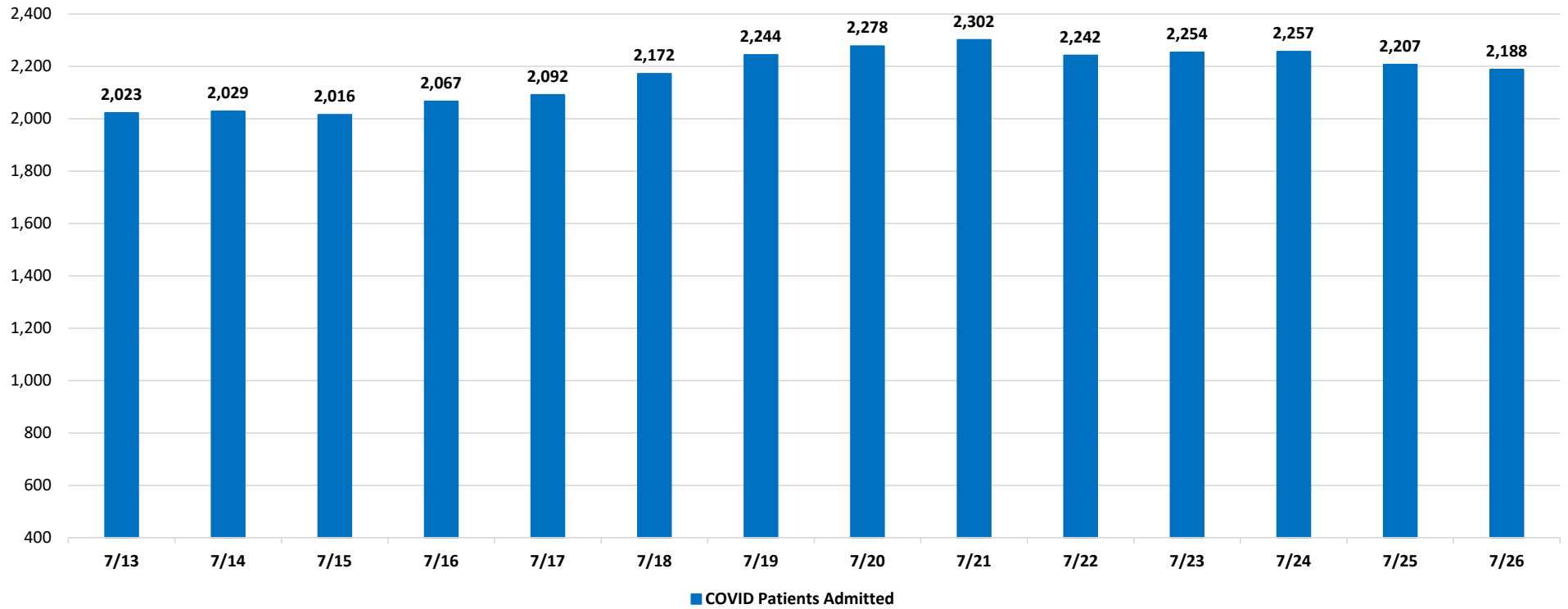

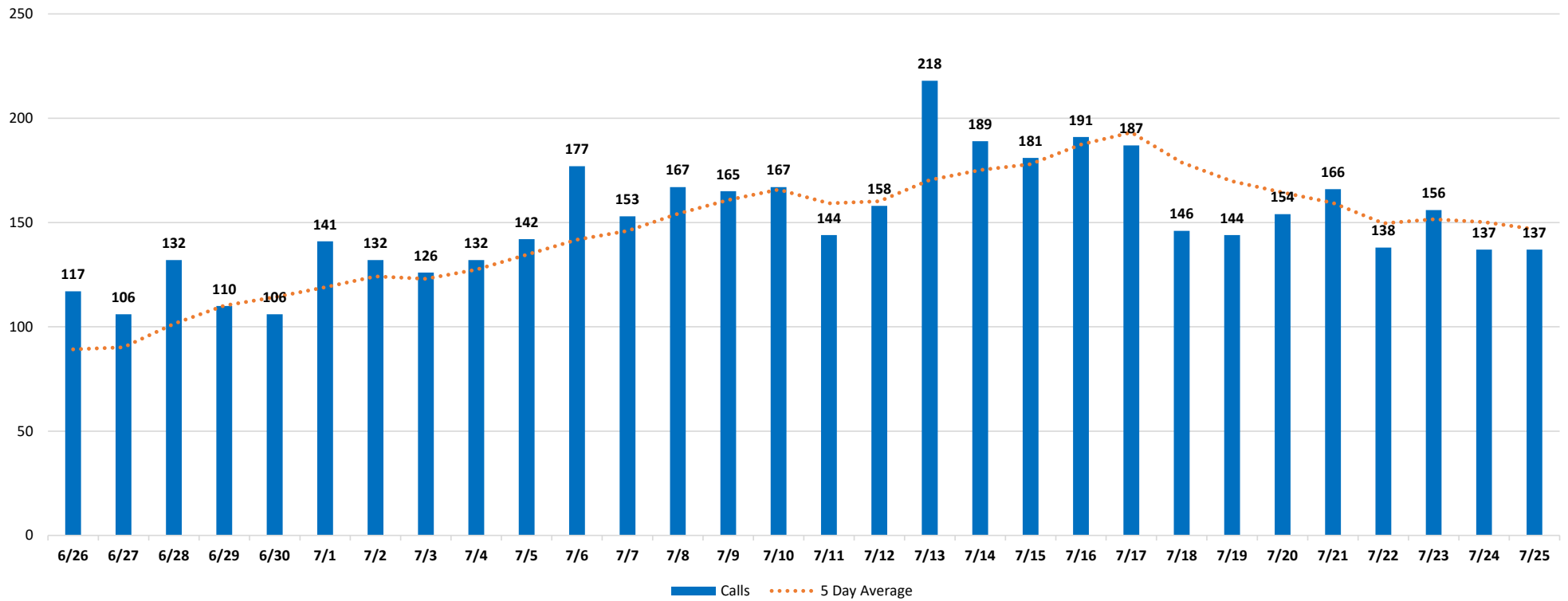

