



Marine Safety Information Bulletin (MSIB) 20-032, Tropical Storm ETA

Weather Advisory
Return to Normal Port Conditions
Time: 1630 / Date: November 9, 2020

The Captain of the Port (COTP) has determined the Miami River, Port of Miami, Port Everglades, Port of Palm Beach, Port of Ft. Pierce, and all remaining terminals and facilities within Sector Miami's area of responsibility are safe for marine traffic and has downgraded its Port Condition to seasonal watch preparedness in accordance with MSIB 20-006. Port of Palm Beach has a draft restriction of 30', per MSIB 20-017, and is also restricted to daylight operations only.

Prohibited Operations: None.

Authorized Operations: All.

Anticipated Future Actions: As of 1630 on November 9, 2020, the Miami River, Port of Miami, Port Everglades, Port of Palm Beach, Port of Ft. Pierce, and all remaining terminals and facilities within Sector Miami's area of responsibility may return to normal operations and seasonal watch preparedness in accordance with MSIB 20-006.

This MSIB applies to the Miami River, Port of Miami, Port Everglades, Port of Palm Beach, Port of Ft. Pierce, and all remaining terminals and facilities within Sector Miami's area of responsibility.
