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SECTION 2

ADDITIONAL/SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

2.1 PURPOSE

This Request to Qualify (RTQ) will establish a Prequalified Pool of Vendors (Pool) that will be used to solicit construction equipment rental for Miami-Dade County (County). Placement in the Pool is **not** a contract between the County and the Vendor, but an acknowledgement that the Vendor meets the qualifications as outlined throughout this RTQ. Vendor Submittals are accepted throughout the term of the RTQ for placement in such Pool.

2.2 **DEFINITIONS**

Invitation to Quote (ITQ) – Shall refer to the solicitation of quotes from the Pool for specific goods and/or services; and awarded based on lowest price, or other quantifiable criteria.

Prequalified Pool of Vendors (Pool) – Shall refer to business entities/individuals determined by the County's Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division, as meeting the minimum standards of business competence, financial ability, and/or product quality for placement in the Pool, and which may submit quote or proposal, at the time of need.

Vendor – Shall refer to a business entity/individual responding to this RTQ.

Submittal – Shall refer to all information, attachments and forms submitted in response to this RTQ.

Work Order Proposal Request (WOPR) – shall refer to a competitive process involving the solicitation of proposals, by the Internal Services Department Strategic Procurement Division, from the Pool for specific goods and/or services; and evaluated and awarded based on best value.

2.3 TERM

The Pool shall be established on the first calendar day of the month succeeding approval by the Board of County Commissioners, or designee, unless otherwise stipulated by the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division. The Pool shall expire on the last day of the month of the five-year term.

2.4 PREQUALIFICATION CRITERIA

Vendor shall meet the following criteria to be considered for placement in the Pool and for participation in future solicitations: The Pool will consist of two groups as follows:

Group A: Rental of Construction Equipment

Group B: Equipment Operator Services

Vendors may be prequalified for one or both groups in the solicitation.

2.4.1 Group A – Rental of Construction Equipment:

- 1. Vendor must currently be engaged in the business of rental of construction equipment for a minimum of two (2) years. Vendor shall provide as proof copies of the Articles of Incorporation.
- 2. Vendor must supply a list of equipment in their current inventory.

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- 3. Vendor shall maintain an office within the geographic boundaries of Miami Dade, Broward, Monroe, Palm Beach or Collier County, Florida. This facility shall be staffed by representative's who can be contacted Monday thru Friday from 7:30 am to 5:00 PM for quotations. A copy of the Occupational License shall be submitted as proof of office location.
- Vendor shall provide an emergency contact person and phone number for 24 hour contact.

2.4.2 Group B: Equipment Operator Services

Award of this group will be made to all responsive, responsible Vendors who meet the qualification as stated below. Vendor(s) wishing to provide the County with heavy equipment operator services must provide the following:

- 1. OSHA Section 1910.178(I) Paragraph (I)(1)(i) requires that each powered industrial truck operator have the competency to operate a powered industrial truck safely. These requirements apply to all types of powered industrial trucks, including specialized powered industrial trucks. The training standard applies to vehicles covered by volumes of the consensus standard such as: Low Lift and High Lift Trucks, the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) ASME B56.1; Guided Industrial Vehicles, ASME B56.5; Rough Terrain Forklift Trucks, ASME B56.6; Industrial Crane Trucks, ASME B56.7; and Operator Controlled Industrial Tow Tractors, ASME B56.9. The standard does not apply to earth moving equipment or vehicles used for over-the-road hauling. As per OSHA requirements, Vendor(s) must provide a list of their OSHA certified operators. Vendor(s) must provide for each individual listed a copy of their certification which shall consist of the name of the operator, the dates of the training, the date of the evaluation, and the identity of the person(s) conducting the training and evaluation.
- 2. Vendor(s) wishing to provide operator services for any single vehicle or combination of vehicles that is designed to be operated and to travel on a public street or highway and is considered by the <u>Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration</u> to be a commercial motor vehicle, including, but not limited to, a Tractor trailer, a motorized crane, a vehicle whose function is to pump cement, a rig for drilling wells, and a portable crane must provide a copy of each operators CDL license.

All CDLs must contain the following information:

- The words "Commercial Driver's License" or "CDL:"
- The driver's full name, signature, and address;
- The driver's date of birth, sex, and height
- Color photograph or digitized image of the driver;
- The driver's State license number;
- The name of the issuing State;
- The date of issuance and the date of the expiration of the license:
- The class(es) of vehicle that the driver is authorized to drive;
- Notation of the "air brake" restriction, if issued;
- The endorsement(s) for which the driver has qualified;

Vendor shall provide all of the specified information, documents and attachments listed above with their Submittal as proof of compliance with the requirements of this RTQ. However, the County may, at its sole discretion and in its best interest, allow Vendors to complete, supplement or supply the required documents throughout the term of the RTQ. It shall be the sole right of the County to determine the number of Vendors which will be included in the Pool. During the term of the RTQ, the County reserves the right to add or delete Vendors as it deems necessary, and in its best interest.