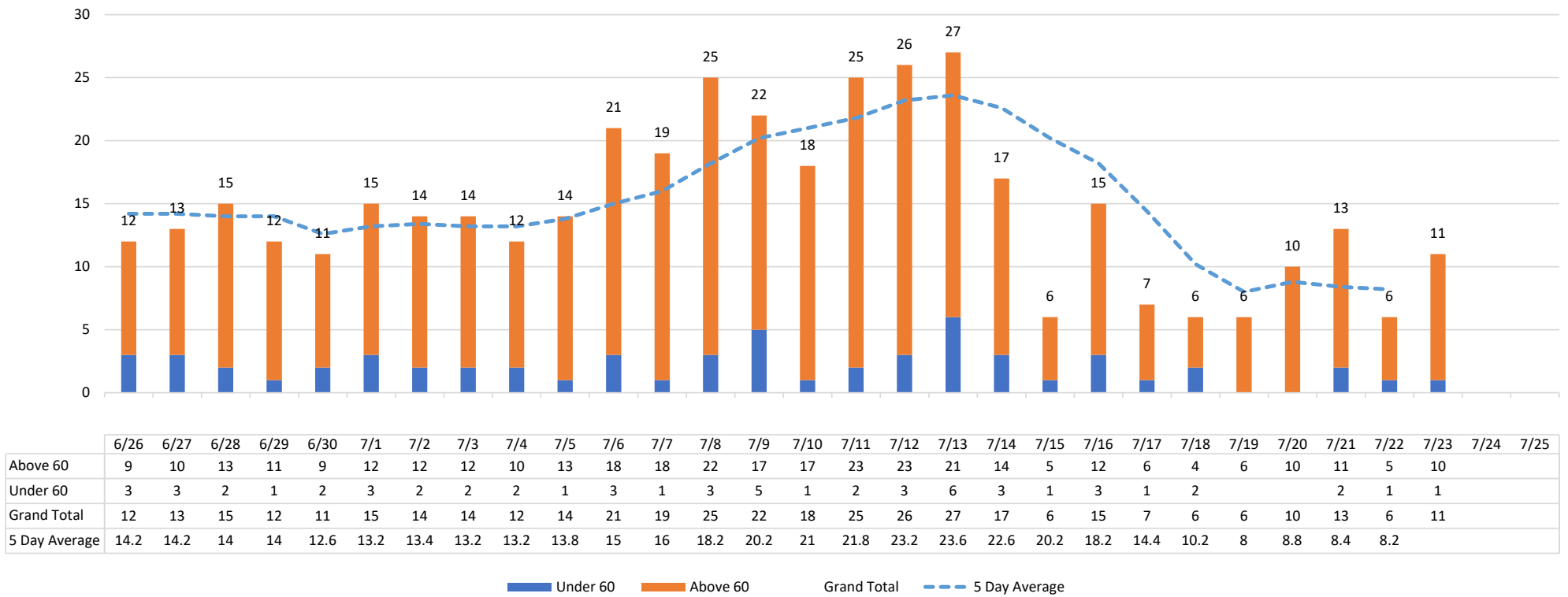
MDFR Suspected COVID-19 Calls
