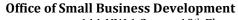

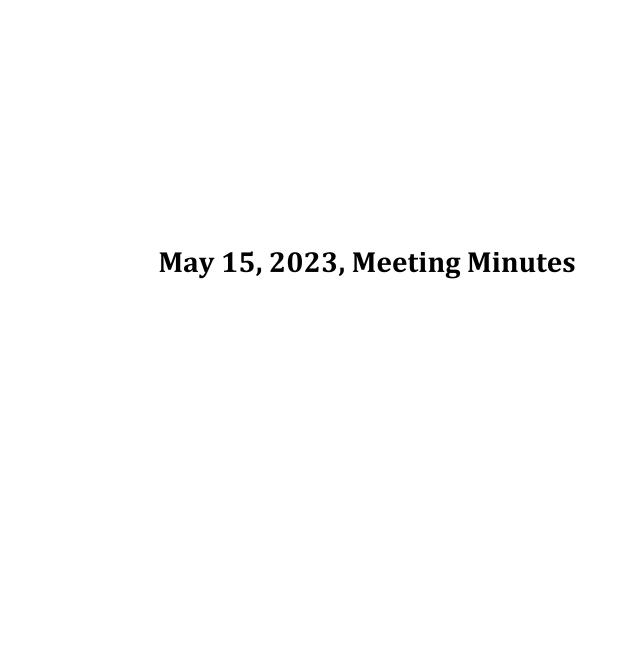

I. Welcome/Introductions – Michou Jean (SBD Section Manager) called the meeting to order at 1:07 PM. William Derrer, the Chairperson, extended a warm welcome to all the Board members and staff present and then proceeded to discuss the agenda.

II. Old Business (15 min)

a. Approval of March 20, 2023, Meeting Minutes

i. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro motioned to approve the meeting minutes and board member Shellie Ransom-Jackson seconded the motion. (Approved 5-0).

III. Discussions

a. Task Log

- i. Pursuant to Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro's inquiry regarding the previously agreed-upon practice of including items from the task log for the Collective Advisory Board in the agenda, Ms. Jean explained that this practice had been temporarily suspended, but assured everyone that all the items listed on the task log would be addressed in the upcoming Collective Advisory Board meeting.
- ii. Chairman Rick Derrer inquired about Dorothy's perspective on the Collective Advisory Board meetings thus far. Dorothy expressed that initially, she was opposed to the idea, but after actively participating in the meetings, she acknowledged that they had been successful. She cited examples such as discussions on prompt payment and local headquarters, which resulted in

effective decisions being reached. Ms. Alfaro informed the staff that the only topic that has not yet been addressed in the meetings is responsible wages.

iii. Dorothy noted the House Bill 346 had undergone amendments. She explained that the bill no longer included the elimination of the small business program, as the provision related to 350 had been removed, and there were no restrictions on responsible wages. Additionally, Ms. Brown-Alfaro stated that House Bill 1383, which impacted 53 occupational licenses in the State of Florida, had been granted an extension. She noted the extension was effective until July 1, 2024, instead of ending on July 1, 2023, overriding the intentions of House Bill 735 and House Bill 917, which aimed to eliminate certain wage aspects.

Ms. Brown-Alfaro informed the attendees that a new bill sponsored by the Senate, known as Senate Bill 892, had removed the language pertaining to minimum wage. She emphasized that the Small Business program related to wages remained unaffected. However, Ms. Brown advised everyone to stay vigilant and remain alert to any potential changes or developments in the future.

iv. Chairman Rick Derrer requested that Dorothy clarify the purpose of the Collective Board meetings.

Dorothy explained that the primary objective of these meetings was to foster a collaborative environment where participants could openly share their ideas and perspectives on various topics, such as prompt payment and change orders. She further explained that the Small Business department had extended invitations to other departments to attend these meetings as well. Dorothy informed the Board that they were currently working on a pilot program, which had been initiated by four other departments, to which this would be the next topic of discussion at the upcoming Collective Board meeting.

v. Chairman Rick Derrer highlighted that the purpose of the Collective Board meetings was to bring together representatives from three different boards to address specific issues in a consolidated and concise manner.

Dorothy expressed the need for closer monitoring of responsible wages, because it tends to increase every year. She pointed out that there was a challenge associated with these increases. Ms. Brown-Alfaro expressed her desire for a revision in this regard, suggesting that when wages increase, small businesses should be able to benefit and leverage that increase for their growth.

- vi. Mr. Gary Hartfield expressed the Board meetings exceeded expectations in terms of the amount of new information learned. He emphasized that the six topics listed on the agenda of the Collective Advisory Board serve as valuable learning tools, and discussions on these subjects continue to deepen over time. Mr. Hartfield specifically noted the importance of responsible wages among these topics. He advised the staff that implementing a pilot program would enhance prompt payment for small businesses, serving as a constructive approach to contractual processes.
- vii. Mr. Hartfield informed the attendees that an emergency meeting would be scheduled in the upcoming weeks to address the pilot program. He stated that Laurie and her team would be responsible for reviewing the contract. Mr. Hartfield explained there would be supplemental provisions, such as federal funding, included in the contract. He emphasized that all members and staff would thoroughly review the contract before taking a vote at the end. Mr. Hartfield emphasized that Ms. Johnson would oversee this process.
- viii. In response to Dorothy inquiry about the timeframe for the prompt payment process, and whether it would take approximately 14 days, Mr. Hartfield noted the goal for the prompt payment process was to issue payments to firms every two weeks. He explained that this would be achieved by having the prime submit the payment to the county, ensuring that firms receive payment within a reasonable timeframe.