2.4.3 Groups A and B:

1. Vendors shall be regularly engaged in the business of providing rental of construction equipment and/or equipment

operator services. Vendor shall provide at least three (3) professional references. The references listed shall be from current or former customers receiving the services described in this solicitation within the past three years. References shall be listed in the Vendor's Submittal (see Section 4).

2. Vendors shall select the types of construction equipment under Group A that they will have available for rental and/or the types of equipment operators under Group B that will be offered to the County.

2.5 INSURANCE

Insurance is **not** required in order to be pregualified under this RTQ.

2.6 SPOT MARKET QUOTES

Vendors in the Pool will be invited to participate in future spot market competition, as needed. The spot market competition will be in the form of an ITQ or WOPR that will include the specific goods and/or services required, and may include provisions, as applicable, such as:

- Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Measures
- Warranty Requirements
- Liquidated DamagesLiving Wage
- Insurance Requirements

For federally funded projects/programs, additional provisions may apply in accordance with the funding source. The following provisions from Section 1, General Terms and Conditions shall be exempted from such solicitations, as indicated in the ITQ or WOPR.

- Article 1.11 Local Preference
- Article 1.29 Office of the Inspector General (only the cost of the random audits, as specified)

2.7 <u>ACCIDENT PREVENTION AND REGULATIONS AT THE SEAPORT DEPARTMENT</u>

Precautions shall be exercised at all times for the protection of persons and property. All Contractors and Sub-contractors shall conform to all OSHA, State and County regulations while performing under the Terms and conditions of this solicitations. Any fines levied by the above mentioned authorities because of inadequacies to comply with these requirements shall be borne solely by the Vendor responsible for same.

2.8 SECURITY REQUIREMENTS AT WATER AND SEWER

Miami-Dade County Water and Sewer Department (WASD) operates under strict security regulations. These regulations involve the successful completion of a background check on all companies and individuals who require access to a WASD site. For those individuals requiring long term ongoing access to a WASD site(s), issuance of photo identification (ID) cards will be provided after the successful completion of a police background check is completed. Individuals, who are employed, hired or who are required to enter the restricted areas of WASD frequently must fill out the form Request for Release of Records (Attachment 1). These ID cards are required for access and are issued by WASD at the current cost of \$45.00 per applicant per year which includes the cost of the background check. Contractors wishing to do business with MASD shall obtain and pay for ID cards and background checks for each of his/her employees and/or agents who will be frequently visiting or performing services at WASD restricted areas. For more

2.9 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REGULATIONS DUE TO USE OF FEDERAL FUNDING

Since the goods, services, and/or equipment that will be acquired under this solicitation will be paid with federal funding, it is hereby agreed and understood that Section 60-250.4, Section 60-250.5 and Section 60-741.4 of Title 4 of the United States Code, which addresses Affirmative Action requirements for handicapped workers, is incorporated into this solicitation and resultant contract by reference.

2.10 MIAMI-DADE COUNTY LIVING WAGES FOR GROUP B

If the total value of the resultant contract, per year, exceeds \$100,000 the provisions of Section 2-8.9 (Living Wages) of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code) as amended by Ordinance [Governing Legislation], will apply for Group B. 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SECTION 3

SCOPE OF WORK/TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

3.1 SCOPE OF WORK/TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

Vendors prequalified under this Pool shall be capable of supplying the County with rental of construction equipment and/or equipment operator services on either on as-needed or periodic basis. Details regarding the specific equipment and/or equipment operator needed will be explained in the spot market solicitations issued by County departments.

3.2 GROUP A – RENTAL OF CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT

Construction equipment rental may include, but not be limited to, air compressors, aerial lift platforms, augers, backhoe's, bucket trucks, chipping hammers, compressors, drills, gas or electric scissor lift platforms, generators, light towers, mobile cranes, pressure cleaners, spot coolers, tower cranes, ditch diggers, dozers, fork lift's, graders, loader backhoe, bob cat, scaffolds, sump pumps, tractors, dozers, and generators. See Attachment A, for the current list of equipment types that be rented by the County.

3.2.1 PERIODIC REQUEST FOR QUOTE

- A. All quotes submitted shall show charges for rental by the hour, by the day, by the week, and by the month. The general practice of the industry shall apply basing rates on (8) eight hours use per day, (40) forty hours use per week and (176) one-hundred seventy six hours use per month.
- B. Rental charges will reflect the lowest rate for the time used and be computed in the manner that results in the lowest billing to the County. An hourly rental which is kept for a day will have the rate adjusted to reflect that daily rental rate if that rate is less costly to the County. Equipment contractor under a daily rental rate which is kept for a week will have the rate adjusted to reflect the weekly rental rate if that rate is less costly to the County. Equipment contracted under a weekly rental rate if it is kept for a month, will have the rate adjusted to reflect the monthly rate if that rate is less costly to the County.
- A. All bids for regular time used in excess of the stated measures (day, week, month) will reflect prorated billing only as the following examples:
 - a. A rental for three (3) days and three (3) hours is billed at (3) three and 3/8 the daily rate.
 - b. A rental for two (2) weeks and four (4) days is billed at two (2) and 4/5 the weekly rate.
 - c. A rental for two (2) weeks and thirty (30) hours is billed at a two weeks rate and 30/40 of the weekly rate.
 - d. A rental for one (1) month, (2) two weeks, (1) one day and (2) two hours is billed at one (1) and 90/176 of the monthly rate.
- B. When equipment is rented for a stated period of time and is returned prior to the expiration of that time that rental bill will be computed in whichever of the following manner that is the most economical to the County.
 - i. The rental bill will be computed for the time originally requested.
 - ii. The bill will be computed using the successful vendor's quoted rate for hours, days weeks, or months, as stipulated.

