

**I.** Welcome/Introductions — Ms. Michou Jean convened the Construction Advisory Board meeting at 3:05 pm. Ms. Michou Jean welcomed the members of the board and conducted the roll call. Vice-Chair Elsie K. Hamler extended a warm welcome to all the members of the Board and the staff and proceeded to discuss the agenda.

Following the introduction of board members and staff, Ms. Michou Jean mentioned that the board members had previously discussed including the task log into the Construction Advisory Board meeting agenda on a consistent basis.

It was moved by Mr. Jessie Bernard Houston that the Task Log remain on all future Construction Board meeting Agenda(s). This motion was seconded by Mr. Alejandro Munilla, and upon being put to a vote, the motion passed by a vote of 7-0.

Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro requested that House Bill 735 and House Bill 346 be added to the agenda for discussion.

#### **II. Old Business**

a. Approval of May 15, 2023, Construction Advisory Board Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Ms. Shellie Ransom Jackson to approve May 15, 2023, Construction Board meeting minutes. This motion was seconded by Dorothy Brown-Alfaro, and upon being put to a vote, the motion passed by a vote of 7-0.

#### b. Approval of May 31, 2023, Construction Advisory Board Meetings Minutes

It was moved by Ms. Shellie Ransom Jackson to approve May 31, 2023, Construction Board meeting minutes. This motion was seconded by Dorothy Brown-Alfaro, and upon being put to a vote, the motion passed by a vote of 7-0.

#### c. Approval of 2024 Construction Advisory Board Meetings Dates

It was moved by Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro to approve 2024 Construction Advisory Board meeting dates with the amended date of January 15, 2024, to January 22, 2024. This motion was seconded by Jeovanni R. Tarafa, and upon being put to a vote, the motion passed by a vote of 7-0.

## III. Discussion.

#### Add-on Item - House Bill 735 and House Bill 346

Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro addressed the potential effects of House Bill 735 and House Bill 346 on small businesses. She urged the board members to closely monitor both bills and to engage with politicians from all affiliations, Republican, Democrat, or independent. She noted this call to action was prompted by the awareness that Republicans currently hold majorities in both the House and Senate in Florida. Ms. Brown-Alfaro emphasized the importance of appealing to supportive Republican counterparts to ensure the preservation of the small business enterprise programs.

Ms. Laurie Johnson, SBD Section Chief, updated the board members regarding State Bill 735, which affects licensing requirements. She noted that the bill implementation was scheduled for 2024 and clarified that it would not be repealed. Ms. Johnson further explained that the County Attorney and the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources were collaborating with the Small Business Development (SBD) department, to keep them informed about any forthcoming developments and the strategy for implementation. She assured the board that they would share any information provided with them about how to proceed with this matter.

#### **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program (DBE)**

Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro raised concerns about the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program (DBE), and Ms. Laurie Johnson, SBD Section Chief, briefed the board members on the DBE

program. She noted that the DBE program was a federal initiative and that staff have maintained close communication with the Federal Government regarding its implementation. Ms. Johnson emphasized that both responsible wages and Federal programs had faced longstanding challenges. She assured the board that they were actively monitoring the situation and staying informed. She highlighted their attendance at all Federal conferences and their commitment to staying updated on any changes, whether at the Federal or State level, that could impact the program. Ms. Johnson assured the board members that staff would promptly provide any development or changes to the board's attention.

#### a. Personal Net Worth Discussion

Ms. Alice Hidalgo-Gato, Small Business Development (SBD) Section Chief, acknowledged that a Commissioner was considering the possibility of raising the threshold for personal net worth used for offering certification. Ms. Hidalgo-Gato stated the current threshold was set at \$1.5 million per owner, and if it exceeds this amount, they were not eligible to be in the SBE programs. She also informed the Board that staff were currently examining the practices of similar organizations in the tri-county area, particularly in light of Miami-Dade County having the highest personal net worth at the moment. Furthermore, Ms. Hidalgo indicated that there might be future proposals to increase this threshold. She emphasized that as things develop, the Board would receive updates. Ms. Hidalgo-Gato advised if the members had any ideas or wish to conduct research and return with recommendations regarding whether to approve or recommend this change, their input was welcomed. She stated that staff would keep the board members informed as the situation progresses.