Pursuant to Ms. Hamler's question regarding which departments would initiate the pilot program, Mr. Hartfield stated the two departments launching the pilot program would be ISD and Seaport.

Mr. Rossi Siewnarine shared that out of the six components, certain items such as prompt payment, local headquarters, set asides, and legacy contracts had already been discussed. He mentioned that they had started discussing set-asides, legacy contracts, and bid waivers, as part of one component. However, Mr. Siewnarine noted the topics of implementation and accountability remained to be discussed.

IV. SBD Section Reports

- a. SBE Construction Business Outreach and Education (Lawanda Wright-Robinson)
 - i. The report was presented by Lawanda Wright-Robinson.
- ii. The report collected data from February 1, 2023, to March 31, 2023.

iii. Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro stressed the need for a standardized contract for prime contractors.

Mr. Hartfield clarified that the County does not directly involve itself in the contractual agreements between primes and subcontractors. He explained the contract was solely between the County and the prime contractor. Mr. Hartfield further elaborated that there would be a memorandum from the mayor to the department directors. He noted this memorandum would inform the directors going forward that the County contract for construction, regardless of whether it was for 740, 7360, or capital improvement projects, should be followed. He also noted that there would be amendments attached to the contracts as not all contracts were identical.

Ms. Hamler informed Mr. Hartfield that training would be necessary once the memorandum comes into effect.

b. SBE - Construction Certification Report (Jeanise Cummings-Labossiere)

- i. The report was presented by Jeanise Cummings-Labossiere (SBD Section Chief).
- ii. The report collected data from February 1 2023, to March 31, 2023.

c. SBE- Construction Project Review & Analysis (Laurie Johnson)

- i. The report was presented by Laurie Johnson (SBD Section Chief).
- ii. The report collected data from February 1, 2022, to March 31, 2023.

d. SBE - Construction Utilization Report (Rossi Siewnarine)

- i. The report was presented by Rossi Siewnarine (SBD Section Chief).
- ii. The report collected data from February 1, 2022, to March 31, 2023.
- iii. Pursuant to Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro's inquiry about the graph section on Table 3, specifically regarding the five (5) percent awarded to Black Americans, Mr. Siewnarine confirmed the five (5) percent was the correct figure. He further clarified that table three (3) represented the awards, whereas table 4 provided a breakdown of the payments made.

e. Construction Management Reporting

a. Miscellaneous Construction Contract MCC- 8-10 (MCM Corporation)

- i. The report was presented by Ginny Mirabel on behalf of MCM Corporation.
- ii. Ms. Mirabel announced that the program was completed on September 1, 2022. She noted there were three remaining jobs, two of which were awaiting final inspections in order to be completed and closed out within

the next month or so. Additionally, she stated the last job had been transferred in. Ms. Mirabel stated that their management goal was set at 18 percent, but they have successfully achieved a rate of 19.7 percent, surpassing their initial target.

iii. Pursuant to Ms. Hamler inquiry about the ethnicity representation throughout the process, Ms. Mirabel stated that she does not have the report readily available. She noted the ethnic breakdown was identical to the MCC 9-18 report. However, Ms. Hamler assured Ms. Hamler that she would be able to provide the specific report via email shortly.

V. Construction Management Reporting

a. Miscellaneous Construction Contract MCC- 9-18 (MCM Corporation)

- iv. The report was presented by Ginny Mirabel on behalf of MCM Corporation. Ms. Mirabel conveyed that there had been a total of 13 projects. She mentioned that these projects account for 18 percent of the overall goal.
- v. Ms. Brown-Alfaro questioned whether Ms. Mirabel felt confident that MCO would meet their goal despite the CEO lagging behind.
- vi. Ms. Mirabel expressed her confidence in meeting the goal, citing ongoing negotiations as a contributing factor. She also noted the report did not indicate any increase in desk numbers, implying that they have not encountered any significant obstacles that would hinder their progress.
- vii. Ms. Mirabel mentioned that they had to make some employee changes, but it did not affect the figures.

b. Project B- Jackson West Medical Center (W.G. Yates Construction)

i. Item deferred.

c. Project E- Jackson South Medical Center (Turner Construction Company)

- i. The report was presented by Jordyn Hopkins on behalf of Turner Construction.
- ii. The contracted goal was 32.7 percent, and their achieved goals was 30.71 percent. She added that they had a discrepancy, in which the dollar value was currently less now.
- iii. Ms. Alice noted that the prime contractor Turner had undertaken a setaside work for the roof, which was valued at around 2 million dollars. She explained that the project faced several extensions, and they were occupied with the work. Ms. Hidalgo-Gato added that later on, the prime

contractor withdrew from the job. Alice stated that they had been excused from that portion of the goal, as the project was subsequently bid out to the smallest bidder.

Project F- Christine E. Lynn Rehabilitation Hospital (Turner Construction)

- i. The report was presented by Jordyn Hopkins on behalf of Turner Construction.
- ii. The contracted goal was 34.05% and their achieved goals was 42.3%.

