

Program Goal and Mission








2021 Vision Zero Framework Plan

- Ongoing planning and funding determination for Top 100 Safety Priority Locations
- Locations prioritized based on crash severity, crash density, located in disadvantaged community, and proximity to transit
- 55 locations are in County/Municipal roads
- 45 locations are in FDOT roads








GIS Online Map

- Online map open to DTPW staff and municipal partners with 25 Safety
 Projects, Top 100 Safety Priority
 Locations, crash data, and more
- Crash data will be updated in June to include 2018-2022 Fatal and Serious Injury Crashes






Completed Safety Projects

N Miami Ave. from NW 17 St. to NW 20 St.

- Realigned bicycle lane geometry crossing the FEC/Brightline railroad crossing
- Added green bicycle pavement markings and delineators

Completed Safety Projects

<u>Downtown Micromobility Network</u> <u>Protection Elements</u>

- Added buffer pavement markings, concrete curbs and wheelstops, and delineators
 - N Miami Ave. from Flagler St. to NE 11 St.
 - NE 1 Ave. from Flagler St. to NE 10 St.
 - N 5 St. from NW 3 Ave. to NE 2 Ave.
 - N 6 St. from NW 3 Ave. to NE 2 Ave.






Completed Safety Projects

NW 20 St. and NW 10 Ave.

- Implemented Leading Pedestrian Interval (LPI)
 - Gives pedestrians a 3–7 second head start when entering the intersection
 - Increases the visibility of MDC Medical Campus students crossing NW 10 Ave. to the parking garage
 - Shown to reduce pedestrian-vehicle collisions as much as 13% (FHWA Proven Safety Countermeasures)

Upcoming Efforts

- 30% Design of 55 Top 100 Safety Priority Locations in County/Municipal roads
- Creation of a Vision Zero Dashboard
 - Will visualize different trends and cross-sections in crash data
- Targeted Project Outreach and Safety Education Campaigns
 - To inform residents of new safety countermeasures in their neighborhood



2023 Action Plan Update

DTPW's High Injury Network (HIN)

- 2018-2022 fatal & serious injury crashes
 - 7, 314 on all roads
 - 2,505 (34%) on all County/Municipal roads
- 40 corridors account for approximately 31% of the 2,505 crashes in 1.2% of the total County/Municipal centerline miles
- HIN Development Methodology:
 - Excludes FDOT roads
 - Prioritizes vulnerable road users

AGENCY: Office of the Secretary of Transportation, U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT or the Department)

ACTION: Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO), Assistance Listing # 20.939

SUMMARY: The purpose of this notice is to solicit applications for Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grants. Funds for the fiscal year (FT) 2023 SS4A grant program are to be awarded on a competitive basis to support planning, infrastructure, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious sinjuy on roads and streets involving all roadway users, including pedestrians; becyclists; public transportation, personal conveyance, and micromobility users, motorists; and commercial vehicle operators.

DATES: Applications must be submitted by 5:00 PM EDT on Monday, July 10, 2023. Late applications will not be accepted.

Planning & Demonstration Grants

- Three types of activities:
 - Action Plan
 - Supplemental Planning
 - Sub-area plans, Road Safety Audits, Equity Assessments, Engagement, etc.
 - Demonstration Activities
 - Feasibility Studies or Pilot Programs for Engagement Campaigns or use of Technology/ITS







Planning & Demonstration Grants

- Can apply for Supplemental Planning or Demonstration Activities using DTPW's 2021 Framework Plan as long as:
 - Location is identified in the 2021 Framework Plan
 - Have secured local match (20%)
 - DTPW reviews and concurs that the proposal informs the 2021 Framework Plan








Implementation Grants

- DTPW to submit joint application with the Miami-Dade TPO
- Total Request: \$20M for 25 projects
 - 15 Implementation Projects
 - 7 Supplemental Planning Projects
 - 5 Road Safety Audits on 2023 HIN corridors
 - Creation of Community & Technical Committees
 - Development of Advanced Dashboard
 - 3 Demonstration Projects
 - Bicycle Facility Protection Elements at 3 Locations
 - HIN Unreported Crash Data Pilot Project
 - Video Safety Analysis using Innovative Technology Pilot Project
