#### I. Welcome/Introductions:

i. Chairman Juan A. Crespi called the Architecture and Engineering (A&E) Advisory Board meeting to order at 10:37 AM. and the Advisory Board members & SBD staff introduced themselves.

#### II. Old Business

#### a. Approval of July 26, 2023, Meeting Minutes

i. It was moved by Ms. Deborah Swain to approve the (A&E) meeting minutes for July 26, 2023. This motion was seconded by Mr. Berrin Tansel, and upon being put to a vote, the motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

#### b. Approval of 2024 Advisory Board meeting dates

i. It was moved by Ms. Deborah Swain to approve the 2024 meeting dates while moving the November meeting date to November 13, 2024. This motion was seconded by Ms. Ivette Argudin, and upon being put to a vote, the motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

#### III. Discussion

#### a. Personal Net Worth (PNW)

- i. Ms. Cummings-Labissiere advised that a proposal of an increase to the Personal Net worth had been presented, but the specific amount was currently undetermined.
- **ii.** Mr. Hartfield provided an overview of the proposed PNW increased changes . He agreed that the rising cost of living necessitates a prompt review of the PNW.
- **iii.** Ms. Deborah Swain highlighted the issue of age discrimination associated with the low PNW, noting as individuals age, they typically accumulate

more wealth. Ms. Swain also pointed out that the PNW unfairly impacted individuals who have saved money. She expressed her full support for increasing or eliminating the PNW. The board was in full agreement with Ms. Swain.

- iv. Mr. Hartfield proposed that a joint meeting be held with the other Small Business Enterprise (SBE) boards to discuss the PNW. He noted that the legislation should be implemented across all boards.
- v. It was moved by Ms. Deborah Swain that the SBE A&E Advisory board recommends that the PNW be completely removed or increased no less than the rate of inflation or double its current value. This motion was seconded by Ms. Ivette Argudin, and upon being put to vote, the motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

#### b. Office of Small Business Development

- Mr. Gary Hartfield informed the board members that on August 31, 2023, the Mayor officially signed off on a memorandum establishing Small Business development as an independent office, known as the Office of Small Business Development.
- ii. He added that while the ultimate objective was to elevate as a department, this was a step towards that goal. The board collectively supports this as a positive move.

#### **IV. SBD Section Reports**

# a. SBE-A&E Business Outreach and Education Report- Lawanda Wright (SBD Section Chief)

- i. Lawanda Wright presented the report for the period of June 1, 2023, to July 31, 2023.
- ii. There were no questions or comments regarding the report.

# b. SBE- A&E Certification Report - Jeanise Cummings-Labossiere (SBD Section Chief)

Ms. Cummings-Labossiere presented the report for the period of June 1, 2023, to July 31, 2023. Ms. Cummings-Labissiere noted that there were no firms that graduated or got denied during this period.

- i. Mr. Juan A. Crespi pointed out that the Equitable Distribution Program (EDP) had experienced an increase, whereas, the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program had not seen similar increases. He stressed the need to explore the findings on the dissimilarities between EDP and SBD program.
- ii. Mr. Crespi also inquired about the complexity of the SBE certification application process. In response, Ms. Labissiere clarified that it was not a complicated process and it was conducted online.

#### c. SBE-A&E - A&E Utilization Report-Rossi Siewnarine (SBD Section Chief)

- i. Mr. Rossi Siewnarine presented the report for the period of June 1, 2023, to July 31, 2023.
- ii. Mr. Rossi Siewnarine reported that in the past four (4) years, there had been a consistent rise in spending within the (Architecture and Engineering) A&E sector.

#### V. Report

#### a. Jackson Health System Report - Kenneth Robertson (JHS)

- i. Mr. Kenneth Robertson presented the report for June 1, 2023, until July 31, 2023. Mr. Robertson noted that during this reporting period Jackson awarded thirteen (13) (Architecture and Engineering) A&E Awards. He noted eight (8) of those projects went to Small Business Enterprise (SBE) primes.
- ii. Mr. Juan Crespi commended the continued high number of (SBE's) receiving awards and the dollar value associated with them and thanked Mr. Robertson for his role in this success.

#### VI. New Business

# a. A&E Taskforce Update - Pablo Valin (Strategic Procurement Department)

- i. Mr. Pablo Valin Strategic Procurement Department (SPD) provided an update on IO 3-39, stating the IO 3-39 had some slight modifications regarding Small Business Development (SBD) and Internal Services Department (ISD) responsibilities. He noted they did receive a final response about the section that allowed changes in key personnel after the submission date under specific circumstances. Mr. Valin stated the revised version was shared with the chairs' office, and once the revisions have been reviewed, it was anticipated to proceed forward.
- ii. Ms. Swain requested for a copy of the most recent draft of the IO 3-39.