DTC Vertical Expansion (Turner Construction Company)

- i. The report was presented by Jordyn Hopkins on behalf of Turner Construction.
- ii. The contracted goal was 21.6% and their achieved goals was 19.99%.
- iii. Ms. Hopkins stated that they will meet their goal as there are a few payments remaining.

Cruise Terminal F Expansion (Lemartec Corporation)

ii. Item deferred.

Design, Build, Finance, Operate, Maintain Civil and Probate Courthouse (Plenary Justice Miami LLC)

i. The report was presented by Armando Perez.

Mr. Armando Perez stated that the project is almost finished. He added that they have completed the concrete shell, and now they are working on the interiors, He added that the construction goal is 13.11% and their achieved goal is currently 15.95%.

Grove Central Mixed-Use (Juneau Construction)

i. Item deferred.

MSC Cruise Terminal (Fincantieri Infrastructure Florida)

- i. The report was presented by Dylan Wallace.
- ii. Mr. Wallace mentioned that they have exceeded all their goals by 55% completion.

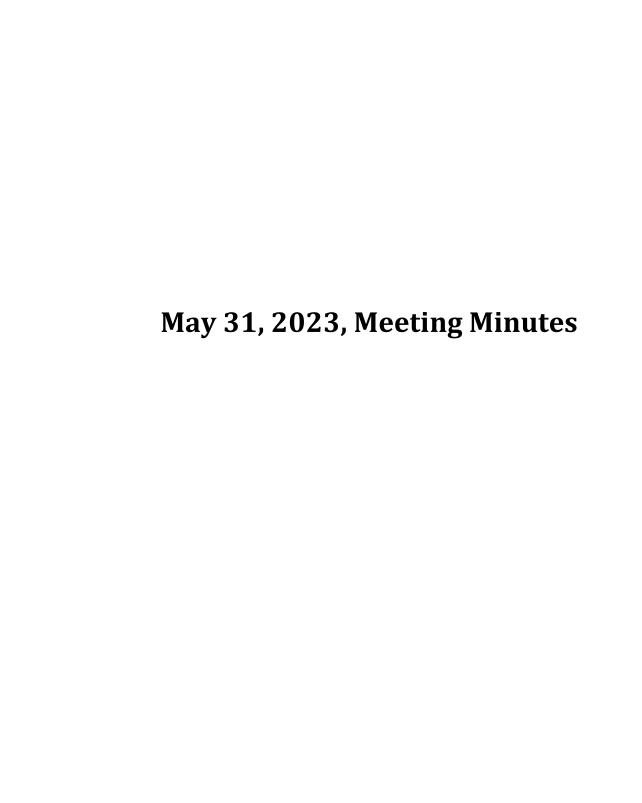

Welcome/Introductions - Vice-Chair Elsie K. Hamler extended a warm welcome I. to all the members of the Board and the staff and then moved on to discuss the agenda.

a. Overview of the Pilot Program

- i. Director Gary T. Hartfield provided a summary of the meeting's agenda, acknowledging Laurie Johnson's exceptional efforts in reaching this stage in finalizing the Pilot Program Document. He informed everyone that SBD wanted input from the SBE Construction Board regarding the Pilot Program Construction Prompt payment in addition to the Standard Construction General Contract Condition Draft.
- ii. Director Gary Hartfield advised that the Internal Services Department (ISD) has identified projects that can be utilized in the program and has hired workers to ensure the fluency of the process of payments. They've projected two (2) payments per month, two (2) weeks apart. He added that the county has agreed to do the pencil draft to expedite the process of payments to vendors.

II. **Discussions**

a. Executive Summary

i. Laurie Johnson presented an overview of the Resolution pertaining to the Standard Construction General Condition. She mentioned that the resolution had been adopted back in 2012. Ms. Johnson further explained that the draft

being presented was a revised version of the original document. Additionally, she informed the board members that she would make sure to provide them with a copy of the original document.

- ii. Gary Hartfield offered some background information regarding the documents that were being presented.
 - He expressed the County's intent was to utilize the presented document as a standardized contract that can be modified for specific projects. Gary Hartfield highlighted the benefits of the executive summary, emphasizing that it enables them to quickly identify any amended language and make necessary observations.
- iii. Ms. Hamler expressed her interest in prioritizing the expanded sections, specifically Sections 8, 9, 10, and 11. The board members unanimously agreed to her proposal.
- iv. During the meeting, Mr. Munilla raised a question regarding the scope of the document and its applicability to all County Contracts. In response, Director Hartfield clarified that the document is intended for all MCC (Miami-Dade County) contracts, and the recommendation is for its utilization in all Capital Construction contracts throughout the county.

b. Pilot Program Construction Prompt Payment

- i. Ms. Brown-Alfaro commended the staff for their efforts in processing invoices twice a month, emphasizing that this payment plan would greatly benefit small businesses' cash flow. She then raised a question regarding item number three (3), which pertains to mobilization. Ms. Brown-Alfaro asked whether a standard percentage of 5% for mobilization would be implemented across the board. In response, Ms. Johnson clarified that there is currently no specific percentage designated for mobilization. Mr. Houston inquired about the situation if the cost exceeds the 5% threshold. He suggested that leaving it without a fixed percentage but based on actual cost might be a prudent approach to ensure adequate coverage of expenses, as costs can vary among companies.
- ii. Dorothy asked a question regarding "badging." In response, Ms. Hamler suggested that the topic of badging should be included under the "etc." category. Ms. Ransom-Jackson clarified that the presented document itemizes mobilization costs into separate line items. However, whether these line items are listed separately or consolidated, the total cost should remain the same. She further explained that the main challenge arises from the new requirement to provide backup documentation, which was not previously in

place. This change in backup requirements has resulted in a different backlog of tasks.

