ATTACHMENT 1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

2.1. INTRODUCTION:

Miami-Dade County (the "County"), as represented by the Miami-Dade Economic Advocacy Trust (MDEAT), is seeking to conduct a disparity study for further submission to the Board of County Commissioners. County Code of Ordinances, Article XLVIII, Section 2-506 (f) dictates "The Trust shall conduct a disparity study that examines the present economic conditions of Blacks in Miami-Dade County. This study shall be conducted every ten (10) years and submitted to the Board".

The selected Proposer shall prepare a Miami-Dade County Disparity Study which will include the following Scope of Services. The Scope of Services details the various elements of the Study including the analytical framework, community engagement and study findings and recommendations for each policy area.

A. Analytics

The secondary data collection aims to describe the status of the Black community of Miami-Dade County, over time and in comparison to other racial and ethnic groups. The data collection is geared towards providing a comprehensive, holistic analysis that connects the different indicators and speaks to the barriers and opportunities for community development. The Miami-Dade County Disparity Study includes, but is not limited to, the following data, analysis and information:

1. Demographics

- Population by age, gender, race and ethnicity.
- Population growth trends.
- Population changes with an emphasis on recent shifts due to economic and housing conditions
- Household types by race and ethnicity.
- Household type by tenure

Deliverable#1: Detailed report on the status of the Black community, highlighting changes over time and in comparison to other groups across the six topical areas

Schedule: This deliverable must be completed within XX days of the award of the Contract or on an agreed upon date between the selected Proposer and the County.

B. Community Engagement

The development of relationships with minority communities to partner in the research process is critical for understanding areas of critical need and developing interventions that are compatible with this community. To that end, in collaboration with MDEAT, the selected Proposer will develop a community-based participatory research plan with the following elements:

- Identify census tracts and neighborhoods with a high concentration of Black/African American residents, using mapping technology, to enable targeted, place-based outreach.
- Identify neighborhood associations or umbrella organizations that represent the largest concentrations of Black/African-American residents. Some channels of communication include chambers of commerce, faithbased organizations, and community papers that are appropriate for outreach to target populations.
- Facilitate a focus group or organize interviews with community leaders. The focus group and/or interviews will
 identify the participants' concerns for their community in a particular area (e.g. health, education/learning,
 families, hosing etc.), resources currently available in their community to address the problems identified, and
 barriers for accessing the services.
- Develop a survey collecting, at minimum, self-reported socio-economic characteristics and demographics; the
 most pressing needs and concerns; desired community services; barriers to accessing services. The survey will
 be administered countywide with African American/Black household and will be distributed using the appropriate
 probability sampling method via phone, mail, online on in person, in partnership with community-based
 organizations.
- Develop a presentation with the main findings by topical focus area, e.g. economic conditions, health disparities
 etc. Presentation will be used to inform and guide the discussion at community meetings.
- Identify up to 4 locations for public meetings with the targeted communities. Once meeting locations have been
 identified the selected Proposer will then work with established community organizations to advertise and
 promote the meetings through various media outlets. Members of the MDEAT staff will be available to assist the
 selected Proposer in these presentations. Sign-in sheets of meeting attendance will be maintained. The selected
 Proposer will create a data base of associations, contacts, meeting schedules.
- Organize two rounds of public meetings, with the first round aimed at informing the community of the research
 findings, and the second round focused on identifying strategies to address concerns and/or soliciting community
 feedback on proposed strategies.
- Develop information boards, hand-outs and other printed materials for the public meeting participants. Design electronic version of all materials for social media distribution.

Deliverable#2: Survey instrument, community organizations and partner list, outreach and promotional materials, presentation, survey report, community discussions reports.

Schedule: This deliverable must be completed within XX days of the award of the Contract or on an agreed upon date between the selected Proposer and the County.



C. Key Findings and Recommendations

Based on the aforementioned analytics and community engagement process, the selected Proposer will summarize the key findings under each policy area and provide detailed policy recommendations to address the needs, challenges and opportunities within Miami-Dade County's Black community.

Deliverable: Policy Recommendations and Implementation Plan

Schedule: This deliverable must be completed within XX days of the award of the Contract or on an agreed upon date between the selected Proposer and the County.

2.2. WORK ORDER ASSIGNMENTS

When the need arises for additional services, the County will prepare a Work Order assignment and provide the selected Proposer with information regarding the specific needs for the additional services. All additional services to be performed under any contract, as a result of this Solicitation, requires that the County will issue a Work Order. The County, at its sole discretion, may modify, suspend, or cancel the Work Order at any time and shall only pay for work actually performed by the selected Proposer.

2.3. PAYMENT SCHEDULE

All payments are contingent upon the completion of tasks and deliverables outlined in this Solicitation. Completion of the services shall be measured as fulfillment of all services required, including submission to, and final acceptance by the County of any deliverable for the action unless otherwise negotiated. Invoices shall conform to the compensation terms of this Solicitation or issued Work Order and will provide a short description of the services performed. Any deliverables provided during the billing period shall also be described on the invoice, including a short statement of who the deliverable was provided to and the date it was provided.

- a) Payment will be paid upon completion, defined as the completion of the tasks and deliverables outlined in Attachment 1, Scope of Services, and the acceptance of the final deliverables by the County's representative.
- b) The selected Proposer shall submit, when it pertains to an issued work order, a monthly invoice for services rendered. The invoice should be submitted by the 10th day of the month for activities completed in the prior month. The final invoice should be submitted within 15 days of the conclusion of the Work Order.