#### b. Selection Committee Legislation

- i. Ms. Deborah Swain pointed out that IO 3-34 had an impact on Selection Committees, and there had been changes that the board was not previously informed about. Ms. Swain expressed disappointment at discovering these changes after they had already been implemented.
- ii. Ms. Laurie Johnson advised that the new legislation required a deputy or assistant director for projects of a specific dollar amount. However, she noted the committee structure remained the same for Architecture and Engineering (A&E).

- iii. Mr. Crespi indicated that he would like to be informed about such matters in advance, rather than finding out about the changes after it had already been enacted. Mr. Hartfield advised that Small Business Development was informed after the legislation was already adopted.
- iv. Mr. Hartfield explained that the number of members on the selection committee will be increased when the project exceeds \$10 million dollars.

ORDINANCE RELATING TO SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAMS; AMENDING SECTIONS 2-10.4.01, 2-8.1.1.1.1, 2.8.1.1.1.2, 10-33.02 OF THE CODE OF MIAMIDADE COUNTY, FLORIDA; AMENDING CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS, INCREASING PERSONAL NET WORTH THRESHOLD TO \$2,500,000.00; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County ("County") Small Business Enterprise ("SBE") programs provide business opportunities to certified small businesses, to aid in their growth, development, and contribution to the County and South Florida economies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to sections 2-10.4.01, 2-8.1.1.1.1, and 2-8.1.1.1.2 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Fla. (the "Code"), no firm shall be certified under the Small Business Enterprise Architecture & Engineering (CB-A/E), Small Business Enterprise Services (SBE-Services), or the Small Business Enterprise Goods (SBE-Goods) Programs, respectively, where the personal net worth of any of such firm's owners is more than \$1,500,000.00, exclusive of: (a) the value of the primary residence for which there is a homestead exemption; (b) the value of the business; and (c) funds invested in an individual retirement account ("IRA"), 401k, pension, or other official retirement account; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to section 2-10.33.02 of the Code, no firm shall be certified in the Small Business Enterprise Construction Services ("CSBE") Program where the individual net worth of any of its owners is more than \$1,500,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, on October 18, 2022, this Board adopted Ordinance No. 22-133, amending sections 2-8.1.1.1.1, 2-8.1.1.1.2, 2-10.4.01, and 10-33.02 of the Code, to among other things, create an additional tier to retain mid-level firms from program graduation; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board wishes to amend sections 2-10.4.01, 2-8.1.1.1.1, 2-8.1.1.1.2, and 2-10.33.02 of the Code to increase the personal net worth threshold to \$2,500,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the County will benefit from an increase to the personal net worth threshold which will further extend the ability of firms to become certified SBEs and participate in SBE programs as applicable,

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

**Section 1.** Section 2-10.4.01 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:<sup>1</sup>

# Sec. 2-10.4.01. Small Business Enterprise Architecture and Engineering Program.

- (1) *Title*. This Section shall be referred to as the Miami-Dade County Small Business Enterprise Architecture & Engineering ("CBE" or "CBE-A/E") Program.
- (2) *Definitions*. For purposes of this section:

\* \* \*

P. Firm means any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, association, joint venture or other legal entity permitted by law to practice architecture, engineering, landscape architecture, design-build, and land surveying and mapping services, which has a valid business tax receipt issued by Miami-Dade County at least one [[(1)]] year prior to certification, and an actual place of business in Miami-Dade County, not a Virtual Office. No Firm shall be certified as a CBE-A/E where the personal net worth of any of its owners is more than [[one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000)]]>> \$2,500,000.00<<<, exclusive of: (a) the value of the

Representations as to average gross revenues, personal net worth of owners and payroll shall be subject to audit.

Section 2-8.1.1.1. of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### Sec. 2-8.1.1.1. Small Business Enterprise Services Program.

- (1) *Title*. This section shall be referred to as the Small Business Enterprise Services Program.
- (2) *Definitions*. The following definitions shall apply in this section.

\* \* \*

- 21. Small Business Enterprise ("SBE" or "SBE-Services") means a business entity certified by SBD, providing services, which has a valid business tax receipt issued by Miami-Dade County at least one [[(1)]] year prior to certification, an actual place of business in Miami-Dade County, not a Virtual Office, and whose three year average gross revenues does not exceed the following contracting participation levels:
- (i) Tier 1 \$0 to \$750,000;
- (ii) Tier 2 \$750,000.01 to \$2,000,000;
- (iii) Tier 3 \$2,000,000.01 to \$5,000,000; or
- (iv) Tier 4 \$5,000,000.01 to \$8,000,000.

No firm shall be certified as a SBE where the personal net worth of any of its owners is more than [[one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000)]]>> \$2,500,000.00<<<, exclusive of: (a) the value of the primary residence for which there is a homestead exemption; (b) the value of the business; and (c) funds invested in an individual retirement account ("IRA"), 401k, pension, or other official retirement account. The owner MUST provide information about the terms and restrictions of the account(s) to SBD, and certify that the retirement account(s) is legitimate. Representations as to a business entity's average gross revenues, personal net worth of owners and payroll shall be subject to audit.

