At 6:15 PM., Ms. Tai Vaz, Immediate Past Chairwoman, called the meeting to order; she welcomed the members and guests.

Ms. Vaz asked the Program Director to verify the quorum. Quorum was established.

MINUTES: Ms. Vaz asked the members to review the Minutes for November 2025 and requested a motion to approve the Minutes. Ms. Taylor Haas moved to approve the November Minutes, Ms. Josephine Gordy seconded, the Board unanimously approved the November Minutes.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Joshua Ho welcomed the Board and the guests to the new year and thanked all for attending AAAB January General Board meeting. He congratulated the board for another year of working tirelessly for our communities and encouraged them to continue the journey for the year 2026. He thanked Ms. Sharon Fine, Past AAAB Chairwoman, for serving on the Asian American Advisory Board – who decided to step down from AAAB due to increased work and family commitment.

Mr. Ho introduced the 2025 -2026 Miami-Dade County Asian American Advisory Board Executive Committee Members and thanked them in advance for their dedication, sacrifice and leadership for our communities:

Important Updates:

30th Anniversary Gala: County Attorney needs to review the contract first before the BCC Chairman or the Chairman's designee signs the contract. And entire amount of the funds to pay for an event needs to be in place before the contract can be signed. So no more paying the deposit to the hotel/venue and then raising money to pay for the balance due or depending on ticket sales to help pay for the balance due. This is because if the board does not have the money to cover the balance due, then the County is responsible for that balance per the contract.

Effective Monday, August 15th, 2025: Board Member Nominees will no longer be required to submit a notarized Oath of Office as a condition of their appointment; Board members who are currently pending due to the outstanding Oath requirement will be placed on their respective boards; and Financial Disclosure, Sexual Harassment Prevention Training, and Ethics Training will still be required of appointees, pursuant to Sec. 2-11.38, R-355-18, and R-189-05 respectively.

Ordinance relating to advice and County Attorney policy recommendations made by County Advisory Boards; creating section 2-11.39.4 of the Code; requiring approval by Board of County Commissioners of advice and policy recommendations made by County Advisory Boards, task forces and citizens' advisory groups prior to implementation thereof.

Commissioner Natalie Milian Orbis, District 6, Prime Sponsor, Commissioner Danielle Cohen Higgins, District 8, Co-sponsor, the revision of the Attendance Requirements and Provide Removal of Absentee Members (Asian American Advisory Board, Elders Affairs Advisory Board, Hispanic Affairs Advisory Board, and LGBTQIA+ Advisory Board:

Notwithstanding any other provision of the Code of Miami-Dade County, a board member shall be automatically removed if, in a given County fiscal year the member is absent from three consecutive meetings or a total of four board meeting, irrespective of the reasons for the absences. If a member fails to comply with such attendance requirements or voluntarily resigns, the member shall forfeit their membership on the board. A member shall be considered absent from a meeting if the member is not physically present for at least 75 percent of the meeting's duration. A member shall also be considered absent from a meeting if the member refrains from voting on any matter for which voting is conducted at the meeting, unless the member is prevented from voting by a conflict of interest. The provisions of the Miami-Dade County Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics Ordinance, as may be amended, are applicable to this board.

County Ethics Code would prohibit AAAB board member from seeking a benefit for their own nonprofit or the nonprofits with which there are employed or are a board member. Namely, Section 2-11.1(g) of the County Ethics Code prohibits board members from using their official position to secure special privileges or exemptions for themselves or others. This would mean that board members could not use their board position to donate to their nonprofit, promote an event, or seek any benefit on behalf of a third party. Additionally, Section 2-11.1(m)(2) of the County Ethics Code, prohibits a County board member either directly or through an associate, from appearing before the County board that he/she serves to make a presentation or seek a benefit on behalf of a third party. Thus, a board member directly seeking a benefit for a third party whether through themselves or by another member of their organization appearing before the board to seek a benefit would also be prohibited.

He reminded the Board to update their calendar for 2026 AAAB General Board Meetings and stressed having a quorum as it is very important for our communities. He informed the Board that he is currently working on reappointments and appointments to AAAB and the board members' patience is very welcome and appreciated.
