CONSENT DECREE PROGRAM

IMPROVING INFRASTRUCTURE

By complying with all terms of the Consent Decree, the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) will improve operational reliability of the wastewater system and minimize sanitary sewer overflows.

The Consent Decree Program will:

- Design and construct capital improvement projects totaling approximately \$1.6 billion in new investments over a fifteen (15) year period
- Develop and implement a comprehensive long-term Capacity, Management, Operations, and Maintenance program to provide dedicated resources targeted at reducing future sewer overflows
- Serve as an economic driver by providing thousands of construction related job opportunities to Miami-Dade County residents

IMPROVING QUALITY OF LIFE AND CREATING JOBS

WASD ensures the 2.3 million residents of Miami-Dade County, and over 16 million annual visitors, have a reliable and safe sanitary sewer system that will function for decades to come. These improvements will help build a more sustainable county and improve the environment.

\$1.6 Billion will be invested by 2028

- 82 capital projects at 3 wastewater treatment plants, 33 pump stations, and numerous pipelines will improve operational reliability

Capacity, Management, Operations and Maintenance programs will help minimize future sewer overflows

Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) will bring sewer service to primarily industrial areas currently on septic tank systems