#### **b.** Office of Small Business Development

Ms. Carladenise Edwards, Chief Administrative Officer, for the Office of the Mayor, discussed the responsibilities of overseeing the Office of Small Business Development. She provided the board with insight into her personal background and discussed the responsibilities of overseeing the Office of Small Business Development.

# IV. SBD Section Reports SBE-Construction Business Outreach & Education (Lawanda Wright)

Ms. Lawanda Wright, SBD Section Chief, presented the Construction Business Outreach and Education report for June 1, 2023 – July 31, 2023.

Pursuant to Mr. Jessie Bernard Houston's question as to whether the report with the single bond application was approved, denied, or in process, Mr. Carlos Ansuarez confirmed that the bond was in process and was currently undergoing underwriting.

#### **SBE-Construction Certification Report (Jeanise Commings-Labossiere)**

Ms. Jeanise Commings-Labossiere briefed the board members on the Construction certification report for periods June 1, 2023 – July 31, 2023. There were no questions regarding the report.

## **SBE-Construction Project Review and Analysis (Laurie Johnson)**

Ms. Laurie John presented the Construction Certification Report for the period June 1, 2023 – July 31, 2023.

Ms. Elsie K. Hamler raised a question regarding whether firms that had initially registered for the program could be excluded from it. She pointed out that the report displayed 7040 certified firms and a total of 899 registered firms.

Ms. Johnson clarified that the total number of firms mentioned should be the total of MCC firms and not just the 7040 specified. She explained that the 7040 represented 100 percent of firms that were fully certified as Small Business Enterprises (SBEs), so the total should include all active MCC firms, not solely the 7040 mentioned.

Discussion ensued amongst Mr. Jessie Bernard Houston, Ms. Hamler, and Ms. Johnson regarding the report displaying the 7040 instead of the MCC Registered Contractors.

#### **SBE-Construction Utilization Report (Rossi Siewnarine)**

Mr. Rossi Siewnarine provided the board with an update of the Construction Utilization Report June 1, 2023 – July 31, 2023.

Mr. Siewnarine informed the board members that he would merge 2019 - 2021 into one table and have a table for 2022 and 2023.

In response to Mr. Alejandro Munilla's question regarding why the report begin with the year 2019, Mr. Siewnarine explained that it was due to the implementation of Business Management Workforce. System (BMWS)

#### V. Construction Management Reporting

#### a. Miscellaneous Construction Contract MCC918

Ms. Ginny Mirabel presented the Miscellaneous Construction Contract (MCC918) report before the board.

Ms. Mirabel noted that \$11,000,317 had been allocated to small businesses, showing their outstanding commitment at 75.1%. She stated there were currently 65 contracts in place where MCC-918 had exceptional participation, and contracts were steadily building. Ms. Mirabel noted the aim was to significantly boost the number of contracts and reach 18 in the near future, possibly by early next year.

She stated they were expecting more projects, which showed that the small business community continued to thrive. Additionally, she noted MCC-918 disbursed a total of \$2.5 million dollars to small businesses.

In response to Mr. Jessie Bernard Houston's question regarding what the 86.2% on the Breakout-to date was referring to, Ms. Mirabel indicated she would have to further explore the 86.2% due to an apparent discrepancy.

Responding to Ms. Elsie K. Hamler's inquiry as to whether the \$2.5 million was coming from the \$11 million funding source, Ms. Mirabel confirmed that the \$2.5 million was allocated from SBE-C's \$11 million funding amount.

Discussion ensued amongst the board members regarding the breakdown of the report.

Mr. Houston requested that Ms. Mirabel provide a dollar amount for the demographic Data on page 18 of the report.

#### **b.** Project E-Jackson South Medical Center (Turner Construction Company)

Ms. Jordyn Hopkins presented the Project E-Jackson South Medical Center report before the board members and staff.

Ms. Jordyn Hopkins noted the Jackson Self Project E initial construction goal was 32.7%, but the goal of 37% was reached. She stated that during their recent meeting it was discovered that there was a roofing contract issue, which led to a revision of the goal. She noted there was no specific percentage provided for the report. Ms. Hopkins pointed out that this information was documented in the meeting minutes from the prior meeting. She referenced the prior meeting minutes, which included a note that Ms. Alice Hidalgo-Gato (SBD Section Chief) mentioned that the firm would be excused from the goal portion due to the project being subsequently awarded to a smaller bidder.

