### **Overall Project Description**

The project is for design services to provide construction documents for a new domestic violence center that emphasize site security and confidentiality for protection of its residents with a maximum award of \$750,000 and an effective term of two years and a one year option to extend.

The scope of work includes a design that accommodates 60 emergency shelter beds and space for future growth, kitchens to facilitate multi-family meal preparation, laundry facilities, communal spaces, indoor and outdoor play spaces, and space for staff and support services. The design will incorporate strategies that position rooms, windows and skylights to maximize natural daylight and provide views of natural features like gardens and trees while preserving the feeling of security. The facility will incorporate accessible design features to accommodate residents with disabilities. Design strategies will incorporate quiet spaces outside residents' rooms to facilitate healing from trauma and increase options for privacy. The design will also provide indoor and outdoor spaces for pets and service animals.




FGSS worked with The Salvation Army on the Miami Area Command/Social Services Center from the initial development stages, including site selection, master planning, zoning hearings, and development of Phase I. The facility is located in the NW Miami area adjacent to SR 112 and Jackson High School. The master plan and zoning approval allows for 3 phases of development of the site to support the agency's objectives.

The first Phase of the Center was designed to provide over 200 beds, including 14 shelter rooms for Women and Children in Distress, 52 beds in the Women's Shelter and 54 beds for the Men's Shelter. Support spaces include a commercial central kitchen that serves the dining rooms for men, women and families, laundry facilities, passive and active interior communal spaces and offices for administrative and social services staff. The Women and Family areas are completely segregated from the Men's facilities. A large landscaped central courtyard open to the family and women's areas provides a protected and safe outdoor recreation space. All occupied rooms have windows that provide natural light and views. The facility was designed to accommodate residents with disabilities. The 53,600 s.f. Phase I has been assisting its clients at this location since 1995.

FGSS is currently working with The Salvation Army on the Phase II expansion of the facility. The 25,000 s.f. expansion will enable the agency to better provide emergency disaster services for the community and its shelter.












The Center provides space for patient intake, interview rooms, exam rooms, a laboratory, secure records storage, a conference room and administrative offices. High windows allow natural light to fill the space, provide views of the sky, and yet conceal the interior spaces from the exterior.
