Subject:	Status Report Regarding Contact Tracing Efforts – Response to Directive No. 201546

This report is being provided in response to a request by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) at the August 4, 2020 Special Board meeting, directing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to provide a written report detailing the County's contact tracing efforts for COVID-19 to date. This report provides a summary of 1) the grant agreement between Miami-Dade County and the State of Florida Department of Health (Grant Agreement) and 2) the CombatCOVID Mobile Application (CombatCOVID).

Contact Tracing Grant Agreement

Early in the pandemic, staff was directed to develop and implement a contact tracing program to serve the residents of Miami-Dade County. After various attempts, and iterations of contact tracing programs, it was determined that the State of Florida was the only entity that had the authority to carry out contact tracing efforts. The most expeditious avenue to increase contact tracers in the County was to supplement the State's contact tracing efforts. To do this, the County executed a Grant Agreement with the Florida Department of Health to provide 250 additional contact tracers in Miami-Dade County through the end of the year in exchange for \$13,963,553 in grant funding. The State's contact tracers communicate with COVID-19 positive individuals to compile a list of everyone that they had contact with in the previous 14 days. Contact tracers then advise those contacts of the potential exposure and encourage them to isolate, monitor for symptoms, and get tested. These supplemental contact tracers will be employed and monitored by the Florida Department of Health and their positions will be funded by the County Grant through an allocation from the County's federal CARES Act funding.

The most recent status reports submitted to the County by the Florida Department of Health pursuant to the Grant Agreement are attached to this report as Attachment 1, and the most recent demographic contact data is attached as Attachment 2.

CombatCOVID Mobile Application

The County has also entered into an agreement with Shield Group Technologies, LLC to procure CombatCOVID, a mobile application that notifies users of potential contact with COVID-19. CombatCOVID utilizes Bluetooth technology to determine if the user is within 13 feet from another CombatCOVID user's device. Bluetooth technology allows both devices to communicate and exchange a digital key. To protect user privacy, this digital key does not have any private or identifying information. If at any point, a user tests positive for COVID-19, the application provides the ability for the user to voluntarily share this information with the application. The application then sends an anonymous notification to the other users that they exchanged digital keys with in the previous 14 days. The notification encourages the recipient to get tested and provides the relevant testing information. This notification does not contain any identifiable information.

The application will be made available in English, Spanish, and Creole. This is the same technology being implemented by Palm Beach County, and Broward County is reviewing its implementation. Having one technological solution for the tri-County area would seamlessly benefit all residents. Additional information regarding the status of the CombatCOVID is attached to this report as Attachment 3.

COVID-19 REPORTING MIAMI-DADE COUNTY GRANT

Per Section V.A.1, <u>The Department's Expanded Initiative</u>, of the grant agreement between the Miami-Dade County and the State of Florida, Department of Health, the Department of Health agreed to add 50 case investigators and 200 contact tracers <u>in addition</u> to the 302 additional contact tracing personnel deployed within Miami-Dade County as of the Effective Date of the Grant Agreement. Furthermore, the Department agreed to maintain this level of personnel through the duration of the grant agreement.

The following tables represent the Department of Health (DOH) funded personnel and enhanced committed via grant funding for contact tracing efforts in Miami-Dade County as <u>August 17, 2020</u>:

* With the contact tracing hub operating seven (7) days a week for twelve-hour per day, more staff are required to ensure Maximus can maintain the staff levels as required by the grant.

Overall, the Department has a total of <u>627</u> personnel working on the contact tracing efforts in Miami-Dade County.

COVID-19 REPORTING MIAMI-DADE COUNTY GRANT

GRANT EXPENDITURES

On August 6, 2020, DOH issued a purchase order, B7CB59, to Maximus for the services of fifty (50) case investigators and two hundred (200) contact to fulfill the Department's obligation under the grant agreement. The total amount billable under the purchase order is \$13,892,604.00 and will cover a period of August 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021.

As of the execution date of the grant agreement on July 9, 2020, the costs for all additional personnel deployed to Miami-Dade in excess of the 302 personnel will be covered through the Department's existing purchase order with Maximus. Thus, Miami-Dade will not be billed for services provided during the period of July 9, 2020 through July 31, 2020. Furthermore, the Department will bill Miami-Dade monthly