Ms. Hidalgo further explained the matter and noted that they were not in compliance with the goal. She outlined what transpired with the roofing contractor, noting that they had initially awarded the contract to a small business. Ms. Hidalgo-Gato noted the small business withdrew, and the project was subsequently offered to the second bidder. She clarified that there were only two bids from small businesses, and when the second bidder showed no interest, they opened the bidding to both

small and non-small businesses. Ms. Hidalgo stated that the contract was awarded to a non-certified firm. She stated due to the firms' inability to find a suitable contractor for the roofing work, they were excused from the goal associated with that specific roofing project.

Discussion ensued between Ms. Elsie K. Hamler and Ms. Hidalgo-Gato regarding the two (2) firms who had submitted bids for the project.

Ms. Hidalgo-Gato indicated that subsequently Turner Construction was found to be in compliance with the goal.

#### c. Project F-Christine E. Lynn Rehabilitation Hospital (Turner Construction)

Ms. Jordyn Hopkins provided the board members with an update for Project F, noting the construction goal was 34.05% and the firm successfully achieved 42.461%. Additionally, Ms. Hopkins noted the goods and services objective was 2.5%, and they achieved 2.13%.

#### d. DTC Vertical Expansion (Turner Construction Company)

Ms. Jordyn Hopkins presented the report on DTC Vertical Expansion, where she mentioned that the construction goal was 21.6%, and they achieved 19.99%. She also pointed out that the goods and services goal was 2.5%, and they achieved 2.55%. Ms. Hopkins expressed that they anticipate on meeting the goal once they reconcile the log with the County.

#### e. Desing, Build, Finance, Operate, Maintain Civil and Probate Courthouse

Mr. Armando Perez provided an update on the 25-story building project, stating that they have completed the shell construction. He noted the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal for this project was set at 13.11% for construction. Mr. Perez stated that currently, the firm had achieved a total percentage of 16.57%, which surpasses the set goal. Also, he noted they reported a total of 13 GMPS, possibly goods or services provided by SBE. Mr. Perez stated within the construction category, the total contracted amount to the SBEs was \$28,925,000 and to date, they have disbursed \$20,859,000. He noted the demographic total percentage achieved was 16.57%, with a total payment amount of 73.25%.

The board members inquired about the progress of the contract, Mr. Perez opined that they were currently at a completion rate ranging between 60% and 65%.

Pursuant to Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro inquiry about the ethnicity of Trojan Builders, Mr. Perez clarified that Trojan Builders firm was a Caucasian-owned firm.

Ms. Elsie K. Hamler questioned the significance of providing details about non-SBE firms, and Mr. Perez explained that these were firms not affiliated with the SBE program. He noted there were numerous such firms, making it difficult to list them all, so he opted to mark them as "not available."

It was moved by Ms. Shellie Ransom Jackson to exclude non-SBE firms in all reports. This motion was seconded by Mr. Alejandro Munilla, and upon being put to a vote, the motion passed by a vote of 5-2 (Dorothy Brown-Alfaro voted No and Elsie K. Hamler abstained from voting).

After the conclusion of the vote, the board members advised Mr. Perez to include the dollar amount for the demographic data.

#### f. Grove Central Mixed-Use

Ms. Gabriel Matheus presented the report on the Grove Central Mixed-Use project to the board members. Ms. Matheus noted the Grove Central Project had an overall goal of 116.9%, a goal they had surpassed. She also mentioned that the utilization plan was still under review, and discussions had taken place with individuals from the county to finalize participation as the project nears its completion. Ms. Matheus pointed out that the total amount paid by contract had consistently exceeded expectations. She stated they have disbursed over \$18 million for Small Business Enterprises (SBE)s, which was 124% of the initial commitment. Ms. Matheus indicated in the Goods and Services category; they have reached 135% over the originally committed dollar amount. She stated they had already received 50% of the payment, totaling \$80 million dollars, compared to the initial \$50 million. Ms. Matheus indicated they were in the final stages of concluding the project. She noted that during the upcoming reporting period, the accounts would include payments from subcontractors and their work until the end of May.

In response to the board members inquiry as to whether the overall overage was due to change orders, Ms. Matheus explained that it was primarily a result of the change orders and adjustments made by subcontractors in labor, which differed from their initial allocation expectations.

