#### **SECTION 2 – SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

## 2.1 PURPOSE

The purpose of this solicitation is to purchase a turnkey Maritime Support and Command Unit, to be use by the Miami-Dade County Fire Rescue (MDFR). The unit described in Section 3, Technical Specifications, once procured will become part of Miami-Dade County existing fleet inventory.

## 2.3 TERM OF CONTRACT

This contract shall commence upon the date of the purchase order and shall remain in effect until such time as the units are acquired, have been accepted by the County's authorized representative and upon completion of the expressed and/or implied warranty periods.

## 2.2 METHOD OF AWARD

2.2.1 Award of this solicitation will be made to lowest priced responsive and responsible Bidder in the aggregate who submits an offer on all items listed in Section 4.0 and who meet the qualification criteria listed below.

#### **Minimum Qualifications**

- A. Be a licensed dealer (if appropriate for trucks) in the state of Florida as per statue 320.27. Bidders must (if applicable) supply a copy of their dealer's license with the Bid Submittal.
- B. The Bidder shall be regularly engaged in the business of providing trucks and related equipment. In order to meet this requirement, the Bidder shall provide three (3) reference letters with their submittal. Reference letters shall be from customers currently receiving or have received related equipment (trucks) from the Bidder within the past three (3) years. The letter shall include at a minimum the company name, address, contact name, title, e-mail address, telephone number, and length of service to verify that the Bidder has successfully provided the services described herein. The County, at its sole discretion, may request additional information in order to assess the Bidder's responsibility.
- 2.2.2 During the bid evaluation period, the County reserves the right to ask bidders for supplemental information, and to allow bidders to provide any information that was not submitted with the Bid Submittal. A bidder's failure to provide any information requested by the County may result in that bid submittal being rejected.

#### 2.4 WARRANTY

The awarded bidder shall provide at minimum the warranty terms as defined in this solicitation. The warrant offered shall be subject to a *Delay in Start Warranty Program* (commence when the vehicle is put into service), if available from the vehicle's manufacturer. It is the sole responsibility for the awarded bidder to register all vehicles and component warranty with the perspective manufacturers when required.

#### A) CORRECTING ANY EQUIPMENT DELIVERY DEFICIENCY

The bidder shall be responsible for promptly correcting any equipment delivery deficiency, at no cost to the County, within five (5) calendar days after the County notifies the bidder of such deficiency in writing. If the bidder fails to correct or replace the defect within the period specified, the County may, at its discretion, notify the bidder in writing that the bidder may be found in violation of the Contract or be subject to contractual default if the deficiencies are not corrected and/or replacement or repairs are not completed to the satisfaction of the County within the specified timeframe. If the bidder fails to satisfy the delivery requirements within the period stipulated in the notice, the County may (a) place the bidder in default of its contract, and/or (b) procure the products or services from another bidder and charge the bidder for any additional costs that are incurred by the County either through a credit memorandum or through invoicing.

#### B) CORRECTING DEFECTS COVERED UNDER WARRANTY

Bidder(s) shall promptly correct any deficiencies, at no cost to the County, within five (5) calendar days after the County notifies the Bidder of such deficiency either verbally or in writing. If the Bidder fails to correct the defective work or replace the damaged part within the period specified, the County may, at its discretion, notify the Bidder, for the second time in writing that the Bidder may be subject to contractual default which may lead to termination if the corrections or replacements are not completed to the satisfaction of the County within the time defined in the notice to cure. If the Bidder fails to satisfactorily complete the corrections and/or replace the damaged part as detailed in the notice to cure, the County may procure the parts and/ or services from another Bidder and charge the incumbent any additional costs that are incurred by the County for this work or items; either through a credit memorandum or through invoicing.

## C) ACCEPTANCE OF PRODUCT BY THE COUNTY

The product(s) to be provided hereunder shall be delivered to the County, and maintained if applicable to the contract, in full compliance with the specifications and requirements set forth in this contract. If a Bidder-provided part is determined to not meet the specifications and requirements of this contract, either prior to acceptance or upon initial inspection, the item will be returned, at Bidders' expense, to the Bidder. At the County's own option, the Bidder shall either provide a direct replacement for the part, or provide a full credit for the returned part. The Bidder shall not assess any additional charge(s) for any conforming action taken by the County under this clause.