**Section 3.** Section 2-8.1.1.1.2 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### Sec. 2-8.1.1.1.2. Small Business Enterprise Goods Program.

- (1) *Title*. This section shall be referred to as the Small Business Enterprise Goods Program.
- (2) *Definitions*. The following definitions shall apply in this section:

\* \* \*

- 22. Small Business Enterprise ("SBE" or "SBE-Goods") means a business entity certified by SBD, providing services, which has a valid business tax receipt issued by Miami-Dade County at least one [[(1)]] year prior to certification, an actual place of business in Miami-Dade County, not a Virtual Office, and whose three year average gross revenues does not exceed the following contracting participation levels:
  - (i) Tier 1 \$0 to \$750,000;
  - (ii) Tier 2 \$750,000.01 to \$2,000,000;
  - (iii) Tier 3 \$2,000,000.01 to \$5,000,000; or
  - (iv) Tier 4 \$5,000,000.01 to \$8,000,000.

The term Small Business Enterprise shall also include a (x) manufacturer with [[one hundred (100)]]>>100<<

employees or less, or (y) wholesaler with [[fifty (50)]]>>50<< employees or less, without regard to gross revenues. A wholesaler or manufacturer must comply with all other requirements of this section to be a certified SBE.

No firm shall be certified as a SBE where the personal net worth of any of its owners is more than [[one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000)]]>>\$2,500,000.00<<<, exclusive of: (a) the value of the primary residence for which there is a homestead exemption; (b) the value of the business; and (c) funds invested in an individual retirement account ("IRA"), 401k, pension, or other official retirement account. The owner MUST provide information about the terms and restrictions of the account(s) to SBD, and certify that the retirement account(s) is legitimate. Representations as to a business entity's average gross revenues, personal net worth of owners and payroll shall be subject to audit.

**Section 4.** Section 10-33.02 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

# Sec. 10-33.02. Small Business Enterprise Construction Services Program.

- (1) Title. This section shall be referred to as the Miami-Dade County Small Business Enterprise Construction Services ("CSBE") Program.
- (2) Definitions. The following definitions shall apply in this section:

\* \*

Small Business Enterprise for Construction Services (CSBE) means a construction related enterprise, including a design-build firm, and any firm providing trades and/or services for the completion of a construction project, as defined in Chapter 10 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, which has an actual place of business in Miami-Dade County and whose average annual gross revenues for the last three [[(3)]] years do not exceed: [[fifteen million dollars

(\$15,000,000.00)]] >>\$15,000,000.00<< for SIC 15 - Building Construction, General Contractors and Operative Builders; [[twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000.00)]] >>\$12,000,000.00<< for SIC 16 - Heavy Construction, other than Building Construction; or [[eight million dollars (\$8,000,000.00)]] >>\$8,000,000.00<< for SIC 17 -Specialty Trade Contractors. CSBEs shall be categorized by the type of construction they perform in accordance with the two-digit Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code, or the six-digit North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), of the Census applicable to such type of construction. A CSBE will graduate out of the program upon notification by SBD that it has exceeded these size limits based on its three-year average annual gross revenues. A certified CSBE that graduates out of the program shall continue to submit financial information as to cumulative gross revenue and bonding capacity to SBD annually for 3 years thereafter in order to further the County's ability to assess the effectiveness of the program.

CSBEs must be certified by SIC or NAICS code, and classified into one [[(1)]] of the four [[(4)]] contracting participation levels. The lack of bonding capacity shall not preclude an applicant from being certified as a CSBE. As part of the certification process, CSBEs must go through a prequalification process which will be used to determine which of the four [[(4)]] contracting participation levels the CSBE will be placed in based on the firm's four [[(4)]] year average gross revenues. The contracting participation levels are as follows:

- 1. Level I—Three-year average gross revenues of \$0.00—\$2,000,000.00;
- 2. Level II—Three-year average gross revenues above \$2,000,000.00 but not exceeding \$5,000,000.00;
- 3. Level III—Three-year average gross revenues above \$5,000,000.00 but not exceeding \$10,000,000.00, or
- 4. Level IV—Three-year average gross revenues above \$10,000,000.00 but not exceeding \$15,000,000.00.

A firm's eligibility to participate in the CSBE program and the contracting participation level at which it will participate shall be determined based on the three-year average gross revenues of the applicant firm in combination with that of all of the firm's affiliates as provided in Appendix A [which can be found in the County

Clerk's office attached to Ordinance Number 97-52]. No firm shall be certified as a CSBE where the individual net worth of any of its owners is more than [[one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000)]>>\\$2,500,000.00, exclusive of: (a) the value of the primary residence for which there is a homestead exemption; (b) the value of the business; and (c) funds invested in an individual retirement account ("IRA"), 401k, pension, or other official retirement account <<. Representations as to average gross revenues, personal net worth of owners and payroll shall be subject to audit.

Section 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 6. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of Section 7. enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.
