
## TROPICAL HARDWOOD HAMMOCK



- Characterized by an dense canopy of broad-leafed trees that creates a lush, shady, humid environment
- Has a limestone substrate, which gradually erodes away to form solution holes in the ground that fill with water during the rainy season and protect the area from fires
- **3** Most of Florida's tropical hardwood hammocks have been lost to development and now only occur in south Florida
- 4 You can find tropical hardwood hammocks at Kendall Indian Hammocks Park, the Charles Deering Estate, Bill Sadowski Park, and Matheson Hammock Park