- iii. Jeovanni Tarafa drew attention to item number four (4), which stated that both the prime contractor and subcontractor would be permitted to have their own mobilization.
- iv. Dorothy proposed to the board that they maintain the language as it is, considering that it is a pilot program. She suggested that any flaws or issues could be addressed and rectified if necessary.
- v. Alejandro Munilla sought clarification on the mobilization process specifically related to a Water and Sewer contract. In response, Laurie Johnson explained that the pilot program currently includes Seaport and Internal Services departments, and adjustments will be made as other departments are included. Gary Hartfield further mentioned that the SBD (specific document or organization name) intends to collaborate with other departments using this process but would like to initiate the project.
- vi. Jeovanni Tarafa proposed renaming "Mobilization" to "Upfront General Conditions Cost". The board members unanimously agreed with this suggestion.
- vii. Ms. Hamler raised a question regarding number five (5), which pertained to the "Steps for SBE Prime Pay Application." She asked if there was a specific timeframe for steps E and F. Ms. Brown-Alfaro clarified that the contact administrators would progress with the packages while permitting contractors to make necessary corrections or provide any missing documentation. Ms. Laurie Johnson added that any delays at that stage would likely be caused by the contractors themselves, as the department would be moving the invoice forward while giving contractors an opportunity to address any issues. Ms. Brown-Alfaro concurred with Ms. Johnson's explanation.
- viii. Mr. Munilla pointed out a concern regarding the potential challenge of obtaining lien releases twice a month in the pilot program. Mr. Houston suggested that while billing twice per month may not be necessary, having an additional billing date two weeks later would provide a buffer in case of any issues or missed deadlines. Mr. Hartfield added that the pilot program involves the county taking on the responsibility of receiving and reviewing payments biweekly, along with requiring prime contractors to submit biweekly payments.
- ix. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro requested clarification on the language regarding the inclusion of the project manager in Section eight for the construction manager. She also proposed changing the references to Construction Manager in

numbers seven (7), eight (8), and ten (10) to Construction Manager/Project Manager.

- x. Ms. Hamler suggested modifying numbers eight (8) and ten (10) by changing "Contracts" to "Contracts Administration."
- xi. Mr. Tarafa advised the 6d, should read "Prime" instead of "the contractor".
- xii. Laurie and Gary Hartfield clarified that the purpose of the language is to ensure that the Prime contractor follows the same process as the County when working with subcontractors.
- xiii. Mr. Tarafa proposed a motion to approve this section with the mentioned amendments incorporated. Ms. Ransom-Jackson seconded the motion, and it was approved with a vote of 6-0.

c. Standard Construction General Contract Conditions Draft

The Board reached a consensus to emphasize significant changes, specifically highlighting sections 8, 9, 10, and 11.

Ms. Johnson proceeded reviewing the original language of the document and comparing it with the amended language for the board members. Each member had the opportunity to provide their comments and feedback on the changes that were made.

Laurie Johnson explained that due to the modifications made in the new contracts, specifically in Section 8(C), contractors now have the opportunity to seek compensation for delays. Additionally, she mentioned that a modification was made in Section 8(A) which allows businesses to store their products in department-approved locations, and payments can still be processed even if the materials have not yet been incorporated into the project.

Mr. Tarafa expressed that once the allowance account is depleted, the county holds no liability. He inquired about the specific percentage of allowance allocated for each contract. Ms. Laurie Johnson clarified that there is no predetermined percentage, but rather it is a dedicated allowance without a fixed percentage.

Director Hartfield explained that the costs are reserved for unforeseen circumstances that may arise during construction projects. Ms. Johnson mentioned that additional funds can be allocated to the allowance account. The board expressed a desire for a more specific language in this regard. Ms. Johnson agreed to meet with the County Attorney to address the language concerns. Additionally, the language pertaining to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) will be reviewed. Mr. Hartfield stated that the revisions made by the county attorney will be shared before proceeding to the next stage with this document, specifically Section 5D and 5E.

Director Hartfield informed the board members about an upcoming item sponsored by Commissioner Hardemon and supported by the mayor called the "small business relief grant." The grant is intended for any certified Small Business Enterprise (SBE) firm across all industries that has encountered cost escalation between January 2020 and December 2022. This includes escalations in labor, materials, fees, and other related costs. Proof of escalation will be required for eligibility. The grant allows for reimbursement of up to 1 million dollars per firm and is administered on a first-come, first-served basis. A total of 5 million dollars has been allocated to this grant program.

Mr. Tarafa asked if there would be a notice provision that would require subcontractors to promptly notify their primes of escalation costs. Director Gary Hartfield explained that primes could specify their requirements to subcontractors. As the county and a prime, the county is allowing 365 days for them to submit a request for escalation.