Discussion ensued between Vice Chair Elsie K. Hamler and Ms. Matheus regarding the change of scope, the Trojan Builders, Inc. firm, and the demographic data percentage.

#### g. MSC Cruise Terminal (Fincantieri Infrastructure Florida)

Mr. Roberto Curcuruto provided the board with an update of the MSC Cruise Terminal Report.

Mr. Curcuruto pointed out that MSC Cruise Terminal reached the halfway mark in the projects' progress. He noted the objectives were 40% completion for the design phase, 10% for construction, and 2.2% for goods and services. Mr. Curcuruto stated that the Small Business Enterprise (SBE)

had achieved 88% of its target, with 70% in the Architecture and Engineering (A&E) category and 30% in Goods and Services. Additionally, he noted they have gathered Construction Demographic Data and analyzed the breakdown of the design portion.

Vice Chairwoman Elsie K. Hamler requested that Mr. Roberto Curcuruto from MCS Terminal include the dollar amount for the SBE-Construction Demographic Data on page 6.

Ms. Shellie Ransom Jackson asked that Mr. Roberto Curcuruto from MCS Terminal include from page 5 SBE-Construction Breakdown of ethnicity and gender.

#### h. Poole and Kent Company of Florida

#### a. Request for future agenda items

Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro requested that task logs for legislative bills extending into 2023 should follow the same organization as they did in early 2023. She recommended focusing on the most recent legislation and including any recent developments in the task log section, such as the bills discussed in today's (9/18) construction meeting.

**I. Welcome/Introductions** – Ms. Michou Jean convened the SBE Construction Advisory Board meeting at 1:15 pm. Ms. Jean welcomed the members of the board and conducted the roll call, followed by staff introduction. Vice-Chairwoman Elsie K. Hamler extended a warm welcome to all the members of the Board along with staff and proceeded to discuss the agenda.

#### II. Old Business

# a. Approval of September 18, 2023, Construction Advisory Board Meeting Minutes Deferred

#### II. Discussion

**a.** Ethics Opinions Request – Susannah Nesmith (Staff Attorney- Miami Dade County Commission on Ethics & Public Trust) Ms. Susannah Nesmith provided the board members with a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Mami-Dade County Commission on Ethics and Public Trust Advisory Board Ethics Update." Discussion proceeded amongst Ms. Nesmith, Construction Board members and Mr. Gary Hartfield, Director, Office of Small Businesses, regarding the Ethics updates.

#### b. Personal Net Worth (PNW) Ordinance (Director Gary T. Hartfield)

Mr. Gary T. Hartfield, the Director of the Office of Small Business, informed the board members that during the Collective Advisory board meeting, an agreement was reached to raise the Personal Net Worth to \$1,500,000. Subsequently, he pointed out that Commissioner

Cohen-Higgins had sponsored an ordinance related to Small Business Enterprise programs, proposing an increase in the personal net worth threshold to \$2,500,000. He mentioned plans for discussions with the Mayor and Dias when presenting the item to the Committee, suggesting an amendment to include a five-year increment tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI), eliminating the need to revisit the matter with the board. Mr. Hartfield encouraged board members to attend the committee meeting where the item would be discussed.

Responding to Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro's inquiry about the committee meeting where the ordinance would be presented, Mr. Hartfield mentioned the possibility of the ordinance being presented at either the Airport and Economic Development Committee or the County Infrastructure, Operations, and Innovations Committee meeting.

#### c. Task Log

Ms. Sandra Petithomme provided the board members with an update of the task logs.

Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro referred to task log 1, concerning prompt payment. She noted the County had agreed to conduct a pilot program that included Miami-Dade County Internal Services Department (ISD), Aviation, Public Works, and Transit. Ms. Brown-Alfaro stated this program was developed to track the prompt payment processes from the beginning to completion. She requested that staff provide an update on the prompt payment pilot program at the upcoming Construction board meeting. Additionally, Ms. Dorothy asked that staff provide an update on all pending task log items at the upcoming Construction meeting.

#### **IV. SBD Section Reports**

#### a. SBE-Construction Business Outreach & Education

Mr. Carlos Assurez, (Section Manager), reviewed the report on the Business Outreach & Education report for periods August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023. There were no questions or comments on the Business Outreach & Education report.