#### 2.5 DELIVERY

Delivery is required within two hundred and ten (210) days from the date that the County department orders the equipment by sending a printed Purchase Order to the awarded Bidder. All deliveries are to be made in accordance with the best commercial practices. All equipment delivered must be in full compliance with the specifications and requirements described on this solicitation and resultant contract, and must be in excellent new condition. Upon verification of compliance with these requirements the County will accept the delivered equipment.





Upon failure to deliver the equipment in accordance with best commercial practices, excellent ready to work condition, and full compliance with the specifications and requirements to the County within the number of days stipulated above, the awarded Bidder may be subject to charges for liquidation damages in the amount of \$ 100.00 for each and every business day that the equipment is not delivered in acceptable condition. This charge for liquidation damages is in addition to other remedies and timetable requirements listed herein.

Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the contract, all items delivered must include all manufacturer's standard equipment and warranties.

The County will issue payment after completion of items (a) and (b) below:

- a) All delivered units are successfully inspected for compliance with all requirements and accepted (including delivery of the required manuals as specified below), by the County.
- b) All documentation described in the Purchase Order has been received as stipulated therein. The language that will appear in the Purchase Order is:

Application for Certificate of Title and/or Vehicle Registration (HSMV-8040), Certification of Motor Vehicle Sale Tax Exemption (MVC Form DR-41A), Motor Vehicle Dealer Title Reassignment Supplement (DHSMV 82994), Manufacturer's Statement of Origin to a Motor Vehicle and Service Policy shall be made out in the name of:

- c) These documents must be dated to coincide with the delivery of the equipment.
- d) All documents must be properly filled out and completed, signed and notarized by an authorized individual with no strike-overs on any documents. Non-compliance will result in payment delays.

The invoice is to be made out to the name of the department as indicated on the Purchase Order and mailed to the same address as shown on the Purchase Order.

#### 2.6 RELATED EXPENSES/TRAVEL EXPENSES

The Bidder's firm fixed costs requested in this solicitation and submitted by a Bidder, include any costs for travel and miscellaneous expenses. No additional costs will be accepted by the County.

## 2.7 **SPECIAL CONDITIONS**

2.7.1 Manufacturer's standard information sheets, catalogues, brochures and all supporting documentation submitted must show the product meets the required specifications. Bids that are submitted with standard product literature which offer technical data or product descriptions indicating the item or





product does not meet the required specifications must be accompanied by a letter on the vendor's company letterhead identifying those differences and describing how compliance with the required specifications is to be accomplished. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the rejection of that offer for failure to meet the required specifications.

- 2.7.2 After the offers have been evaluated by the County, the bidders who are the apparent awardees pursuant to Section 2, Paragraph 2.6 of this solicitation, may be required to demonstrate the equipment which has been proposed, for evaluation by and at no cost to the County. Should the equipment bid be a custom fabrication or one time build item, the County, at its discretion, may accept a demonstration of similar equipment manufactured by the vendor. The purpose of the demonstration is to observe the equipment in an operating environment and verify its capability, suitability, and adaptability in conformance with the performance requirements stipulated in this solicitation. If a demonstration is required, the County will notify the vendor of such in writing and will specify the date, time and location of the demonstration. If the vendor fails to perform the demonstration on the date stipulated in the notice, the County may elect to reject the offer or to re-schedule the demonstration, whichever course is determined by the County to be in the County's best interest. The County shall be the sole judge of the acceptability of the equipment in conformance with this solicitation and its decision shall be final. Regardless of the unit demonstrated the final delivered product must conform fully to all solicitation requirements.
- 2.7.3 The equipment furnished by the vendor shall be new and the most recent model available. Demonstrators are not acceptable. Any optional components that are required in accordance with the work tasks described in these technical specifications or within this solicitation shall be considered standard equipment for the purposes of this solicitation. Any optional components that are recommended by the vehicles' manufacturer for the application intended must be included and will be considered standard equipment for the purposes of this solicitation. The application and usage of all components, sub-components or parts must be in accordance with their manufacturers' recommendations as well as the recommendations of all associated component manufacturers. Omission of any essential detail from these specifications does not relieve the vendor from furnishing a complete and ready to work unit. The silence of specifications on any point shall mean that only the finest commercial practices of the industry shall apply and all interpretations of the technical specifications shall be so governed. The unit shall conform to all applicable OSHA, State and Federal and ANSI requirements and standards, and DOT regulations. All components and included craftsmanship are to be in accordance with current SAE standards and recommended practices. The engineering, materials and workmanship shall exhibit a high level of quality and appearance consistent with or exceeding the best industry standards.
- 2.7.4 The initial equipment and features required are listed in this solicitation. During the full term of the contract (to include any option to renew periods), the County may, after delivery and acceptance of the initial equipment order, make changes to the required equipment or equipment options supplied, provided that such changes are mutually agreed between the vendor and the County, and, all changes in per unit pricing are no more than the actual change in per unit cost that is documented by the vendor, and, that the net amount of any such changes is no more than five percent of the per unit price originally submitted. Solicitations requiring a pre-construction conference, or, the construction and approval of a prototype unit, will be considered in satisfaction of the initial equipment order provision of this paragraph.