- i. Gary Hartfield proposed the inclusion of a drill-down clause that would hold subcontractors accountable for the same responsibilities as the prime contractors.
- ii. The board examined section 10, which covered markup rates. Ms. Laurie Johnson informed the board that the industry standard markup is typically 20%. The document reflected this standard by including overhead and profit considerations.
- iii. Gary Hartfield mentioned that Laurie provided a summary of the current market markup price. He stated that for single-trade projects, the prime contractor will receive 20% overhead. In the case of multiple-trade projects, the prime contractor will receive 5% overhead while the subcontractor will receive 15%.
- iv. Ms. Brown-Alfaro emphasized that as a prime contractor, there is significant time spent reviewing orders and engaging in back-and-forth communication with multiple subcontractors, but there is no billing opportunity for such efforts. Gary Hartfield explained that change orders arise due to unforeseen issues, and that is why there is compensation included in the markup. Mr. Munilla expressed concern that under these restrictions, the prime contractor would not make any profit.

Mr. Tarafa suggested a 25% percentage allocation, with 15% for subcontractors and 10% for primes. The board members agreed with these percentages. Laurie Johnson mentioned that she would consult with the County Attorney to determine whether the costs for bonds and additional expenses would fall under these markup costs.

Gary Hartfield expressed his desire for consistency throughout the document. He agreed to reduce the overhead percentage to 25%. For single trades, the prime will receive 25% overhead. For multiple trades, the prime will receive 10% overhead while the subcontractor

will receive 15%. Additionally, the percentage in Section 6A will also be modified to reflect 25%.

Dorothy requested that change orders be treated similarly to base contracts, with expedited processing and a requirement for subcontractors to wait for approval before proceeding with a change order. Mr. Hartfield confirmed that this would be part of the pilot program. Ms. Johnson added that the conditions outlined in this document would replace all previous conditions, becoming the new conditions for Miami-Dade County (MCC) and capital construction projects.

Gary Hartfield mentioned that the Small Business Development (SBD) department would make the necessary modifications based on the discussions. Ms. Ransom Jackson motioned to accept the proposed modified draft after consulting with the attorney, and Ms. Brown-Alfaro seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously with a vote of 6-0.

Mr. Munilla asked about the timeline for implementing the edits. Director Hartfield responded that the documents would be promptly provided to the County Attorney for review. Once the modifications are made, the document will be swiftly moved forward to the next step.

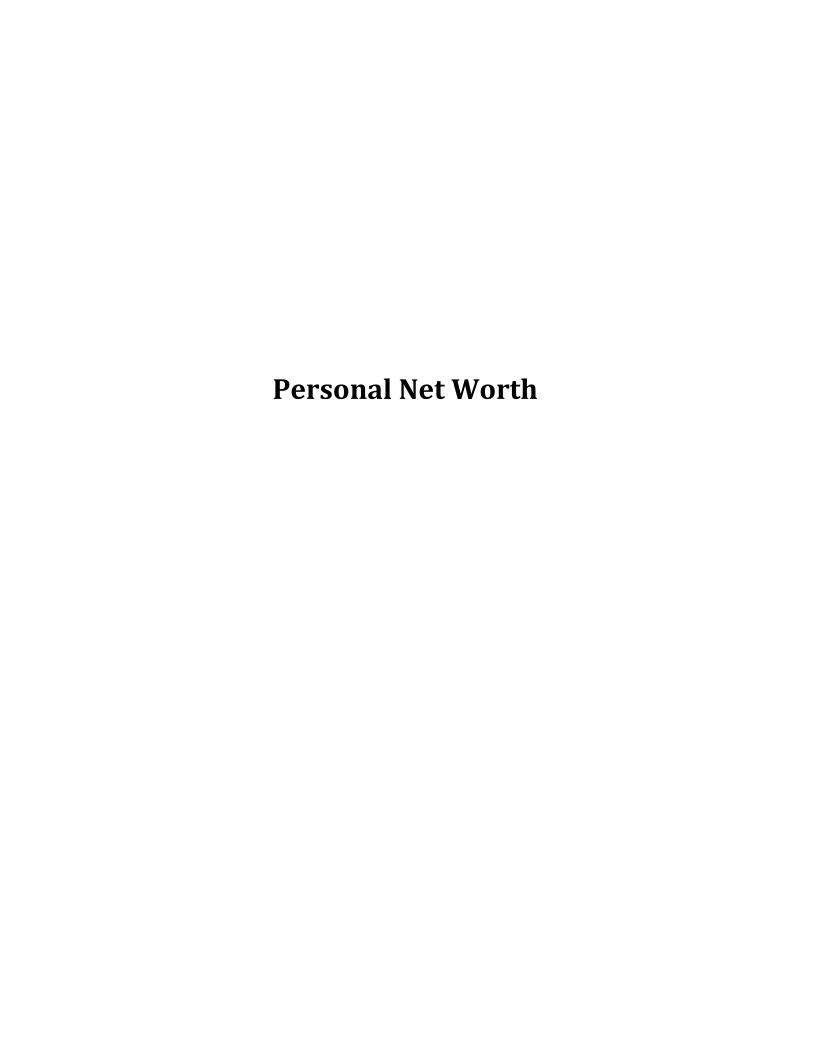

Sec. 10-33.02. Small Business Enterprise Construction Services Program.