#### b. SBE - C SBE-Construction Certification Report (Jeanise Cummings-Labossiere)

Ms. Cynthia France, (Section Manager), briefed the board members on the Construction Certification Report for periods August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023.

In response to Mr. Jessie Bernard Houston's inquiry about the potential impact of the proposed Personal Net Worth (PNW) on the graduating certification class, Ms. France noted the PNW would affect the graduating certification class, because the criteria would either be modified, or new requirements would be introduced.

## c. SBE-Construction Project Review and Analysis (Laurie Johnson)

Ms. Laurie Johnson (SBD Section Chief) presented the Construction Project Review and Analysis report for the period of August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023. No questions from the board.

#### d. SBE-Construction Utilization Report (Rossi Siewnarine)

Mr. Rossi Siewnarine (SBD Section Chief) presented an update on the Construction Utilization report for the period of August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023.

He informed the board that he planned to consolidate data from 2019 to 2021 into a single table, along with separate tables for each year in 2022 and 2023.

During the discussion, Ms. Dorothy Brown-Alfaro raised a question about the third table, specifically regarding the negative value of minus 19 for African Americans. Ms. Shellie Ransom-Jackson also inquired about why minorities showed a negative figure of \$3 million. In response, Mr. Siewnarine indicated that he would provide information on the concerns raised by Ms. Brown-Alfaro and Ms. Ransom-Jackson at the upcoming Construction meeting.

## V. Construction Management Reporting

#### a. Miscellaneous Construction Contract MCC918

Ms. Ginny Mirabal presented the MCC918 report for the periods August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023.

Mr. Jessie Houston inquired about the contract goal for MCC918 project, Ms. Laurie Johnson, Section Chief, advised that the MCC918 project was a 100 percent set-aside project, with work orders being generated. She explained that each of these work orders was considered a trade set-aside. Ms. Johnson emphasized the work orders were included in the dollar fees for the MCC9 management.

Ms. Mirabal provided further details, breaking down the total cost to date and specifying how the reported funds were allocated between the trade set- aside and MCC fees.

Ms. Mirabal further explained that the difference between the \$15 million and \$30 million primarily represented MCC9 fees. She highlighted instances where certain projects had open items, there were no predetermined goal for construction. Instead, she noted the focus was on identifying trade set-aside packages for all construction. Ms. Mirabal noted for the overall percentage for construction, there were no specific goal to meet. She emphasized that there was no participation by small businesses accounting for the difference between the total construction dollar amount awarded and the portion allocated to small businesses

(\$11,967,000). Ms. Mirabal stated the disparity was attributed to MCC9 fees, preconstruction fees, and any open packages that could not be set aside for small businesses. She reiterated there was no overreaching goal, and adjustments were made to optimize the use of small businesses through trade set-aside packages. Ms. Mirabal pointed out the sole goal for MCC was a 22% target on the management portion.

Ms. Dorothy Alfaro-Brown inquired about the goal for MCC9 construction services, expressing concerns about meeting the 18 percent goal, noting that progress had been reasonable, but MCC9 was still falling short.

Ms. Mirabal reassured Ms. Alfaro-Brown that MCC9 would meet the 18 percent goal. She explained MCC had a deficit of one employee, however, recently a new employee had joined MCC9. Ms. Mirabal expressed confidence that this development would significantly aid MCC in achieving the goal for the next report. Additionally, she acknowledged the initial challenges, where MCC9 did not have a project manager for two to three months. Ms. Mirabal stated despite these challenges, MCC9 ongoing efforts and determination was to achieve the goal.

In response to Ms. Elsie K. Hamler's question regarding what year did MCC9 contract begin, and when would the contract end, Ms. Mirabal indicated MCC9 contract began in 2022 and the contract was projected to conclude in January 2027, constituting a five-year program.

#### b. Project E-Jackson South Medical Center (Turner Construction Company)

Ms. Jordyn Hopkins presented the Project E-Jackson South Medical Center report for the period August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023, before the board members.

#### c. Project F-Christine E. Lynn Rehabilitation Hospital (Turner Construction)

Ms. Jordyn Hopkins provided the board members with an updated for Project F, noting the construction goal was 34.05% and the firm successfully achieved 42.4 61%. Additionally, Ms. Hopkins noted the goods and services objectives was 2.5%, and the firm achieved 2.13%.