2.7.5 When the bidder is an approved dealer or distributor of the manufacturer or fabricator, not located in Miami-Dade or Broward County, they must provide proof of having a mutual agreement with a certified dealer or service facility of the same manufacturer or fabricator located in Miami-Dade or Broward County, capable of delivering and supporting the proposed sale in the manner described in subsequent paragraphs of this ITB. This facility must be capable of performing warranty repairs and supplying needed parts and will be subject to the approval of the County. See parts supply and service facility requirements below and in Section 3.

**Note:** The County reserves the right to inspect any service facility for compliance with parts supply and service requirements at any time during the life of this contract. Failure to comply at any inspection point will result in the disqualification of that bidder.

## 2.8 PRE-CONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE

The bidder selected for award may be required to conduct a Pre-Construction Conference for five (5) County officials designated to represent the County prior to the manufacturing or assembly of the equipment which is specified in this solicitation. The vendor may select the location of this Pre-Construction Conference subject to concurrence by the County. Any costs incurred by these County officials in conjunction with the Pre-Construction Conference will be borne by the County. A complete water test of the expandable sections and other equipment shall be performed on all the equipment by the bidder prior to delivery. In addition, the County reserves the right to add, delete, and/or change specifications/clarify requirements up to seven (7) percent of the awarded value upon written approval from awarded bidder and the County.


#### 2.9 PRODUCTION/PROTOTYPE INSPECTION

The awarded vendor may be required to provide for an on-site production / prototype inspection of the first unit manufactured at times which are mutually convenient to the vendor and the County officials attending. This inspection shall be performed prior to the final assembly of the equipment in order to evaluate the placement of controls and lines, structural changes and general construction techniques. The vendor shall provide reasonable notice to the County prior to the scheduling of the on-site production inspection. The County reserves the right to require modifications to the equipment if such modifications are necessary in order to bring the equipment into compliance with the technical specifications, the vendor's offer, or best commercial practices.

The County reserves the right to require multiple production inspections where multiple locations or companies are involved with the construction of a final unit. Any costs incurred by these County Officials in conjunction with on-site production/prototype inspection will be borne by the County.

#### 2.10 **FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS**

- **2.10.1 Prompt Payment Terms (section 1, H) -** In accordance with CFR 200.319(b) payment terms under sections 2-8.1.1.1.1 or 2-8.1.1.1.2, respectively, that are a SBE contract set-aside, bid preference or contain a subcontractor goal, shall not apply to federally funded purchases.
- **2.10.2** Local Preference In accordance with CFR 200.319(b), section 1.47 local preference will shall not apply to federally funded purchases.