- (1) *Title.* This section shall be referred to as the Miami-Dade County Small Business Enterprise Construction Services ("CSBE") Program.
- (2) Definitions. The following definitions shall apply in this section:

Advisory board means the Community Small Business Enterprise Board ("CSBE Advisory Board") created for the purpose of reviewing program activities and results, and for making recommendations to Small Business Development ("SBD") and the Board of County Commissioners ("County Commission") on matters pertaining to the program.

Aggregate Set-Aside means an aggregated value of small construction contracts, no one contract of which exceeds five million dollars, which are to be bid during a fixed period of time on a contract-by-contract basis with bidding therefor reserved solely among qualified CSBEs classified in the applicable Contracting Participation Level and SIC or NAICS Code for the contract.

Available or availability means to have, prior to bid submission, the ability to provide construction services under a prime contract that is being considered for a set-aside or under a first or second, third, or fourth tier subcontract on a contract being considered for a first or lower tier subcontractor goal by having:

- 1. Reasonably estimated, uncommitted capacity and expertise;
- 2. All licenses, permits, registrations and certifications;
- 3. The ability to obtain bonding that is reasonably required to perform the contract or subcontract consistent with normal industry practice; and
- 4. The ability to otherwise meet bid specifications.

Bid means a quotation, proposal, letter of interest or offer by any bidder in response to any kind of invitation, request or public announcement to submit such quotation, proposal, letters of interest or offer to perform the contract.

Bid preference means an amount deducted (for evaluation purposes only) from the total bid price in order to calculate the bid price to be used to evaluate the bid on a competitively bid prime county construction contract, which is not set-aside for bidding solely by CSBEs.

Bidder means any person, partnership, corporation or other business entity that submits a bid.

Bonding assistance may include providing assistance in preparing and completing bond packages as well as providing ending to be used for bonding purposes.

Business day means a regular week day (Monday through Friday) normally starting at 8:00 a.m. and finishing at 5:00 p.m., excluding Saturdays and Sundays and excluding all legal holidays recognized by the Federal, State or Miami-Dade County governments.

Calendar day means a twenty-four (24) hour period covering all days of the week (Monday through Sunday including all holidays), starting at 12:00 a.m. and finishing at 11:59 p.m.

Certificate of Assurance means the departmental form submitted with bid documents whereby the Bidder acknowledges: (i) Small Business Enterprise ("SBE") measures apply to the project; and (ii) Bidder will submit its list of certified SBEs to satisfy the measures via Miami-Dade County's web-based system, within the specified time frame.

Commercially useful function means contractual responsibility for the execution of a distinct element of the work of a contract by a business enterprise and the carrying out of the contractual responsibilities by actually

performing, managing, and supervising the work involved. Acting as a broker is not considered a commercially useful function. The determination of whether an activity is a commercially useful function shall include:

- 1. The evaluation of the amount of work subcontracted;
- Normal industry practices;
- 3. The skills, qualifications, or expertise of the enterprise to perform the work;
- 4. Whether the business' own personnel perform, manage, and/or supervise the work involved; and
- 5. Other relevant factors.

Commitment letter means a letter signed by an officer or other authorized representative of a bidder or proposer for a County construction contract containing a second, third or fourth tier subcontractor goal which specifically commits the bidder or proposer to meet such subcontractor goal.

Construction means the building, renovating, retrofitting, rehabing, restoration, painting, altering or repairing of a public improvement.

Construction Manager-at-Risk ("CM-at-Risk") replaces the general contractor and works for a fee with the County and the Architect through the design phase to contain the budget and schedule. The CM-at-Risk may provide a guaranteed maximum price ("GMP"), and bids the work out to local trade contractors. The CM-at-Risk mobilizes to the site and manages the trade contractors for quality and schedule.

Construction Services means construction, maintenance, painting, alteration, installation, or repair of a public improvement or any performance of work offered for public consumption that does not consist primarily of goods.

Contract means an agreement proposed by the County or Public Health Trust staff, or approved by the County Commission or Public Health Trust for construction.

Contracting participation level refers to the level in which a CSBE firm is classified based on the average gross revenues of the firm over a three-year period. The four (4) contracting participation levels are:

- 1. Level I—Three-year average gross revenues of \$0—\$2,000,000.00.
- 2. Level II—Three-year average gross revenues from \$2,000,000.01 but not exceeding \$5,000,000.00.
- 3. Level III—Three-year average gross revenues from \$5,000,000.01 but not exceeding \$10,000,000.00.
- 4. Level IV—Three-year average gross revenues from \$10,000,000.01 but not exceeding \$15,000,000.00.

Prime contracts with estimated project construction cost in excess of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00) shall be "open market" contracts which all firms can bid on.

CSBE objective means the objective of assuring that not less than ten (10) percent of the County's total annual expenditures for construction are expended with CSBEs. The foregoing CSBE objective may be increased by subsequent resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, adopted after recommendation for an increase by the Advisory Board. Forty (40) percent of the foregoing objective may be accomplished through set-aside of smaller prime contracts and use of subcontractor goals on larger prime contracts falling within Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code 15; forty (40) percent of the foregoing objective may be accomplished through set-aside of smaller prime contracts and use of subcontractor goals on larger prime contracts falling within SIC 16; and twenty (20) percent of the foregoing objective may be accomplished in prime contracts falling within SIC 17. The percentage of the overall CSBE objective allocated to each SIC category may be adjusted by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners in direct correlation to CSBE availability.

