SUBJECT: Elevator Owner Responsibilities
Miami-Dade County **Bulletin 2026-06 / June 3, 2026**

This bulletin is intended for all Registered Elevator Companies and elevator personnel operating within the Miami-Dade County jurisdiction.

This bulletin is to advise that Miami-Dade County elevator inspectors are required to use body-worn cameras during elevator inspection activities.

This requirement applies to all elevator inspections performed by County inspectors, including acceptance inspections, periodic inspections, tests, follow-up inspections, complaint inspections, and other field activities conducted as part of the County's elevator inspection responsibilities.

The purpose of the body-worn camera program is to document County inspection activity in the field and to support safety, accountability, consistency, and transparency during inspections. The use of body-worn cameras does not change the applicable inspection requirements, testing procedures, code requirements, or the responsibilities of elevator contractors, mechanics, technicians, owners, or representatives present during an inspection.

Body-worn cameras will be activated in accordance with Department procedures. Generally, recording will begin upon the inspector's arrival at the inspection location and will continue through the inspection activity. For inspections at airports, seaports, governmental facilities, or other controlled-access locations, recording will be handled in accordance with the approved Department SOPs for those facilities.

Contractors and representatives should ensure that their field personnel are aware of this requirement. Refusal to proceed with a scheduled inspection due to the inspector's use of a body-worn camera may result in the inspection being canceled and may be subject to applicable cancellation charges and rescheduling requirements.

The body-worn camera is a County-issued device used by the County inspector in the performance of official duties. It is not intended to record proprietary information beyond what is incidentally observed during the inspection, nor does it alter the scope of the inspection or require additional action by the contractor other than allowing the scheduled inspection to proceed.