- **2.10.3** County User Program In accordance with CFR 200.319(b), section 1.48 county user access program (UAP) shall not apply to federally funded purchases.
- **2.10.4 SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (SBE) MEASURES** In accordance with CFR 200.319(b), section 1.49 small business enterprises (SBE) measures shall not apply to federally funded purchases.
- **2.10.5 LOCAL CERTIFIED VETERAN'S BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PREFERENCE -** In accordance with CFR 200.319(b), section 1.50 local certified veteran's business enterprise preference shall not apply to federally funded purchases.
- **2.10.6** FIRST SOURCE HIRING REFERRAL PROGRAM ("FSHRP") In accordance with CFR 200.319(b), section 1.51 FSHRP shall not apply to federally funded purchases.
- **2.10.7 OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL (IG) CONTRACT FEE** In accordance with Section 2-1076 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the IG contract fees shall not apply to Federally Funded purchases.
- **2.10.8 MIAMI-DADE COUNTY LIVING WAGE ORDINANCE -** The Living Wage Ordinance, Section 2-8.9 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, does not apply to purchases that are entirely Federally Funded.


#### 2.10.9 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS

All goods and/or services to be purchased as a result of any award under this solicitation shall be in accordance with all applicable governmental standards, including, but not limited to those issued by the Occupation Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), ), the National Institute of Safety Hazards (NIOSH), and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). It shall be the responsibility of Vendors to be regularly informed to conform to any changes in standards issued by any regulatory agencies that govern the commodities or services applicable to this solicitation, during the term of any contract resulting from this solicitation.

Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract or Agreement. If the Federal award meets the definition of "funding agreement" under 37 CFR § 401.2 (a) and the County wishes to enter into a contract with a small business firm or nonprofit organization regarding the substitution of parties, assignment or performance of experimental, developmental, or research work under that "funding agreement," the County must comply with the requirements of 37 CFR Part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding agency.

Pursuant to 2 CFR, Part 200.318(i) (1), ISD-SPD and client departments will maintain records sufficient to detail the history of partially or fully federally funded procurements. These records will include, but are not necessarily limited to the following: rationale for the method of procurement, selection of contract type, contractor selection or rejection, and the basis for the contract price. Further, ISD-SPD and client departments will comply with all applicable requirements in 2 CFR, Part 200, 200.333-200.337 Records Retention and Access.







Pursuant to 2 CFR, Part 200.318(j) (1), the County may use a time and materials type contract for partially or fully federally funded acquisitions only after a determination has been made that no other contract type is suitable and if the contract includes a ceiling price that the contractor exceeds at its own risk. Time and materials type contract means a contract whose cost to the County is the sum of: the actual cost of materials; and direct labor hours charged at fixed hourly rates that reflect wages, general and administrative expenses, and profit. Since this formula generates an open-ended contract price, a time-and-materials contract provides no positive profit incentive to the contractor for cost control or labor efficiency. Therefore, each contract must set a ceiling price that the contractor exceeds at its own risk. Further, the County will assert a high degree of oversight in order to obtain reasonable assurance that the contractor is using efficient methods and effective cost controls

Pursuant to C.F.R. 200.321 (g) Contracting with Small and Minority Business, Women's Business Enterprises, and Labor Surplus Area Firms, the County will take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that minority businesses, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms are used when possible.

#### Affirmative steps must include:

- (1) Placing qualified small and minority businesses and women's business enterprises on solicitation lists;
- (2) Assuring that small and minority businesses, and women's business enterprises are solicited whenever they are potential sources;

- (4) Establishing delivery schedules, where the requirement permits, which encourage participation by small and minority businesses, and women's business enterprises;

Requiring the prime contractor, if subcontracts are to be let, to take the affirmative steps listed in paragraphs (1) through (5) above.

When goods and/or services will be purchased, in part or in whole, with federal funding, and/or to meet Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) reimbursement, the Vendor hereby assures and certifies to the County that it will comply with:

A. Section 60-250.4, Section 60-250.5 and Section 60-741.4 of Title 41 of the United States Code, which addresses Affirmative Action requirements for disabled workers, is incorporated into this solicitation and any resultant contract by reference.





- B. The vendor shall verify that none of the vendor, its principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995), or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935). By submitting the Suspension and Debarment Certification Form, the vendor certifies its compliance with this requirement.