Draw means a request for payment submitted by the prime contractor to the County or County's designee. A scheduled draw occurs, according to the contract's payment schedule, when the prime contractor is allowed to submit its request for payment. The date(s) of a scheduled draw may be stated with specificity in the contract in

the form of a payment schedule or may be stated as a reoccurring event taking place, for example, on the 30th of each month.

Graduation means the CSBE has exceeded either the personal net worth, or the specific size limits stated for the program, based on the firm's three-year average annual gross revenues, and will no longer be eligible for participation in the program.

Guaranteed maximum price ("GMP") is the cost of the project that the CM-at-Risk guaranteed will not be exceeded.

Joint Venture means a business arrangement of two or more parties, in which at least one is a CSBE that agrees to pool its resources for the purpose of accomplishing a specific task.

Make-up Plan means a plan whereby a bidder submits via the County's web-based system its commitment that if awarded the contract, it will fulfill all or a portion of any pending Small Business Enterprise Construction Services makeup requirement and identify the certified CSBE firm(s) to be utilized to fulfill the make-up requirement that is in excess of any SBE goal(s) required on the project and the percentage, dollar value and description of the work that needs to be made up within the time frame specified by SBD.

Management and Technical Assistance (MTA) means a program designed to provide direct and indirect assistance for small business enterprise development. Specific details of the program are shown in Attachment 3 [which can be found in the County Clerk's office attached to Ordinance Number 97-52].

Mentor-Protege Program is a program whose purpose is to build effective working relationships between leaders of mature established companies and emerging small business enterprises in order for the latter to benefit from the knowledge and experience of the established mentor firms. The details of this program shall be provided in Implementing Order No. IO 3-22.

Miscellaneous Construction Contracts are open contracts designed to consolidate an indeterminate number of individual small construction, repair, installation, or alteration activities which may be needed over a fixed period of time, or open contracts that are work order based where no specific item quantities have been determined prior to bid (unit price contracts).

Prequalification is defined as provided elsewhere in this ordinance.

Primary Trade Contractor means those contractors who directly contract with the CM-at-Risk. This definition only applies to contracts for a construction manager-at-risk.

Program incentive is an incentive that a firm can choose to use in a bid or proposal based on the firm's participation in certain programs. The incentive consists of either a bid preference or selection factor that will be used in evaluating the firm's bid on a specific project. The program incentives available are as follows:

- 1. For participation in the Mentor-Protege' Program—Two (2) percent of bid price or up to ten (10) percent of the total evaluation points;
- 2. For participation in the Worker Training Program—Two (2) percent of the bid price or up to ten (10) percent of the total evaluation points.

Qualifier means the individual who has qualified a contractor for its current, valid certificate of competency or eligibility as required by Subsection (a) of Section 10-3 of this Code.

Review Committee or RC means the committee established by the County Mayor or designee to review proposed projects for the application of contract measures where SBD and the contracting department have not established consensus and when public input requires deliberation regarding the measures/goals recommendations. The RC will make recommendations to the Mayor or designee as needed.

SBD means the Miami-Dade County Department of Small Business Development, or successor agency.

Selection factor means a percentage of total evaluation points added to the points scored by a proposer responding to an RFP or RFQ for a prime County construction contract which is not set-aside for competition solely amongst CSBEs.

Set-aside means reservation for competition solely among CSBEs of a given prime County contract whose estimated cost is ten million dollars (\$10,000,000.00) or less, and such construction contracts will be classified into one (1) of the four (4) contracting participation levels based on estimated project cost:

- Level I Set-aside—For competition solely among Level I prime contractors of a given County contract
 for construction project valued from \$0 to \$2,000,000.00. Level II and Level III prime contractors may
 not compete for Level I set-aside contracts as prime contractors, unless Level I prime contractor
 unavailability exists.
- Level II Set-aside—For competition solely among Level I and II prime contractors of a given County
 contract for construction project valued from \$2,000,000.01 to \$5,000,000.00. Level III prime
 contractors may not compete for Level II set-asides contract as prime contractors, unless Level I and
 Level II prime contractor unavailability exists.
- 3. Level III Set-aside—For competition solely among Level I, Level II, and Level III prime contractors of a given County contract for construction project valued from \$5,000,000.01 to \$10,000,000.00.
- 4. Level IV Set-aside—For competition solely among Level I, Level II, Level III, and Level IV prime contractors of a given County contract for construction project valued from \$10,000,000.01 to \$15,000,000.00.

SIC (Standard Industrial Classification) or the equivalent North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code is a code that was developed by the Federal Office of Management and Budget for use in the classification of establishments by type of activity in which they are engaged.

Small Business Enterprise for Construction Services (CSBE) means a construction related enterprise, including a design-build firm, and any firm providing trades and/or services for the completion of a construction project, as defined in Chapter 10 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, which has an actual place of business in Miami-Dade County and whose average annual gross revenues for the last three (3) years do not exceed: fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00) for SIC 15 - Building Construction, General Contractors and Operative Builders; twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000.00) for SIC 16 - Heavy Construction, other than Building Construction; or eight million dollars (\$8,000,000.00) for SIC 17 - Specialty Trade Contractors. CSBEs shall be categorized by the type of construction they perform in accordance with the two-digit Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code, or the six-digit North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), of the Census applicable to such type of construction. A CSBE will graduate out of the program upon notification by SBD that it has exceeded these size limits based on its three-year average annual gross revenues. A certified CSBE that graduates out of the program shall continue to submit financial information as to cumulative gross revenue and bonding capacity to SBD annually for 3 years thereafter in order to further the County's ability to assess the effectiveness of the program.

