Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces

Milestones for Ludlam Trail

- Spring 2015: Charrette Process & Public Engagement Meetings
- April 2015: BCC Directs staff to prepare a CDMP application via Resolution R-350-15
- Fall 2015: Public Hearings for CDMP application
- July 2017: BCC approves CDMP amendment and adopted Ordinance No. 17-54. establishing land use within the corridor for recreational tail segments and three development node areas
- June 2018: Initiated the PD&E study to fulfill NEPA requirement
- December 2018: Miami-Dade County Parks, Recreation and Open Space Department completes
 purchase of the Ludlam Trail corridor from FEC, including trail easements through development node
 areas, via Advanced Acquisition process (meaning prior to completion of NEPA)
- January 2019: BCC approved Z-18-052 re-zoning 59-acres of land from SW 8th Street to SE 80th Street within former FEC railroad corridor to the Corridor District classification, establishing a new zoning district classification in Miami-Dade County
- November 2020: Public Information Meeting as a part of the PD&E/NEPA process




No-Build Alternative:


Build Alternative:

Project alternatives that require reconstruction or widening of existing facilities or building a new facility in a new location consistent with the project's purpose and need.


Typical Engineering Cross Sections - Bicycle & Pedestrian Path (Separated)

- State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) concurred on 8/27/20



Contamination Screening Evaluation Report

- As per Part 2, Chapter 20, Florida Department of Transportation PD&E manual a CSER is being developed along the project corridor
- Existing and readily available data sources are being inventoried to identify potential sites in the project corridor
- The results of this inventory and evaluation will be part of the decision-making process to select a preferred alternative and will be documented in the CSER and presented at the public hearing

Miami-Dade County Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces is performing a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for the 5.6-mile-long Ludlam Trail Corridor from SW 80th Street to 400 feet north of NW 7th Street, generally following the north-south alignment of what would be NW/SW 69th Avenue, within the former Florida East Coast (FEC) Railway right-of-way. The project is located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County and the City of Miami, Florida.

About Us

The purpose of the Ludlam Trail is to provide a new shared-use trail in Miami-Dade County that will include safe, dedicated, direct pathways for walking, running, and cycling; to encourage active lifestyles and the use of green, non-motorized modes of transportation; and to enhance overall connectivity and accessibility between schools, parks, transit stops and residences, workplaces and shopping.

The proposed project supports the vision to provide an interconnected trail system offering transportation alternatives and reducing traffic congestion for a livable, sustainable County. Ludlam Trail will be a vital component of a seamless network of future greenway trails and water trails connecting to the Metrorail Dadeland North Station to the south and to other planned trails including The Underline/East Coast Greenway, South Dade Trail, Snapper Creek Trail, East/West Trail and Merrick Trail. It will enhance mobility and strengthen connections to neighboring communities, providing increased opportunities for economic development.




Critical Link in the Miami Loop













