Loan agreement to fund new electrical buildings at wastewater plants

There will be upgrades to the Water and Sewer Department's (WASD) electrical distribution buildings for a more resilient water and sewer system, thanks to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)'s Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act loan program. This \$326 million low-interest loan will provide environmental benefits to the public and enable the wastewater treatment plants to operate continuously during storm events.

Permanent watering restrictions expanded due to drought conditions

Miami-Dade County seeks to promote a water-saving ethic among residents, visitors and businesses, and we should protect one of Earth's most precious resource – water. In order to conserve water, it is important to learn more about our watering restrictions.

Prepare your family for hurricane season

Hurricane season is here, but no need to worry, WASD is stocked and prepared to provide uninterrupted service before, during and after a storm to its customers. There is no need to buy bottled water – our water is safe to drink. Be sure to plan ahead of time for a hurricane.

2020 Census deadline extended until Oct. 31

State and local governments use this information for planning and allocating funds for new school construction, highway safety, infrastructure projects, public transportation systems and many other projects.