CSBEs must be certified by SIC or NAICS code, and classified into one (1) of the four (4) contracting participation levels. The lack of bonding capacity shall not preclude an applicant from being certified as a CSBE. As part of the certification process, CSBEs must go through a prequalification process which will be used to determine which of the four (4) contracting participation levels the CSBE will be placed in based on the firm's four (4) year average gross revenues. The contracting participation levels are as follows:

- 1. Level I—Three-year average gross revenues of \$0.00—\$2,000,000.00;
- 2. Level II—Three-year average gross revenues above \$2,000,000.00 but not exceeding \$5,000,000.00;
- 3. Level III—Three-year average gross revenues above \$5,000,000.00 but not exceeding \$10,000,000.00, or
- 4. Level IV—Three-year average gross revenues above \$10,000,000.00 but not exceeding \$15,000,000.00.

A firm's eligibility to participate in the CSBE program and the contracting participation level at which it will participate shall be determined based on the three-year average gross revenues of the applicant firm in combination with that of all of the firm's affiliates as provided in Appendix A [which can be found in the County Clerk's office attached to Ordinance Number 97-52]. No firm shall be certified as a CSBE where the individual net worth of any of its owners is more than one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00).

Representations as to average gross revenues, personal net worth of owners and payroll shall be subject to audit.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section 10-33.02, Level II and Level III CSBEs certified in SIC Code 17 - Specialty Trade Contractors, may bid on a specialty trade contract set aside for CSBEs whose estimated cost is above \$50,000.00 and may participate in any specialty trade portion of the work of a contract subject to a CSBE subcontractor goal where the cost of the specialty trade portion of the contract work is above \$50,000.00.

Subcontractor goal means a proportion of a prime contract value stated as a percentage to be subcontracted to CSBEs to perform a commercially useful function. A first tier subcontract goal may be imposed where there is CSBE availability at such tier level. A second, third and fourth tier subcontract goal may be imposed on those contracts whose estimated cost exceeds twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000.00) where there is CSBE availability at such lower tier levels.

Trade set-aside means that an entire specialty trade component(s) of a County miscellaneous construction contract is reserved for first tier subcontracting amongst certified CSBEs (for example, the entire plumbing or roofing or electrical component of a specific contract is reserved for limited competition amongst certified CSBEs). All such subcontracts shall be in writing and shall be executed by the prime contractor and the first tier CSBE subcontractor.

Utilization Plan means the plan whereby a Bidder submits via the County's web-based system its commitment that if awarded the contract, it will fulfill the SBE goal(s) required for the project and identify certified firms to fulfill goal(s) and percentages, dollar value, and description of the work to fulfill the SBE goal within the time frame specified by SBD. Subcontractor(s) listed will also be required to confirm their participation via the County's web-based system within the specified time frame. Bidders must enter into written subcontracts with the listed CSBE(s).

Virtual Office means an agreement that provides a receptionist, mail and facsimile services, and similar services, that give the appearance of having a business presence at a location, but the business entity has no ongoing, full-time physical presence in the building. Virtual Offices are invalid for certification purposes.

Worker Training Program is a qualified training program or technical school or other such construction industry related training program, as approved by the advisory board.

(3) *Program components:*

A. Application. Except where federal or state laws or regulations mandate to the contrary, the provisions of this section shall require review of all construction contracts funded in whole or in part with County funds and all leases and contracts for privately funded construction on County-owned land to determine the appropriateness of applying contract measures as set forth in this section. The County Mayor shall prepare administrative orders, implementing orders, bid, and contract documents implementing the Bonding and Financial Assistance Program, the Management and Technical Assistance Programs, the Mentor-Protege Program and other related programs addressed in this section. All leases and contracts for privately funded construction on County-owned land for which measures are determined to be appropriate under this section shall contain specific provisions to implement the intent of the CSBE program in a manner consistent with its application to County construction contracts. This section shall not apply to privately funded construction on any County-owned facilities or property where the total value of the construction is two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) or less. The words "County Mayor" in this section shall mean the County Mayor or his or her designee.

This memorandum serves to present recommendations for organizational changes to the Internal Services Department, Small Business Division (SBD) and seeks your approval to implement the proposed changes. These recommendations are premised on the need to prioritize the role of SBD in Miami-Dade County and to ensure that its programs' visibility is elevated.

The incumbent Division Director, Gary Hartfield, currently reports to the Department Director of the Internal Services Department. In the recommended structure, he will be directly reporting to me in my new role. It is also recommended that the SBD Division is retitled to Office of Small Business Development. His classification would be retitled to Director, Office of Small Business Development.

The direct reports to the Division Director are five (5) SBD Section Chiefs. It is recommended that their titles will remain the same and that the positions be regraded to accommodate the organizational change. Please see the attached functional table of organization which will remain in place with Mr. Hartfield reporting to the Chief Administrative Officer as opposed to the Department Director for ISD. With regard to the positions that organizationally reside below the classification of SBD Section Chief, presently they appear to be properly classified.