#### d. DTC Vertical Expansion (Turner Construction Company)

Ms. Jordyn Hopkins presented the DTC Vertical Expansion report, noting that the construction goal was set at 21.6%, and the firm had achieved 19.99%. She highlighted the anticipation of meeting the goal, citing ongoing processes of finalizing payments and reconciling Owners Direct Purchase (ODP) payments. Ms. Hopkins also reported that the goods and services goal was 2.5%, with the firm achieving 0.55%.

In response to Mr. Jessie Houston's inquiry about whether the firm would reach the 21.6% construction goal, Ms. Hopkins affirmed that the firm would achieve the specified goal. She added that the firm had approximately \$3 million in ODP for Small Business Enterprise

(SBE), which needed reconciliation with the county in the Business Management Workforce (BMW) system.

Following Mr. Houston's inquiry about whether the reconciliation would be presented at the upcoming construction meeting, Ms. Hopkins confirmed that the reconciliation would be presented during the next construction meeting. She mentioned this presentation should conclude the reporting for all three projects.

Mr. Kenneth Robertson questioned the status of Turner's Project E, addressing the preconception that it fell short of the goal. He pointed out that the roofing package was considered an excluded item, suggesting that it should be deducted from the total contract amount.

Ms. Alice Hidalgo-Gato, (SBD Section Chief), clarified that Turner was excused from meeting the goal on that specific amount. She emphasized that while they were excused from that portion, the overall goal remained the same. Ms. Hidalgo-Gato highlighted that the explanation for not meeting the goal was provided at the last two meetings.

Mr. Robertson further elaborated on the work done at Jackson South and the rehabilitation projects spanned for several years. He noted a small portion of the DTC Project for the fourthfloor buildout, was part of the contract and it might or might not be ready for the final report at the next construction meeting.

Pursuant to Ms. Elsie K. Hamler's inquiry about whether the projects would be reflected in the final report, Mr. Robertson expressed uncertainty, stating that he did not believe the fourth-floor buildout for the Turner DTC project would be ready for finalization. He assured that the firm would provide a comprehensive report at the next meeting.

#### e. Desing, Build, Finance, Operate, Maintain Civil and Probate Courthouse

Mr. Armando Perez presented the Design, Build, Finance, Operate, Maintain Civil and Probate Courthouse report for period August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023, noting the firm contracts totaled to \$32,417,961 with Small Business Enterprise (SBE). He stated this constituted 18.57% of the SBE goal for this specific project, focusing solely on the construction category. Mr. Perez mentioned this amount was spread across 9 SBE contracts at this juncture. He noted the firm disbursed \$23,227,114.96 to SBE, representing 71% of the overall commitment. Mr. Perez displayed the breakdown of the firms involved, including the demographic data with payments made to 6 Hispanic-owned companies totaling \$9,000,008, \$43,000 to one African American-owned company, \$404,000 to Caucasian-owned firms (the majority at \$12,000,008), and \$106,714 to one woman-owned company.

#### f. Grove Central Mixed-Use - Deferred

#### g. MSC Cruise Terminal (Fincantieri Infrastructure Florida)

Ms. Deborah Dickton briefed the board members on MSC Cruise Terminal report for periods August 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023. She noted the project, under the specified contract, was focused on achieving the following goals in terms of the design-build aspect: of allocating 14% for design, 10% for construction, and 2.2% for goods and services.

#### h. Poole and Kent Company of Florida - Deferred

#### i. DTC East Tower Vertical Expansion (SHELL)

Mr. Vincent Collins provided an overview of the DTC East Tower Vertical Expansion report, indicating the mentorship goal for the project was 6.31% for Small Business Enterprise (SBE), with Siegel at 32.77% and SBE's goods and services at 0.25%. He noted the contract was divided into two purchase orders, with the DTC involving vertical addition, including core and shell construction.

Pursuant to Ms. Elsie K. Hamler's inquiry as to whether the firm "Multicorp Marketing" for the allocated amount of \$6,016 contract, Hispanic/American demographic was the same contract, Mr. Collins confirmed that the Multicorp Marketing was the same contract. He explained that Multicorp Marketing was a woman-owned Hispanic-owned business.