3.2.2 RENTAL PERIOD

The rental rate commences when equipment ordered by the County Department is delivered to the work site, loaded, dismantled or assembled, in operating condition and ready to work. The rental period shall end upon written or verbal communication by the County's Department's representative to the successful vendor's contact person.

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3.2.3 MOBILIZATION CHARGES

Mobilization charges shall mean delivery, set up and "ready to use" at locations as specified by the County departments and removal from County property upon termination of the equipment's Use. The County reserves the right to exercise one way only mobilization; paying only half of the quoted charge when in the County's best interest.

3.2.4 FUEL AND LUBRICANTS

- A. The equipment shall be delivered to the County properly serviced with the necessary lubricants and a full tank of engine fuel. The County will only furnish additional fuel and lubricants while in use by the County.
- B. The County will reimburse the vendor for re-fueling the vehicle to the full tank level at the time of rental returned provided that the County's work site supervisor acknowledges that the equipment was returned with less than a full tank of fuel.
- C. Replacement fuel is charged for at a rate not to exceed 1 ½ times the prevailing local public station rate for the same type fuel. Fueling service fees will not be accepted.

3.2.5 COSTS OF REPAIRS

Vendor(s) shall bear the cost of any and all repairs to the equipment furnished except where the equipment may have been subjected to abuse, accident or negligence on the part of an operator furnished by the County, and the County determines if the damage was caused by a County employee. Vendor(s) assumes and shall bear the cost of any towing charges resulting from equipment failure.

3.2.6 LABOR, MATERIALS, AND EQUIPMENT SHALL BE SUPPLIED BY THE VENDOR

The vendor shall furnish all labor, material and equipment required for the rental of construction equipment services, including delivery and removal of the equipment rental. When not specifically identified in the technical specifications, such materials and equipment shall be of a suitable type and grade for the purpose. All material, workmanship, and equipment shall be subject to the inspection and approval of the County's Project Manager. All employees of the Vendor shall be considered to be, at all times, the sole employee of the Vendor under its sole discretions and not an employee or agent of Miami-Dade County.

3.2.7 DELIVERY AND REMOVAL OF EQUIPMENT

The vendor shall deliver the equipment required in conjunction with this contract within one (1) calendar day after the date that the order is placed by the County's authorized representative. The vendor agrees to retain the equipment at the designated County premise for additional one (1) calendar day after the termination of the Contract, at which time the equipment shall be removed from the premises. The vendor shall be allowed to invoice the effected County department for this additional period on a pro-rated basis.

All pre-qualified vendor(s) agree to provide rental services to Miami Dade County, first and with all possible priorities in case of emergencies or natural disasters within four (4) hours. All pre-qualified vendor(s) shall provide an emergency number (beeper, cellular, etc) for 24 hour contact.

3.2.8 <u>LICENSES, PERMITS AND FEES</u>

It shall be the responsibility of the vendor(s) to furnish insurance, license tags, permits, current inspection stickers, and any other necessary permits to meet requirements for the legal operation of the equipment furnished at no additional cost to the County. Damages, penalties and or fines imposed on the County or the vendor for failure to obtain required licenses, permits or fines shall be borne by the vendor. Insurance coverage shall include coverage due to theft or stolen equipment; and the risk of loss from theft shall not be transferred to the County.

3.3 GROUP B – EQUIPMENT OPERATOR SERVICES

Vendors may also be required, in subsequent spot market solicitation, to provide construction equipment rental operators for powered industrial trucks such as, but not limited to (low lift and high lift trucks, rough terrain forklift trucks,

industrial crane trucks, operator controlled industrial tow tractors, tractors, etc.) on an as needed basis. See Attachment B, for the current list of types of equipment operators that may be requested by the County.

Vendors shall ensure that the provided equipment operator(s) has the competency and license required to operate safely the required type of equipment; this includes powered industrial trucks, low lift and high lift trucks, guided industrial vehicles, rough terrain forklift trucks, industrial crane trucks, operator controlled industrial tow tractors, etc.

Vendors shall ensure that provided operators comply, and are trained to operate the equipment in accordance, with all governmental standards, to include, but not be limited to, those issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), the National Institute of Occupational Safety Hazards (NIOSH), and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).
