ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY 101

- Civic Engagement Being involved in your community to help make decisions and improve society. (Compromiso cívico / Angajman Sivik)
- **Democracy** A system of government where people vote for their leaders and have a say in decisions. (*Democracia / Demokrasi*)
- Government The group of people who make laws and decisions for a city, state, or country. (Gobierno / Gouvènman)
- Policy A plan or rule made by the government to solve problems.
 (Política / Politik)


Three Levels of Government in the United States of America

- Local (Miami-Dade County, Constitutional Offices, municipalities)
 - County Mayor and Board of County Commissioners, School Board
 - Examples of responsibilities: Public safety, transportation, zoning, libraries, city roads.
- State (Florida Government)
 - Governor, legislature, state agencies.
 - Examples of responsibilities: higher education, healthcare, state highways.
- Federal Government (United States)
 - President, Congress, Supreme Court, federal agencies.
 - Examples of responsibilities: National security, immigration, economy, interstate highway.

Understanding Local Government: Miami-Dade County

- The most populous county in Florida 2.687 million
 - o (U.S. Census Bureau, 2023)
- 34 incorporated municipalities, cities, towns and villages, as well as to unincorporated communities and neighborhoods
- Strong Mayor Form of Government Mayor serves as an elected Chief Executive along with an elected Board of County Commissioners (BCC) representing 13 districts



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CONTENT PRESENTATION

Recognizing Civic Rights and Responsibilities

- Civic Rights
 - **a.** Voting, free speech, assembly, petitioning government.
 - b. Protections under the U.S. & Florida Constitution (e.g., Sunshine Laws)

Civic Responsibilities

- **a.** Staying informed about issues affecting the community.
- b. Participating in elections at all levels.
- c. Engaging in respectful civil discourse.
- d. Volunteering & public service opportunities (e.g., advisory boards).





- Participate in local leadership programs.




