

- Stimulate Economic Development



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
### **Study Objectives: Evaluate Transit Alternatives**

#### **Purpose and Need**

- Identify the need for transit investment
- Determine project goals and objectives
- Define evaluation criteria

#### Tier 1 Definition and Evaluation: Qualitative

- Identify the universe of alternatives
- Qualitative evaluation to determine feasibility

### **Tier 2 Definition and Evaluation:** Quantitative

- Define the remaining alternatives in detail:
  - Develop operating plan
  - Generate ridership forecast
  - Estimate capital and O&M costs
- Evaluate the alternatives in detail
