Dear Mr. Tebutt:

This letter sets forth the terms of the agreement (the "Agreement") between Miami-Dade County (the "County") and Future Systems, Inc. (the "Contractor") to contract for the purchase of one (1) Air-Conditioned Bus Passenger Shelter for a "Pilot Test" (Furnish and Install) for the Miami-Dade Transit Department (MDT) in accordance with the terms and conditions as stated herein. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties as to all matters contained herein.

- 1) The Contractor shall furnish and install one (1) air-conditioned bus passenger shelter, sized 5 feet wide x 20 feet long, for Miami-Dade Transit (MDT). Acceptance of the shelter unit will be at the sole discretion of the County's representative.
- 2) The price of one (1) bus shelter including all services required for furnish and installation is \$89,000.00. The Contractor shall be paid upon approval and acceptance of the air-conditioned bus shelter by the County.
- 3) The indemnification and insurance requirements are provided in Attachment 1.
- 4) This Agreement is for a one-time purchase and shall become effective upon the date of the purchase order and shall remain in effect until such time as all items purchased in conjunction with this Agreement, have been furnished and installed, and accepted by the County.
- 5) Shipping Terms, Delivery, Furnish and Install:

Prices are F.O.B. Destination and the Contractor shall hold title to the goods until such time as this are delivered to and accepted by Miami-Dade County. The air-conditioned bus shelter shall be installed by January 1, 2016 in front of the Dadeland Mall bus stop, located at 7251 SW 88th Street, Miami, Florida, during weekday hours only, during off-peak commuter hours between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Contact Person: Mr. Glenn LeBlanc at (786) 239-5518, twenty-four (24) hours prior to delivery.

Once the air-conditioned bus shelter installation has been completed, the Contractor shall contact within forty-eight (48) hours to Mr. Glenn LeBlanc, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays at (786) 239-5518 (excluding County-observed holidays).

6) Method of Payment: Invoice:

The item custom build installed shall include all manufacturer's standard bus shelter unit and warranties. Air-conditioned bus shelter shall be ready no later than ninety (90) days of receipt of the purchase order. All installation is to be made in accordance with good commercial practice. Air Conditioned bus shelter shall be in full compliance with the contract requirements, and must be in excellent condition. Upon verification of compliance with these requirements, the County will accept the equipment.

The date of the invoice shall not exceed thirty (30) calendar days from the installation of the Air Conditioned bus shelter.

The County will issue payment after completion of items below:

a) All furnished and installed air-conditioned bus shelter are successfully inspected for compliance with all requirements and accepted by the County.

7) Warranty shall be Three Hundred Sixty-Five (365) Calendar Days:

A. Type of Warranty Coverage Required

In addition to all other warranties that may be supplied by the Contractor, the Contractor shall warrant its product and/or service against faulty labor and/or defective material for a minimum period of three hundred sixty-five (365) calendar days after the date of acceptance of the labor, materials and/or equipment by the County. This warranty requirement shall remain in force for the full period identified above; regardless of whether the Contractor is under contract with the County at the time of defect. Any payment by the County on behalf of the goods or services received from the Contractor does not constitute a waiver of these warranty provisions.

B. Correcting Defects Covered Under Warranty

The Contractor shall be responsible for promptly correcting any deficiency, at no cost to the County, within three (3) calendar days after the County notifies the Contractor of such deficiency in writing. If the Contractor fails to honor the warranty and/or fails to correct or replace the defective work or items within the period specified, the County may, at its discretion, notify the Contractor, in writing, that (a) Contractor may be debarred as a County Contractor, and/or (b) the County may procure the products or services from another vendor and charge the Contractor for any additional costs that are incurred by the County for this work or items; either through a credit memorandum or through invoicing.

- 8) Pursuant to Miami-Dade County Ordinance No. 97-215, the purchase order will include the Independent Private Sector Inspector General requirements. This ordinance requires a ¼ of 1% reduction from the total price of the Contractor's invoice.
- 9) Pursuant to Miami-Dade County Budget Ordinance No. 03-192, which implements the User Access Program (UAP), new contract awards issued by the Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Division require a 2% reduction from the total price of any Contractor invoice issued.
- 10) Audits Pursuant to Section 2-481 of the Miami-Dade County Code the Contractor will grant access to the Commission Auditor to all financial and performance related records, property, and equipment purchased in whole or in part with government funds. The Contractor agrees to maintain an accounting system that provides accounting records that are supported with adequate documentation, and adequate procedures.
- 11) Local, State and Federal Compliance Requirements:

Contractor agrees to comply, subject to applicable professional standards, with the provisions of any and all applicable Federal, State and the County orders, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations which may pertain to the performance of this Agreement.

ATTACHMENT 1

INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the County and its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities from any and all liability, losses or damages, including attorneys' fees and costs of defense, which the County or its officers, employees, agents or instrumentalities may incur as a result of claims, demands, suits, causes of actions or proceedings of any kind or nature arising out of, relating to or resulting from the performance of this Agreement by the Contractor or its employees, agents, servants, partners principals or subcontractors. Contractor shall pay all claims and losses in connection therewith and shall investigate and defend all claims, suits or actions of any kind or nature in the name of the County, where applicable, including appellate proceedings, and shall pay all costs, judgments, and attorney's fees which may issue thereon. Contractor expressly understands and agrees that any insurance protection required by this Agreement or otherwise provided by Contractor shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep and save harmless and defend the County or its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities as herein provided.

The Contractor shall furnish to the Internal Services Department / Procurement Management Services, 111 NW 1st Street, Suite 1300, Miami, Florida 33128-1989, Certificate(s) of Insurance which indicate that insurance coverage has been obtained which meets the requirements as outlined below:

- A. Worker's Compensation Insurance for all employees of the Contractor as required by Florida Statute 440.
- B. Commercial General Liability Insurance on a comprehensive basis, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. Insurance shall include coverage for Explosion Collapse and Underground Hazards. Miami-Dade County must be shown as an additional insured with respect to this coverage.
- C. Automobile Liability Insurance covering all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles used in connection with the work, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.

All insurance policies required above shall be issued by companies authorized to do business under the laws of the State of Florida, with the following qualifications:

Compliance with the foregoing requirements shall not relieve the vendor of his liability and obligation under this section or under any other section of this agreement.

The vendor shall submit a certificate of insurance within ten (10) business days after notification of recommendation to award. If certificate does not include the coverage's outlined in the terms and conditions of this solicitation, the vendor shall be given an additional five (5) business days to submit a corrected certificate to the County. 



PROPOSED AC BUS SHELTER FOR 'PILOT TEST' FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY





Side view of AC bus shelter. The shelter will be approximately 5 feet deep in the interior to meet ADA requirements for wheelchair mobility.




Other side view of AC bus shelter showing backlighted advertising panel and side view of the air-conditioning unit.

The sliding door (shown in the middle frame) consists of a spring-action mechanism that will meet ADA requirements. The glass panels for the Pilot Test AC shelter unit will be tempered safety glass. However, for future orders, the glass panels could be changed to impact-resistant glass or .375" gauge, clear shatter-proof Polycarbonate material, with three layers of clear sacrificial film on both front and back sides of the material to prevent vandalism.
